

When we came back to our car we found we had a flat tire on the back.

My husband has emphysema and heart problems and is not able to change a tire. I walked to the grocery store where we were parked and asked for information on who we might get to help us. The little lady working in the store was so very sweet to help me find someone. However, a lady was checking out her groceries and overheard my plight, spoke right up with a name and telephone number of someone who could help us. Then, she offered to take me to the station here if I would ride with her. I was so thankful for the help. She did take

me to the station, but the man could not leave because he was by himself and it was late at night. He offered to take me and his son home to change the tire. The man changed the tire and had not even mentioned pay. We offered him an amount of cash and he humbly accepted what we offered him.

The lady stayed right there with us until the man changed the tire and saw that we were going to go shopping. It seems that we were not able to get into the parking lot.

Words cannot express the thanks we have for these helpful people. I have told my story to everyone who would listen because it is so rare that we are fortunate enough to find good Christian people who go out of their way to help a person with this kind of problem.

I did not get the name of the lady or man who helped us, but I do hope they will see this letter in your newspaper and realize we are thanking them again.


