

## Texas Highway Patrol Report 1 Fatal In December


The Texas Highway Patrol investigated 16 Rural Traffic accidents in Tyler County during the month of December, according to Sergeant R. D. Henry, Supervisor for this Highway Patrol Sergeant Area. These accidents resulted in 1 death and 15 injuries.

The total Rural Traffic accidents for Tyler County for this year is 205, which have resulted in 10 deaths and 151 injuries.

The ten Counties which comprise Highway Patrol Sub-district 2B-B have had a total of 2411 Rural Traffic accidents this year, resulting in 97 deaths and 1654 injuries.

This compares with 2490 accidents, 92 the same period last year deaths, and 1618 in (1986).


