When I took office in 1985 I had one dump truck that would run, two maintainers that were When I took office in 1985 I had one dump truck that would run, two maintainers that were useable and have bought one used Mack dump truck. I bought one used John Deere Maintainer, and one new Catapiller Maintainer and one Case Backhoe. When I bought the Case Backhoe, we had a 10 inch flood, I lost three bridges, the Backhoe we had them was broke down, the cost to fix the Backhoe would cost the county \$10,767.25. I got permission from the court to bid \$9,000.00 on a Case 580 B Backhoe and permission to purchase it.

I have replaced three bridges, one on Groves Ross road one on Rockey Springs road with a six foot culbert and one bridge on Folwer road. I have one bridge currently out on Rawls Creek that is a hundred and twelve feet long and I have applied for a grant to replace this bridge but we did not get it. I then applied with the State for the Off Road Bridge System Program and the state has agreed to fund 80 percent of the cost and the county pays 20 percent of the cost. When I lost these bridges I had \$1,500.00 in my budget to replace these bridges. In my 1988 budget I put \$20,000.00 in my bridge fund to replace this bridge if for any reason the state budget I put \$30,000.00 in my bridge fund to replace this bridge, if for any reason the state cant start this bridge soon, then when the tax money comes in, we can replace this bridge with County funds.

I also had a part in getting the three mile extension on Hwy North 92, and one all-weather bridge I purchased two pieces of right away. If re-elected I will work hard to get Hwy 92 extended to Hwy 255.

I have also applied for three grants and got one on Carlo Hill and the Old Doucette road and one other all weather bridge. If Re-elected I will continue to apply for grants to up grand ou. County roads and bridges. I feel that if I am re-elected I can do a better job in a second term, because the Precinct will be out of debt. 
