With \$185,000 Contingency Grant Temple Foundation Will Help Build Human Service Center

Tyler County has received a \$185,000 contingency grant from the T.L.L. Temple Foundation to assist in funding construction of a new Human Service Center.

The proposed 12,500 foot facility would house the County Mental Health, Mental Retardation, Sheltered Workshop, Tyler County Aging Center and Tri-County Indigent Health Office.

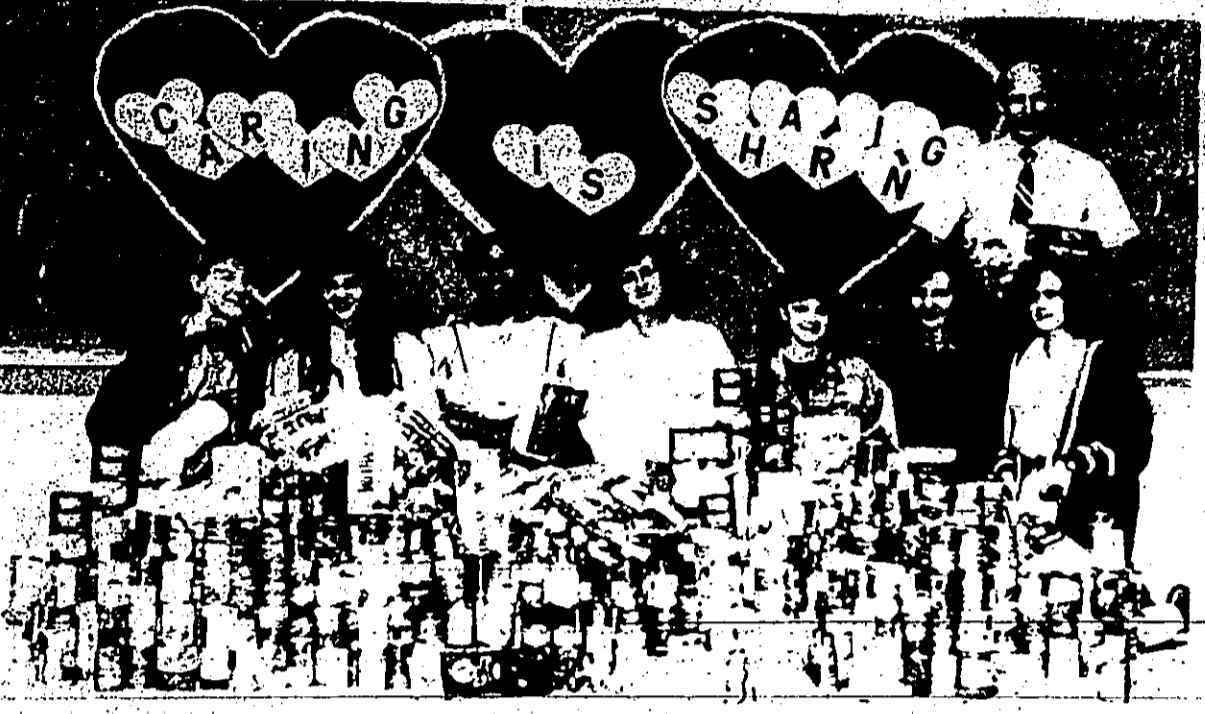
These agencies are currently operating in facilities unsuited for their needs.

County Judge Josiah Wheat said the facility project cannot be funded by the agencies involved.

"The county engineering firm projects total cost to be \$385,000," said Judge Wheat. "The county will provide all site preparation and property for the facility in Woodville."

Judge Wheat indicated financial assistance is also anticipated from the Texas Department of Community Affairs.

The T.L.L. Temple Foundation makes grants to public non-profit organizations and government agencies throughout East Texas and was established by members of the Temple family in honor of the founder of the Southern Pine Lumber Company.

County Eyes \$12,950 In Food/Shelter Grant

Tyler County has been chosen to receive \$12,950 to supplement emergency food and shelter programs in the area.

The selection was made by a National Board made up of affiliates of national voluntary organizations and chaired by the Federal Emergency Agency Management Board.

United Way of America will provide the administrative staff and function as fiscal agent.

A Local Board will determine how the funds awarded to the Tyler County area are to be distributed among the emergency food and shelter programs run by local service organizations in the area.

The Local Board is responsible for recommending agencies to receive these funds and any additional funds available under this phase of the program.

Under the terms of the grant from the National Board, local governmental or private voluntary organizations chose to receive funds must:

1. be non-profit;
2. have an accounting system and conduct an annual audit;
3. practice non-discrimination;
4. have demonstrated the capability to deliver emergency food and shelter programs; and
5. if they are a private voluntary organization, they should have a voluntary board. Qualifying organizations are urged to apply.

Some Rates Reduced Cable Rates Up March 1

February, 1988, Cencom Cable Television has announced an adjustment in basic rates due to "substantial increases in programming costs and an ongoing service improvement program," according to Larry Weatherford, Cencom system manager.

Weatherford said effective March 1, 1988, the new monthly basic rate for Cencom subscribers in Woodville will be \$14.95.

"One of our most popular channels—ESPN—increased by 68 percent its programming costs to Cencom," Weatherford said. "Last year, Cencom contracted with ESPN to provide subscribers with a 13-game NFL football package. Cencom customers will be able to see all the games in 1988."

Weatherford added that Cencom plans to increase the value of its cable package for Woodville subscribers in the coming year by adding the Nashville Network as a basic cable channel. The Nashville Network provides music, variety and comedy with a country theme.

Weatherford said Cencom will also reduce the monthly price of The Disney Channel, one of the country's most popular family oriented pay channels, to \$7.95. In addition, the company will reduce the monthly price of HBO to \$9.95.

"Programming represents just one element of our total service picture," Weatherford said. "We realize that quality cable service begins and ends at the local level. This rate adjustment helps ensure that subscribers will continue to enjoy the best possible cable service and programming at the lowest possible price," he said.

Property GSU County Tax Load: \$128,000

Gulf States Utilities Co. has paid more than \$128,000 in property taxes to various governmental entities in Tyler County.

Checks were sent to the tax assessor-collector for \$18,084.98, Tyler County; \$2,782.29, Hospital District; \$8,346.87, County Special District; and \$3,477.86, Jail Fund.

Checks were sent directly to Colmesnell School \$6,669.11; School District \$18,108.63; School District \$10,856.26; Woodville District \$50,973.07; Spurger District \$5,430.88; and the City of Woodville, \$3,511.15.

In 1987, GSU paid approximately \$35.2 million in State and local taxes within the state of Texas. Roughly \$23.2 million was divided among the state, counties and special districts, while nearly \$12 million was paid to cities served by Gulf States.

"Gulf States has long been a major taxpayer in the communities we serve," commented GSU's Gene Koci, superintendent of the company's Woodville office. "The money we pay into local economies helps support vital local services, including schools and fire districts. Our company indirectly boosts the local economy by buying supplies and services, and our employees help as individuals by spending their paychecks in those same communities. Tax payments are made on a regular basis in Texas for franchise, street rental, industrial district, ad valorem and property taxes."

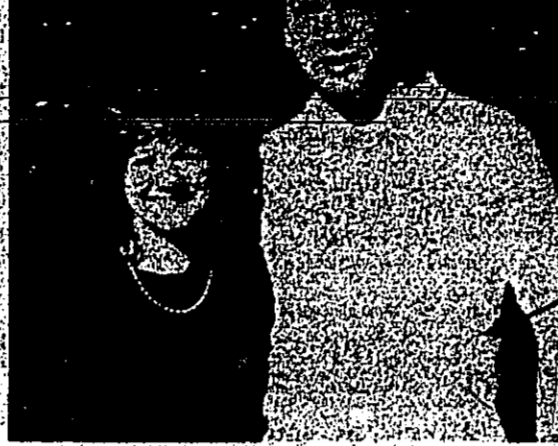

These Social Security (FICA) changes for employers, employees and self-employed individuals are all effective with January 1, 1988.
-Employers/employees rates are increased from 7.15% to 7.51% and earnings subject to the tax is \$45,000. If you earn the maximum you will pay \$248 more in 1988.
-Wages for spouses who are employed, by spouse are now subject to FICA and wages of children employed by parents who are partners or proprietors are subject to FICA when the child turns 18.
-Employers must include cash tips in the employees' wage base and pay FICA tax on both tips and wages until the two equals \$45,000.
-Other FICA changes affect farmers, corporate directors and employer-paid benefits.
