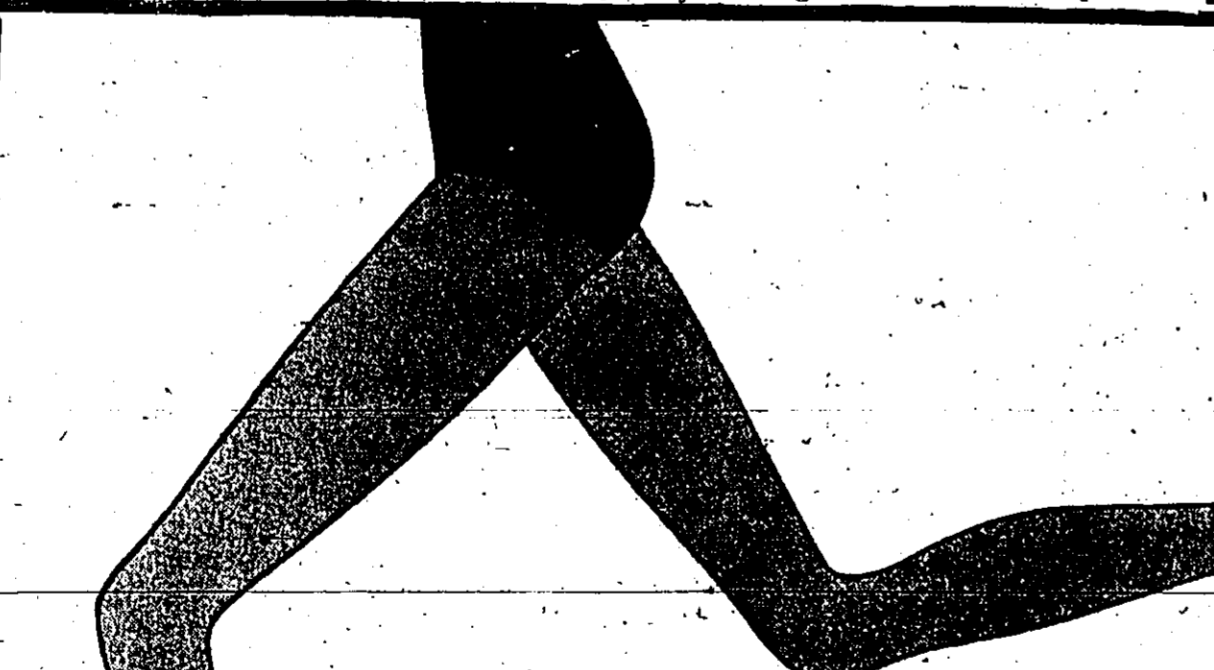
WPS Group To Meet

TAX TIPS

Strict rules apply to deductible travel and entertainment expenses. (1) You must keep a written record and (2) you must keep itemized statements for lodging and other expenses when the amount exceeds \$25.00. Support automobile business travel with a daily log. Where the actual expense method is used, keep receipts. If the standard mileage rate is used, deduct 22.5 cents each for the first 15,000 miles and 11 cents for each additional mile. When you use public transportation, keep a receipt and enter an explanation in your log. Meals and entertainment must be ordinary and necessary and must relate directly to the conduct of your business. Receipts and detailed explanations are required. Without adequate records and receipts, the deduction is not allowed. If you are not abiding by the rules, make an appointment now! We will show you how to support and protect your deduction.

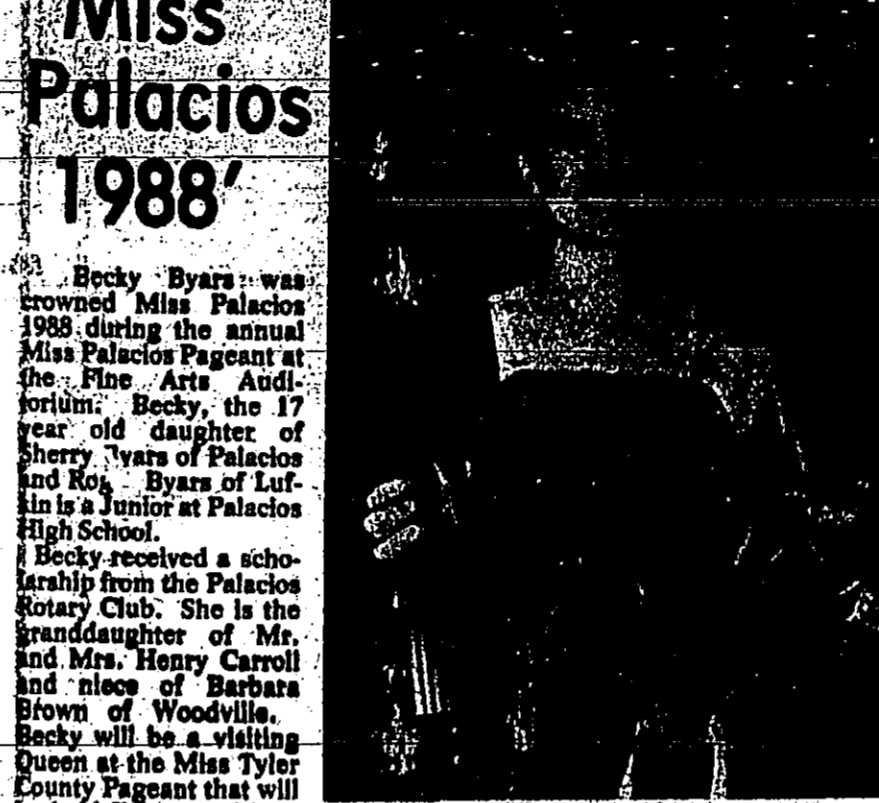

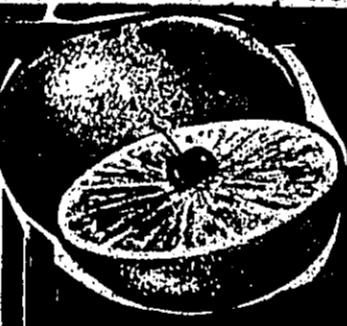
