One dogwood tree will commemorate the 200th anniversary of the signing of the Constitution and the other two trees will be dedicated to two deceased members of the Garden Club, Alice Frederick and Ruth Thomas.

## Group Petitions Council For Hwy 69 Traffic Light

A request for a Hwy. 69 traffic light was backed up by over 1,000 petition signatures submitted to the Woodville City Council Monday at their regular meeting. The council heard an appeal from three residents who live nearby the intersection who asked the council to "do somethings" to reduce the traffic hazard which they say exists at the intersection. One of the women present lost a relative in a traffic accident some months ago. Making the appeal personally on behalf of the petitioners were: Mrs. Gladys Powell, Libby Owens and Dessa Walker.

The council had invited the Texas State Department of Highways District Engineer Franklin Young to present evidence as to what his departments recommendations would be regarding the problem. Young reported to those present at the council meeting that "Speed signs do not control traffic...enforcement does."

"Whatever speed is posted should be enforced."

Young also told the audience that statistics have shown that from 30 to 45 days after a traffic light is installed...that an accident is sure to happen.

Young blamed "18-Wheelers" as the worst speed offenders in small cities saying "They crowd and go as fast as they are permitted."

Young, who was with Resident Highway Department Engineer Paul Cook from Jasper said he considered, "The City of Woodville and the Highway Department to be in a partnership in correcting the problem. Young suggested that a 30 day survey be made to monitor speeds and strictly enforce traffic through the area "We need a concentrated effort to enforce the existing speeds." Young told the group present that a special exception was necessary to install a light-but, he added, "whatever we do lets not create more of a hazard."

Young asked the council to do "An in-depth traffic engineering study...then we would like to come back to the council to ask for whatever exceptions were necessary."

"We need to proceed but with tougher enforcement" said Mayor Tom Knapp.

"We can solve any problem we have in a partnership atmosphere," Young concluded.

In other city business the council passed an ordinance limiting bow and arrow use within city limits and appointed Mayor Tom Knapp to the fireman's pension board.

City manager Walt Davis reported "very disappointing news on the gas and water system" saying that "The City was hopeful of getting the ED A Grant for the installation of those necessary lines, but Davis reported "Prisons are not privately owned and do not qualify."

Davis said his office would continue to research possibilities for raising the \$4 million necessary for the project adding that "Not even FHA loans or grants were available." Davis did indicate that a bonding procedure would have to get underway soon in order to meet the prison construction timetable.

In other action the council voted to pay their portion of the costs of a new appraisal district office which is currently eyeing the Knight Rentals and Office Supply building. According to Councilman Dr. Malcolm Radford, who is also the city appointee to the board the building is the best the search committee could come up with over the 17 months search by the appraisal district search committee. Other properties investigated included: the old Mormon Church, the Savon

Building, the Western Auto Building. Radford said the property could be purchased for \$150,000 and he was asking the council to vote in favor of the selection which would encourage them to proceed with their plans.

The Council also: -heard a request from City Manager Davis regarding the pending removal of "hazardous" building; -heard a bid request from John Crocker on supplying chemicals to the City; -asked for permission from the council to ratify a garbage rate change in connection with the new prison specifications from cubic yards to \$6 per ton.

Many of the board members stated that their opinion on the matter was that the money collected should be spent on clothes and school supplies for the children, and Christmas toys should be secondary.

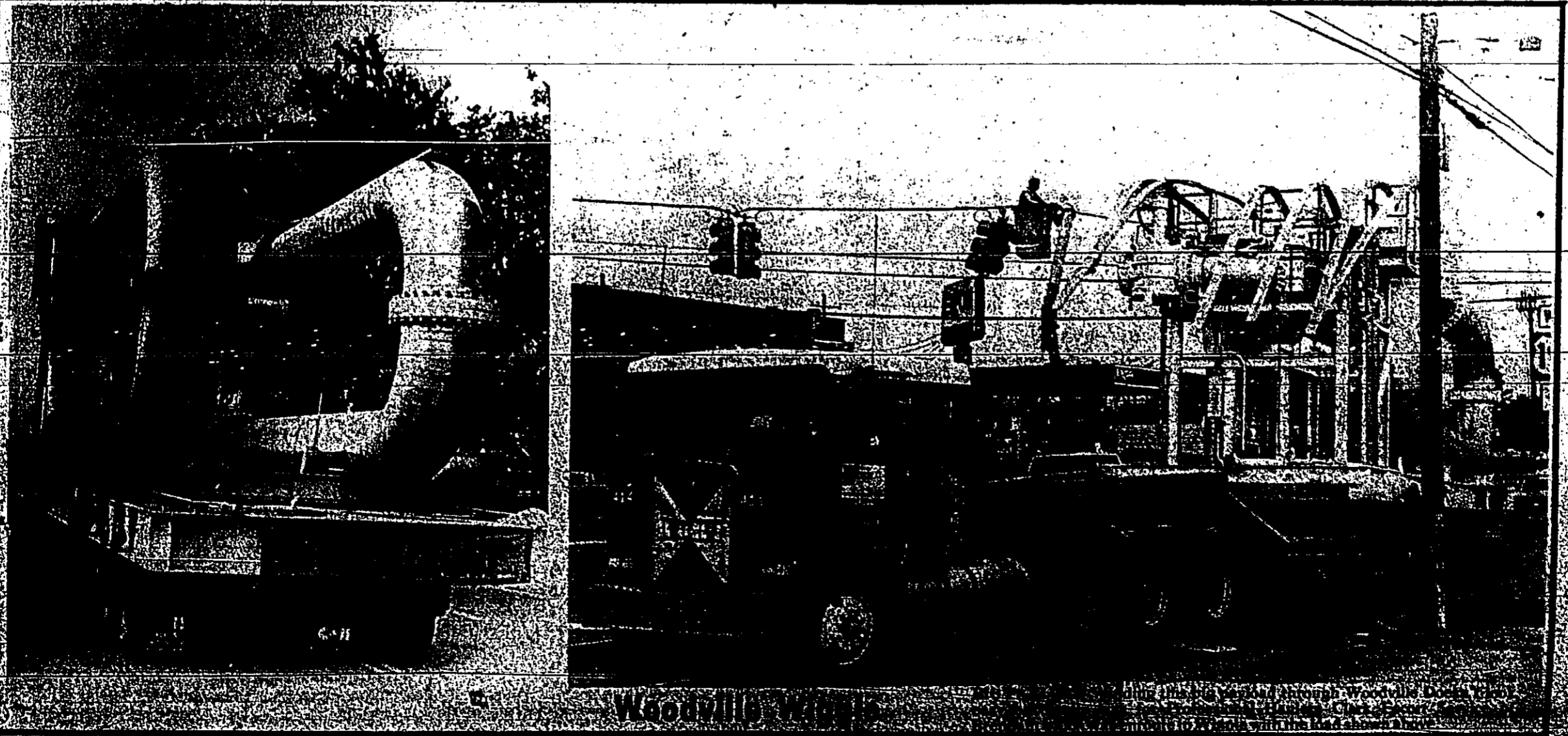
The board approved a fund raising project for the spring. They will be taking donations on a quilt which has been donated to the Children's Services Board by Dorothy Lefkowitz. Dena Connor was appointed, be worked through the Chairman of the Quilt Project. The donations will be taken during the Dogwood Festival.

## TAX TIPS

Under the old law, taxpayers were allowed one personal exemption for himself, a spouse, and each qualifying dependent. Taxpayers 65 and over received an additional exemption for age and/or blindness are repealed by the 1986 Act. A taxpayer who is a dependent, or who may be claimed as a dependent on another taxpayer's return is not allowed an exemption deduction on his own return.

The age and blindness exemption is replaced by an additional standard deduction determined with reference to marital status.

You must report the social security number of each dependent you claim who is over 4 years of age. Each failure may trigger a \$5 fine.
