# TO THE CITIZENS OF TYLER COUNTY



Most certainly not, he has plainly said that baptism is not a part of the said that baptism is not a part of the gospel and that they have been saved by the preaching of the gospel."

First, it is obvious that Mr. Barr attempts to limit the gospel only to facts concerning the life of Jesus, when Paul says in II Tim. 3:16-17 that the entire "the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes...' he need not IMPLY anything of what is already an integral part of the gospel. The gospel MUST BE OBEYED in order to obtain says in II Tim 3:16-17 that the entire record of scripture is profitable for 'doctrine for reproof for correction, for instruction in righteousness...' I deny that baptism is NOT a part of the gospel, for it is part of the word preached. I Pet 3:21 plainly says that baptism saves, therefore it MUST be part of the gospel because Christ demands it in connection with salvation in Mk 16:15-16. As well. I Pet 1:25 declares the word of God to be the gospel which word was preached to the Samaritans in Acts 8:45 and 50 the Bihippian troblems in 35 when Philip preached Jesus to him. Both the Samaritans and the nobleman resalvation, (II Thess. 1:7-9), and baptism is part of that which must be obeyed, (Lk. 6:46; Mk. 16:15-16).

Secondly, IF baptism were not part of the gospel, then what was its part in the preaching of Peter on the day of Pentecost? Were the Jews in Acts 2 saved when they asked. Men and breithren, what shall we do? (v. 37), and if so, why were they loid to repent; but, if NOT, why were they told to be baptized, (v. 38)?

Thirdly Mr. Barr seems to contend that baptism; MUST be mentioned in every passage which mentions the terms. salvation, (II Thess. 1:7-9), and bap-
