Board Considers Contract

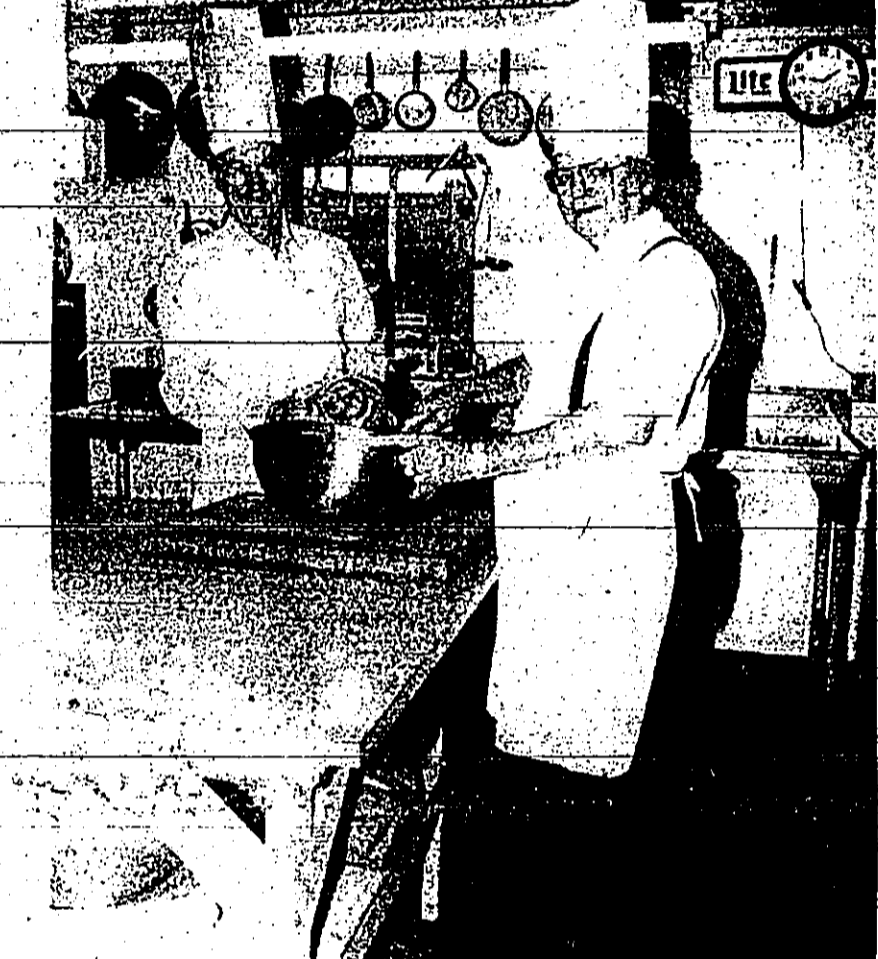
The Warren Independent School District Board of Trustees failed to take any action on six of seven contract renewal proposals at their meeting Tuesday, February 25, 1988.

TAX TIPS

KIDDIE TAX INCOME TAX FACTS & TIPS

The standard deduction for children under 14 years of age who have unearned income, interest, dividends, annuities, is limited and if the child may be claimed as a dependent by another taxpayer, the child may not claim himself as a dependent on his own return.

If the child has both earned income, which is wages, and unearned income, his standard deduction is the smaller of \$2540 or an amount that equals his earned income, but not less than \$500. When the child has only unearned income, the standard deduction is limited to \$500.

Should investment income exceed \$1000, the child's tax must be computed on Form 8615 and his parent's tax rate applied to the amount over \$1000. If the parent's return is changed (amended), the child's return must also be changed.

Parents or guardians are responsible for correctly filing the under 14 child's return.

The under 14 rule is difficult. If you have problems with it, call a professional preparer for an appointment.

For the past three years I have served as Commissioner Precinct 3. When I took office in January 1985 I had cash on hand \$6,363.00 and my indebtedness was \$40,672.00 and when my term is up in 1988 there will be one time warrant of \$19,082.26 and then the precinct will be out of debt.

When I took office in 1985 I had one dump truck that would run, two maintainers that were useable and have bought one used Mack dump truck, I bought one used John Deere Maintainer, and one new Catapiller Maintainer and one Case Backhoe. When I bought the Case Backhoe, we had a 10 inch flood, I lost three bridges, the Backhoe we had then was broke down, the cost to fix the Backhoe would cost the county \$10,767.25. I got permission from the court to bid \$9,000.00 on a Case 580-B Backhoe and permission to purchase it.

I have replaced three bridges, one on Groves Ross road one on Rocky Springs road with a six foot culbert and one bridge on Folwer road. I have one bridge currently out on Rawls Creek that is a hundred and twelve feet long and I have applied for a grant to replace this bridge but we did not get it. I then applied with the State for the Off Road Bridge System Program and the state has agreed to fund 80 percent of the cost and the county pays 20 percent of the cost. When I lost these bridges I had \$1,500.00 in my budget to replace these bridges. In my 1988 budget I put \$30,000.00 in my bridge fund to replace this bridge, if for any reason the state cant start this bridge soon, then when the tax money comes in, we can replace this bridge with County funds.

I also had a part in getting the three mile extension on Hwy North 92, and one all-weather bridge I purchased two pieces of right away. If re-elected I will work hard to get Hwy 92 extended to Hwy 255.

I have also applied for three grants and got one on Carlo Hill and the Old Doucette road and one other all weather bridge. If Re-elected I will continue to apply for grants to up grand ou. County roads and bridges. I feel that if I am re-elected I can do a better job in a second term, because the Precinct will be out of debt. Also if re-elected I will work hard with the commissioners court to have a good and efficient government. I need the support of the people of Precinct 3.

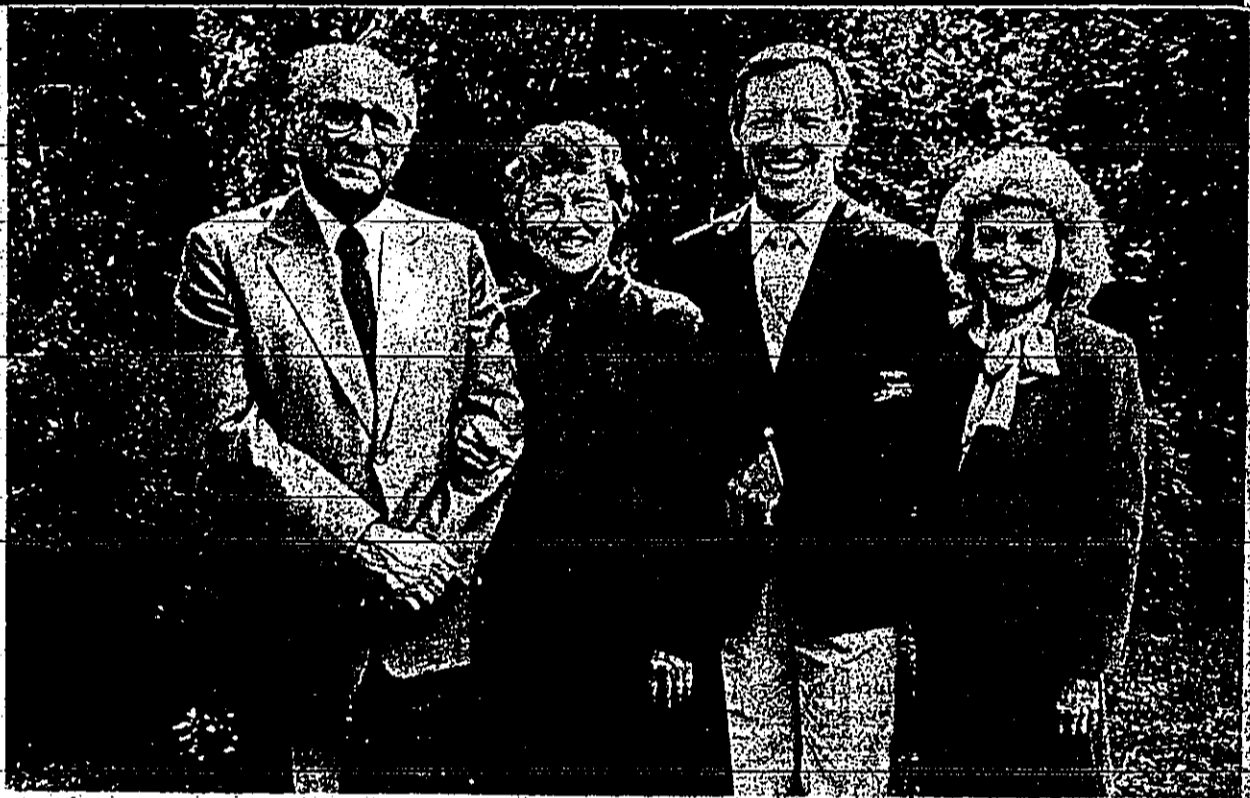
