

# Eastex Lake Water 100% sold

The Angeline and Neches River Authority of Lufkin announced today that 100 percent of the water yield from the proposed Lake Eastex project has been committed for by 23 cities, water supply corporations, and industries in East Texas.

The 23 water users have agreed to provide funds which will help pay pre-construction costs, such as environmental and engineering studies and associated costs for the proposed lake in Cherokee and Smith counties.

Steve Lilly, of Nacogdoches, chairman of the Authority, said Temple-Easter, Inc. of Diboll purchased 12 percent of the lake's protected

yield, or 9.1 million gallons a day, during the weekend of printing the authority at the 100 percent level.

"We are overwhelmed by the excellent response to the lake project," said Lilly. "It is a clear indication that there is a need and a strong grassroots support for the lake in East Texas."

By agreeing to the new pre-construction contract with the ANRA, the 23 water users have reserved for their use 76 million gallons of water a day—the entire projected output of the 10,000-acre lake.

The contracts with the water users covers only the pre-construction

phase of the lake. The construction phase of the project will come later, said Lilly.

Lake Eastex is planned for a location on Mud Creek about four miles east of Jacksonville. The dam would be located about six miles southeast of the city.

Lake Eastex, when completed, will be about 15 miles in length and 1.5 miles wide. Except for one mile in Smith County, the lake will be located entirely within Cherokee County. It will have a storage capacity of 195,500 acre-feet.

The pre-construction costs, which will amount to about \$636,000, will be covered by a \$316,000

grant from the Texas Water Development Board and a \$320,000 loan from the same state agency. The bonds will be repaid by the Angeline and Neches River Authority from debt service commitments from the participants in the pre-construction phase.

Lilly said he felt the quick response to the pre-construction phase of the lake has been the result of growing awareness among water users that groundwater supplies, which have been the principal source of most cities and water supply groups, are limited and will be restricted in the future.

"Every water user who

relies on groundwater knows that the day is coming when groundwater supplies will be short and in some cases too contaminated for continued use," he said.

"It is a common misconception that East Texas has plenty of water for its cities, water districts and industries, but much of our surface supplies have been locked up by outside users such as Houston, Beaumont, and Dallas. We don't have enough surface reservoirs in some areas of East Texas to serve our own people," he said.

Lilly said plans call for the lake's completion in the mid-1990's. "If we can stay on a reasonable schedule,"

## Board Kills 10% Hike

The Warren Independent School District Board of Trustees refused to approve the 1988 proposed budget for the Tyler County Appraisal District at their meeting Tuesday, September 22, 1987. The motion to turn down the proposed budget was made by Board Member Walter McPherson and seconded by Board Member John Long. The motion carried by a vote of 4-0 with one abstention by Board Member Walter McAlpin. If four entities within the county disapprove the proposed budget, it will have to go back to the drawing board. The Warren Board felt that the 10% increase in the budget was excessive.

The Board again failed to come to an agreement on the sick leave policy for the district. The present policy gives five local sick leave days and three personal business leave days in addition to

the five sick leave days given by the state. There has been much discussion over the past few months regarding teacher abuse of sick leave and how to correct this situation.

The Board instructed Superintendent Joe Woodland to present another revised policy at the next Board meeting. Attorney Jerry Hatton suggested that the Board

might want to consider a special meeting for the first reading of the new policy since the old policy will be in effect until a change is made.

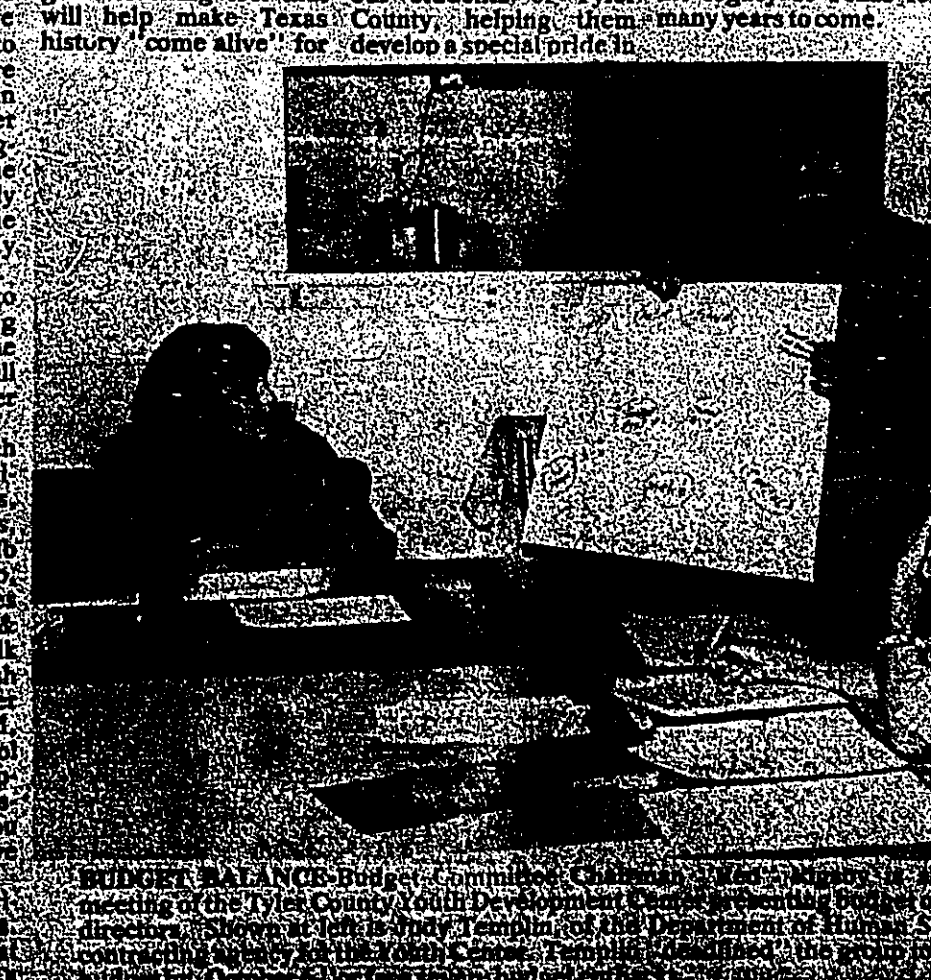


