




Brookshire Bros. Will Build New 35,000 Sq. Ft. Store On Hwy 69 S.

Brookshire Brothers Retail Operations Executive Ray Campbell said the new store will begin in late fall 1988 and will rectify access and egress problems currently experienced at the present store location. Campbell said the company is currently in the process of, or are in construction phases of new or remodeled units in Alvin, Lufkin and Jacksonville and will build a replacement unit in Cleveland. Company officials indicated that the expansion wasn't necessarily due to the future expected growth impacts of the Texas Department of Corrections prison which will locate a 1,000 man prison here. City Discusses Streets, Prison Schedules

Following a Special called meeting Monday with the City of Woodville Legal advisor and it's Financial Consultant City Fathers heard a passionate two-fold request from Woodville Howard Peacock asking that the city stop plans to levy a tax on the people of Woodville in order to build a prison system here. Peacock also leveled blows at the local media "which," he said, "presume to act for the citizens and Tyler County and their elected officials in the Chamber of Commerce promotion of a prison here." Peacock challenged the media's use of the word "requirement" in describing the action the Chamber and the City would have to take in implementing a prison here. Peacock took particular issue with the "Lumping together" of the street and prison proposals when the issue was first brought before council. Peacock asked specifically, "That the City Council assure the taxpayers of Woodville that no taxes will be levied in any manner or form to pay for the costs of a prison being built here." Peacock then asked that the Council institute a quarterly Town Forum which he asked be held just before the regular monthly meeting that month, "in the old fashioned traditions of American democracy." The Council expressed appreciation for Peacock's views on the subject. Peacock had told the council earlier that he would leave Woodville if a prison was to come here, but that he was "only shopping" now. Councilman Doug Tolbert assured Peacock, "We want you to stay."




Woodville I.S.D. School Service League To Meet March 21
