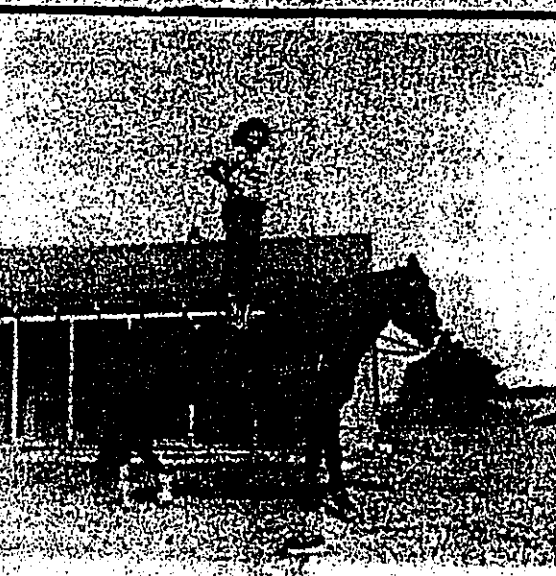

## City, County Grapple With Budget Woes

Vote totals were canvassed Monday at Woodville City Council with some 169 voters voting in favor of the new sales tax. Only 29 people voted 'no' to the proposal. Both City Council and Tyler County Commissioners face the tightest budgets ever as they inch closer to budget deadlines. Tyler County Commissioners will hold a budget hearing and workshop on Thursday August 13 at 1 p.m. in the Commissioners Courtroom. Tops on their list of budget considerations are garbage and land fill problems and possible future tax hikes.

## Woodville Schools Open Sept. 1

The schools of the Woodville Independent School District will open for all students on Tuesday, September 1. Teachers begin their work year on Monday, August 24, according to Dorman Jackson, school superintendent. Pre-school registration for all senior high school students new to Woodville Public Schools, or who attended Woodville schools but failed to register before the end of the school in May should register now at the principal's office in the Woodville High School building. Students in grades 6-8 who are new to Woodville should also register now at the middle school principal's office on the high school campus. Students in grades K-2 who are new to the Woodville schools or who did not register in the spring should enroll now at the principal's office at the Wheat building, 306 Kirby Drive from 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Students in grades 3-5 should register at the principal's office in the Woodville Intermediate school at 405 North Charleston Tuesday, September 1, will be the first day of classroom instruction and will be the first day that school buses will operate.

Pupils who register in kindergarten or first grade will be required to have a certified birth certificate in order to establish eligibility for registration. Pupils new to the Woodville schools should have grade books and report cards. All parents should have a health certificate from the local health department. The school year begins Monday, September 1.

Susie plopped herself on the footstool the other evening right in the middle of Wheeler's Fort.

We recognized immediately that there was something urgent on her mind if she attempted to divert our attention from Vanna White's southern exposure.

She wondered if we had ever considered running for public office. We answered very quickly that our interest in elective politics ended with Abraham Lincoln's assassination at Ford's Theatre in 1865.

Susie's eyes flashed and she indicated this was a serious conversation.

That Texas had some very important positions to fill with the Lieutenant Governor and our local State Senator deciding they had had enough of the Austin merry-go-round.

It was not in our nature to dampen Susie's interest in the mechanism that makes this democracy function. But we hastened to mention that it took a very unique personality where half the people you represent are made at you no matter what you do, and less than one person out of four voted for you in the first place.

We wondered if Susie could live on \$7,500 a year. That was a Lieutenant Governor's salary in this state. And if she thought that was bad, a few hundred dollars a month was all you got as a State Senator.

Hadn't she been reading the papers lately? The big budget mess in Austin?

Yes, but we were happy with anything they did over there. The Governor had even said he wasn't interested in running for reelection. And that we had heard from more than a few people that they were unhappy he had run in the first place.

Susie asked if we thought based on what we had just said whether there would be a lot of people running for Senator Blake's seat?

We said Reebok would have to open another planet just to supply the running shoes we'd need in this part of the state.

Susie said she was kind of surprised Mr. Blake had decided to step aside. We said in politics we always see through a glass, darkly, but had she noticed that the Texas Insurance Commission chairman had just announced his resignation?

Her ears went up, and then she

wondered what that had to do with anything. We just said, do a little bit of thinking, and you'll see how we occupy positions of power in Austin. It's amazing the little nuggets you can pick up.

We reminded her to mark her calendar for the 1990 redistricting possibilities. When those in power in Austin start carving up the young districts in the state, each party trying to get an edge with their voting block to keep the district in their party.

Susie scratched a minute and then offered the thought that she didn't know politics was so devious. We cautioned a little about devious. That it was really a matter of nose counting. That when it really came down to push and shove, legislation was passed by somebody, and you kind of always tried to find that edge that kept your friends in power.

It was all right to have a drink with the opposition. Go hunting with them. Skin them at poker. But always make sure they are the minority party.

Susie wondered if we had any choices we would like to see voting for Mr. Blake's seat. We said at the moment it was just about anybody in the phone book.

That a whole bunch of people would be out looking for deep pockets to tap for campaign expenses. Several hundred thousands of dollars no doubt. Which would eliminate the fainthearted in a hurry.

Most would have to swear off riding in boats called "Monkey Business," and wear dark glasses when they were gird watching.

We'd see wives and kids paraded at every function.

But what we really wanted Susie to understand was that we had no aspirations for public office. We could be tapped for an occasional political campaign.

We would listen to most campaign rhetoric with a tin ear, knowing that in the heat of the chase, most folks let their mouth overrun their mind. But that we'd accept most political campaigns as the personification of a dog race.

We rabbits are chased by folks running flat out to attract our vote, and the losers when it's all over. Remember all those vocal expressions of support they heard.

And like the poor greyhound, they continue to wonder what happened to the rabbit.
