Election Marred As Races Heat Up For March 8

The March 8 Super Tuesday Primary election is taking on a sour turn this past week as politics heated up and became angry with displays of criminal mischief and anonymous press attempts pointing fingers at candidates and at even other media in their coverage of the political process.

Felony Third Degree Criminal Mischief charges were filed against Bennie Ray

Barr, of 704 Dogwood in Woodville for reportedly kicking in four plate glass windows at the Woodsman newspaper office at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Feb. 17. Editor John Yearwood indicated that Barr didn't like an editorial datelined February 18, aimed at Tyler County Sheriff Leon Fowler. Fowler said Barr reportedly had been harassing the employees in his office by telephone earlier in the week and could see no reason why he would do something like that on my behalf, he's not my friend and I didn't tell him to do that.

Fowler said that Barr turned himself in at the Sheriff's office immediately after the incident where he was arrested along with the Sheriff's Deputies Ray Stewart and Robert Matkin up the stairs where Barr was booked

and then arraigned by Peace Justice John Edwards who set a \$2,500 bond.

Fowler said that the complainant (Yearwood) later dropped the charge in order that Barr could be admitted to the Rust alcohol and substance abuse unit. Yearwood estimated damages to be around \$3,000 to the plate glass windows.

In other activity an underground copy sheet has surfaced in the county which has been distributed while the stores are closed at night to several convenience stores including the Jiffy Stop No. 1 Store on Hwy 287 where store employee Betty Sanderson apparently threw the copies away.

Several informal "backroom polls" were taken at several locations around the county and vigorously reported by an area radio station and "The Woodsman" which observers close to

the election process say have contributed greatly to the tone of this election.

Democratic Party voting boxes have already been issued prior to the vote on March 8.

Jackson 'Pleased' With WISD 'Report Card'

The Annual Performance Report of the Woodville Independent School District for the 1986-87 school year has been printed and is available to the public. According to Superintendent Dorman Jackson, anyone interested in reading the

report may go to any school library in the district for that purpose. The primary purpose of the report is to educate and inform the local community of the overall condition of the public education program in Woodville. The information contained in the re-

port is data compiled from the 1986-87 school year and does not contain data from the current school year. The report consists of three sections. Section I

was completed by the local administration and is a district overview intended to serve as a "report card" to the local community. Jackson felt that the high point of the

report was found in this section when it states that "Woodville ranked number three out of 29 districts in Region V and number 316 in the state out of 1063 districts in the

state." Section II is made up of reports compiled by the Texas Education Agency and Section III includes statistics developed by the local administration.

The trustees of the district hope the public will find the information contained in the report helpful in their evaluation of the Woodville educational system.

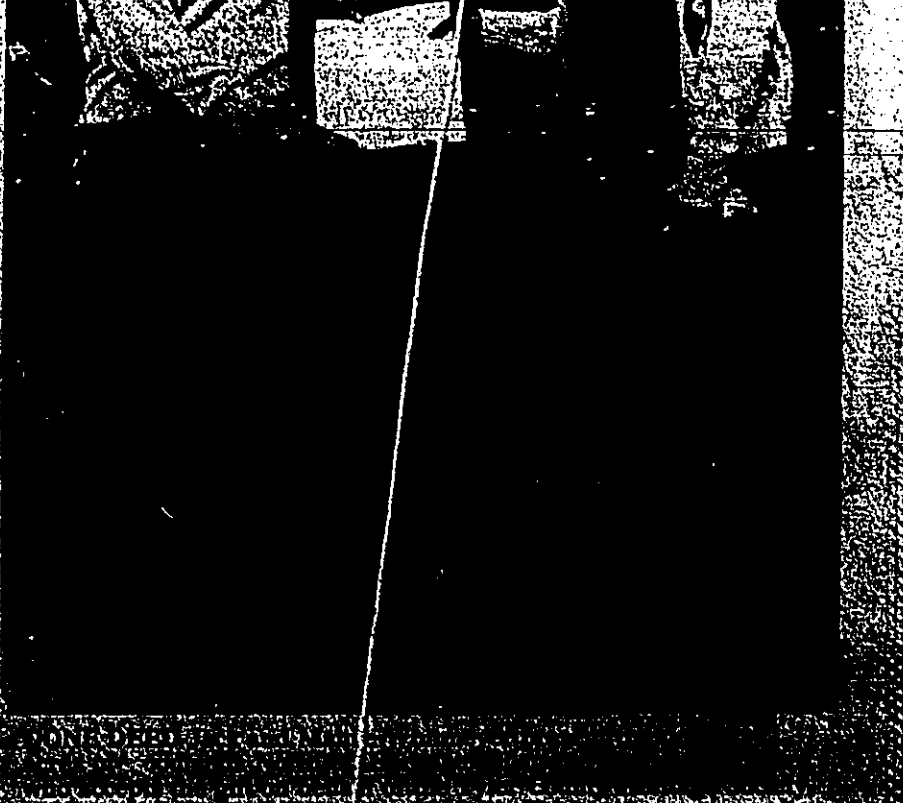
Society Accepts 11 Acre Gift

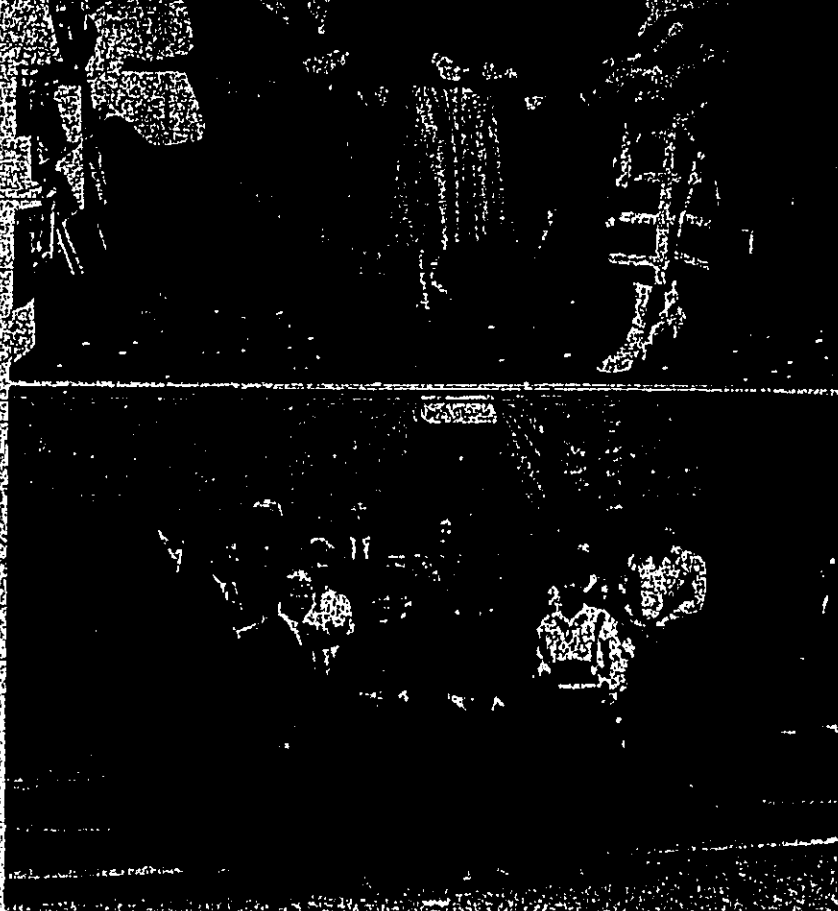

Income Tax Facts:
 - Partnerships, S-corporations, Personal Service Corporations, and Trusts under the 1986 Code generally are required to conform (change) their tax year to the tax year of the owners, partners, or beneficiary. Compliance requires the filing of two returns, one for twelve months ending with a 1987 month other than December and one for the remaining months ending with December, a short period. Income from the twelve month return is reported in the year earned. Short period income may be reported ratably over four years. All losses are reported when incurred.
 - The Revenue Act of 1987 provides an election permitting the mentioned activities other than trusts to retain their fiscal year or to change to a year other than a required year. To qualify, the activity must file an election by March 27, 1988 and make any "required payments" before April 16 of each year following the election year.

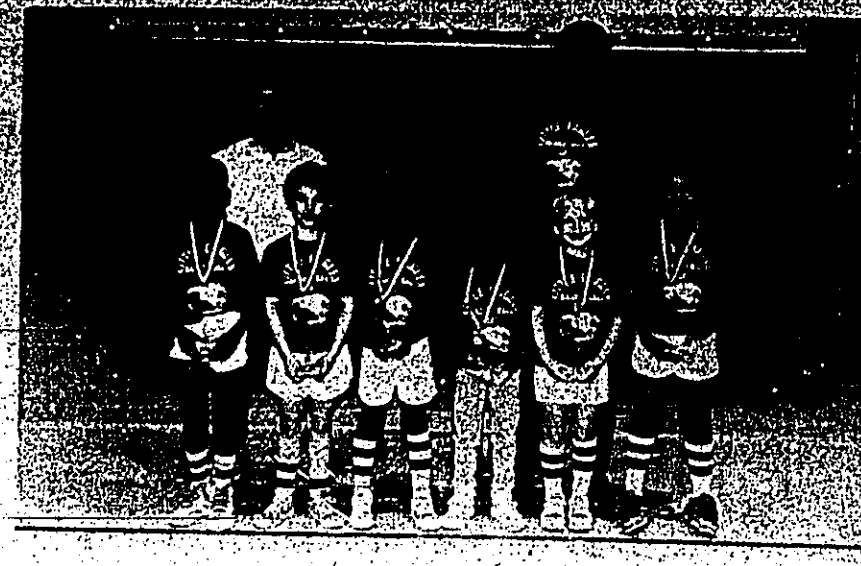
