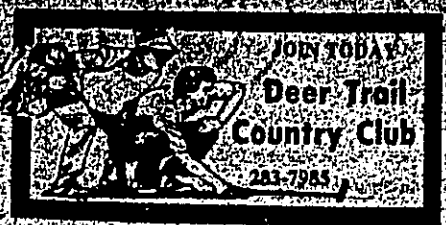

Highway Patrol Investigates 12 Wrecks

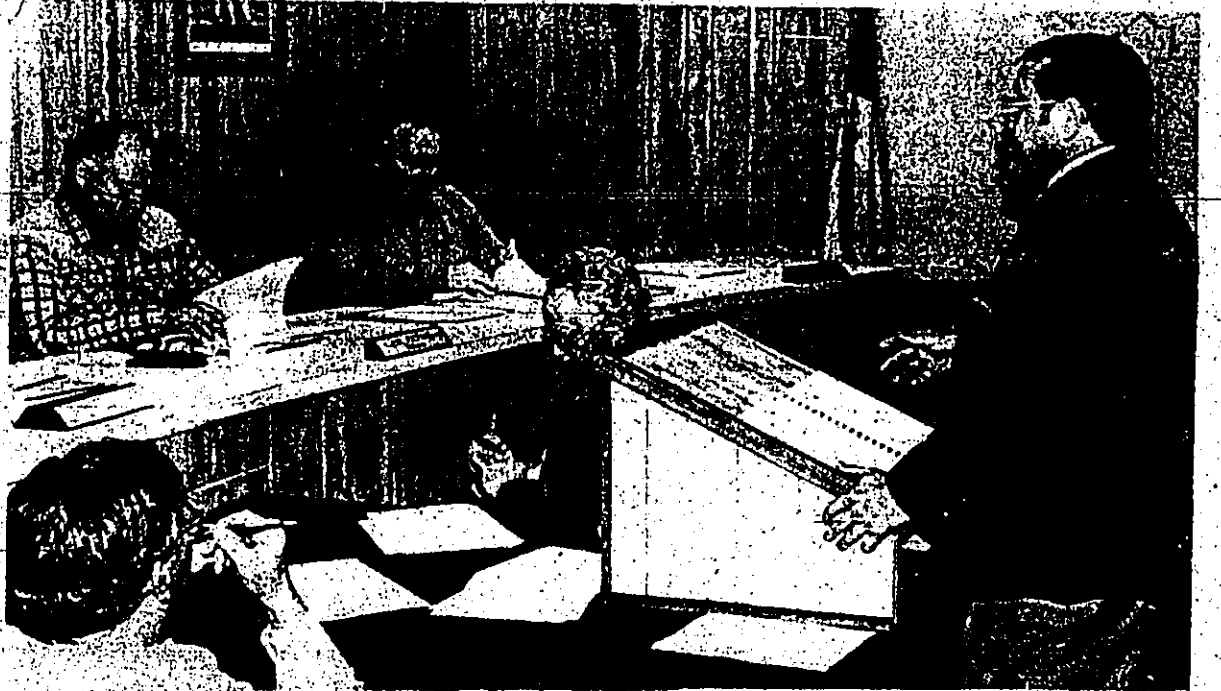
The Texas Highway Patrol investigated a total of 12 rural traffic accidents in Tyler County during the month of January 1988, according to Sergeant Roy D. Henry, Supervisor for Highway Patrol Area 2B-4 which includes Polk and Tyler Counties. As a result of these accidents, Troopers reported 6 injuries and no traffic deaths.

The ten counties which comprise Highway Patrol Sub-District 2B-B, Angelina, Jasper, Nacogdoches, Newton, Polk, Sabine, San Augustine, Shelby, Trinity, and Tyler have experienced a total of 145 rural traffic accidents, 7 traffic deaths, and 80 injuries in 1988. This compares to 149 rural traffic accidents, 7 deaths, and 89 injuries during the same one month period in 1987.

Commodities Available Feb. 11

The distribution of U.S.D.A. commodities for certified recipients of Tyler County has been scheduled for Thursday, February 11, 1988, 10 a.m. - 2 p.m. The location is to be Colmesneil Community Hall, Colmesneil, Texas. Only those persons who are certified for 1988 will be able to receive commodities. No applications for certification will be taken on the day the commodities are distributed. The first sign-in numbers will be re-

served for handicapped and/or elderly (60 years old or older) persons who do not have an authorized representative to get their food and must come themselves. In order to prevent long waits, we recommend that these people not come to the distribution before 9:00 a.m. The distribution will be conducted by Tri-County Community Action, Inc. of Center with the assistance of the Tyler County Commissioner's Court.

TAX TIPS

NEW TYPE OF DEPRECIATION Income Tax Facts and Tips

For depreciable property placed in service after December 31, 1986, a stiff new cost recovery method is called "MACRS." Modified Accelerated Cost Recovery System. Generally, MACRS increases lengthens the recovery period which is the assumed useful life of an asset. The tax effect is to reduce the yearly depreciation deduction and correspondingly increase taxable income tax payments. Of course, total depreciation under both MACRS and the previous method, ACRS, will be the same. A new 40% rule intended to restrict cost recovery on certain acquisition may, with proper planning, generate a larger write-off. If you plan to acquire depreciable assets, be sure to consider the 40% rule.
