Tubb Gives Update On Prison Progress

Prison Construction Coordinator for the Tyler County Chamber of Commerce, Industrial Committee Gil Tubb told reporters Friday that the prison construction project was on schedule and that activity for clearing the prison project core area and the surrounding acreage would begin this week.

"We're asking now for bids on grubbing and burning this week with bid form available at the office of Gil Tubb, 211 1/2 South Magnolia," he said.

Tubb said that timber sales from the property went to the Champion Corporation and proceeds from the sale of the timber would be used to offset land clearing costs. Tubb reported that the Hyde Property had been purchased and the tract as offered to the Texas Department of Corrections was complete and title transfer papers were almost finished.

Tubb informed the group that persons wishing to apply for either construction jobs or employment with the TDC are asked to contact the main office of the Texas Employment Commission.

The prison unit is expected to house some 1,000 inmates and be operated by some 267 employees.

Tubb said, "The Chamber has worked hard on this and Tyler County seems to be really pulling together." Tubb said he's had a "good support" from all areas of the county.

UNDERPAYMENT PENALTIES
INCOME TAX FACTS AND TIPS
You may be concerned about paying a penalty because too much income tax was withheld from your wages and now you have a large refund. There is no penalty for having too much tax withheld, only if you underwithhold. If you follow the provisions in the code, you will never have an underpayment penalty. Here is the easy way: pay in by timely quarterly installments or through withholding on wages. An amount that is \$100 more than your immediate preceding year's liability. If your underpayment for 1987 is due to underwithholding caused by the "New W-4," the IRS will forgive your penalty. Also, the 90% prepayment requirement for 1987 has been delayed until 1988 and the old 80% rule applies to 1987. You may avoid the underpayment penalty by following the rules. Sunny Dell News

I wrote one time about the Mesquite Tree how it stood the hot and dry weather by having a tap root about thirty or more feet deep. Also with lateral roots that spread from fifteen to fifty feet out from the trunk of the tree. It bears a long pod of beans which the livestock eat. The beans or seeds can lay dormant for several years. The trees are very difficult to get rid of account of their root system. The mesquite tree makes a good shade for live stock, deer and jack rabbits. The wood is used for firewood, barbecueing and fence posts plus the mexican cook tortoles outdoors with the wood. There use to be a small patch of Mesquite Trees near the Sunny Dell Church and will check them out soon to see if they still exist. Now I have read more about the Mesquite Tree. Mistletoe grows on them. Woodworkers made from the wood, jelly is made from the beans and wine also. The beans are ground the beans into a flour and mix it with cornmeal and it makes good cornbread and tamales. The bean pods grow to nine inches long and can be sucked like candy as they contain 30 percent sugar. One man used a cord of wood and hand-made a rocking chair which retails for 750 dollars. It took him 200 hours to make it. He sells flooring and tables made from Mesquite wood. Researchers are experiencing other products from these trees. I think the Mesquite Tree came from Mexico and made its way to South Texas. Jimmie Dean says he smokes some of his assages with Mesquite wood. There is more to the tree than just looking at it. It thrived in February so cold weather is not over yet. Wells to go.

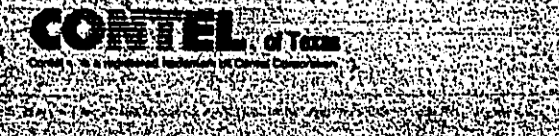

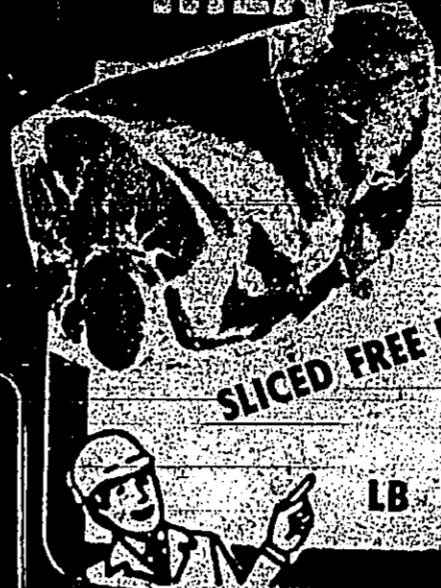
