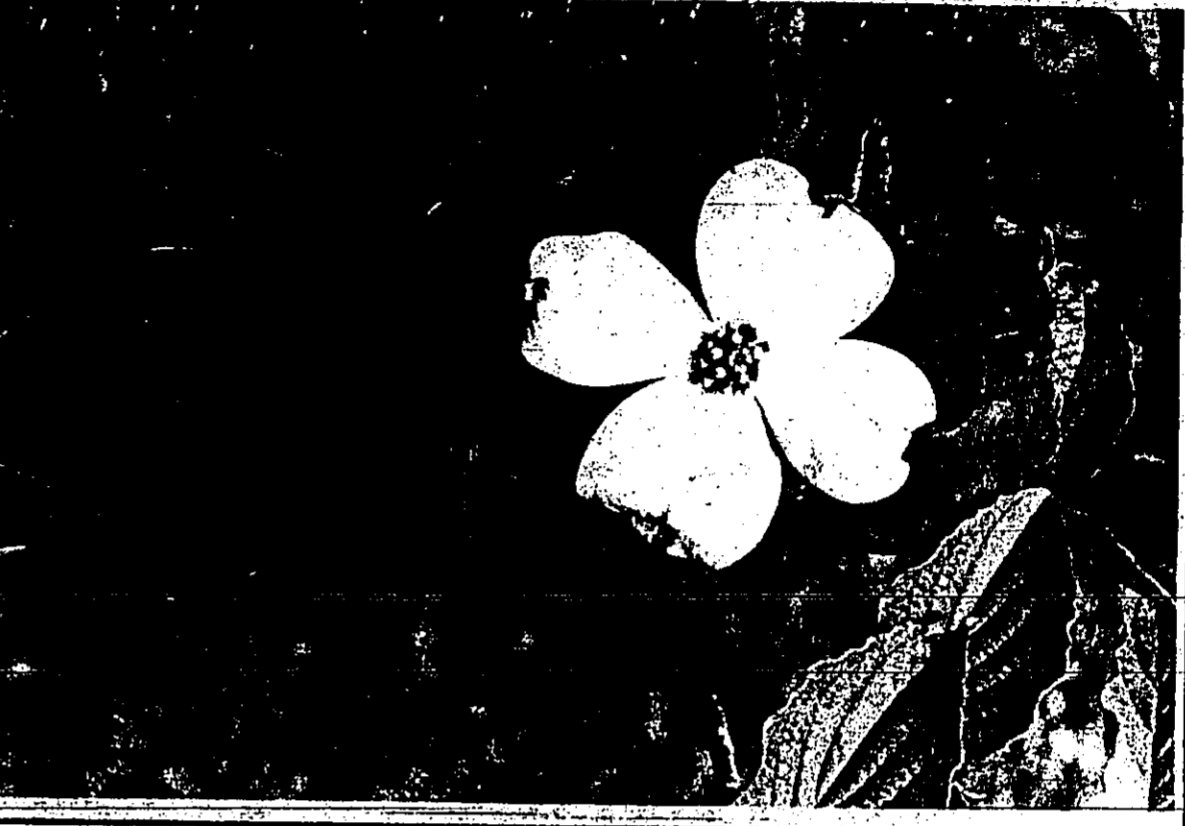

### Chamber Industrial Team Raises \$51,501 Pledges For Prison Clearing Work

The Tyler County Chamber of Commerce Industrial Committee, headed by Don Forse, along with Prison Construction Coordinator Gil Tubb said they were "greatly pleased" as a result of an initial asking for contributions to help defray the cost of land leveling for the 1,000 man Texas Department of Corrections Prison to be built here.

The total pledge was over \$51,000. Forse and Tubb updated the group of about 60 businessmen from throughout the county, and following a talk by Houston developer and Woodville Inn owner Jerry Moore, voluntary pledges began to be offered from those present. The asking lasted only about 10 minutes but the Chamber Industrial

Committee Chairmen said more would be needed "and soon".

"The time is now", Moore told the group, "or somebody else is going to get this project, and believe me," he added, "there are plenty who want it."

Tubb told the group of the logistical effort needed to level the land, adding that "We need lots of equipment and manpower."

### Band Uniforms To Cost \$38,800

By Annabeth Willis - The Woodville Independent School District Board of Trustees accepted the bid submitted by Stanbury Company for new Band uniforms at their meeting Tuesday, March 15, 1988. The Stanbury bid of \$194,000 per uniform was the low bid.

The Board approved the purchase of 200 uniforms for a total cost of \$38,800. The type of financial arrangements to be used for the uniforms has not yet been determined.

The Woodville Band Booster Club will donate \$10,000.00 toward the purchase of the new uniforms. Director of Bands Tom Harvey said that he expects to have a minimum of 130 students marching on the field in 1988 and average 150 in future years. The new uniforms are made of polyester material and according to Stansbury representative Blanton McDonald have a life expectancy of eight to twelve years.

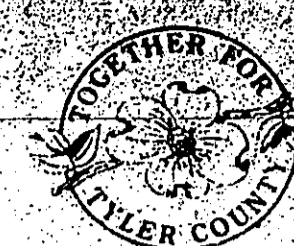

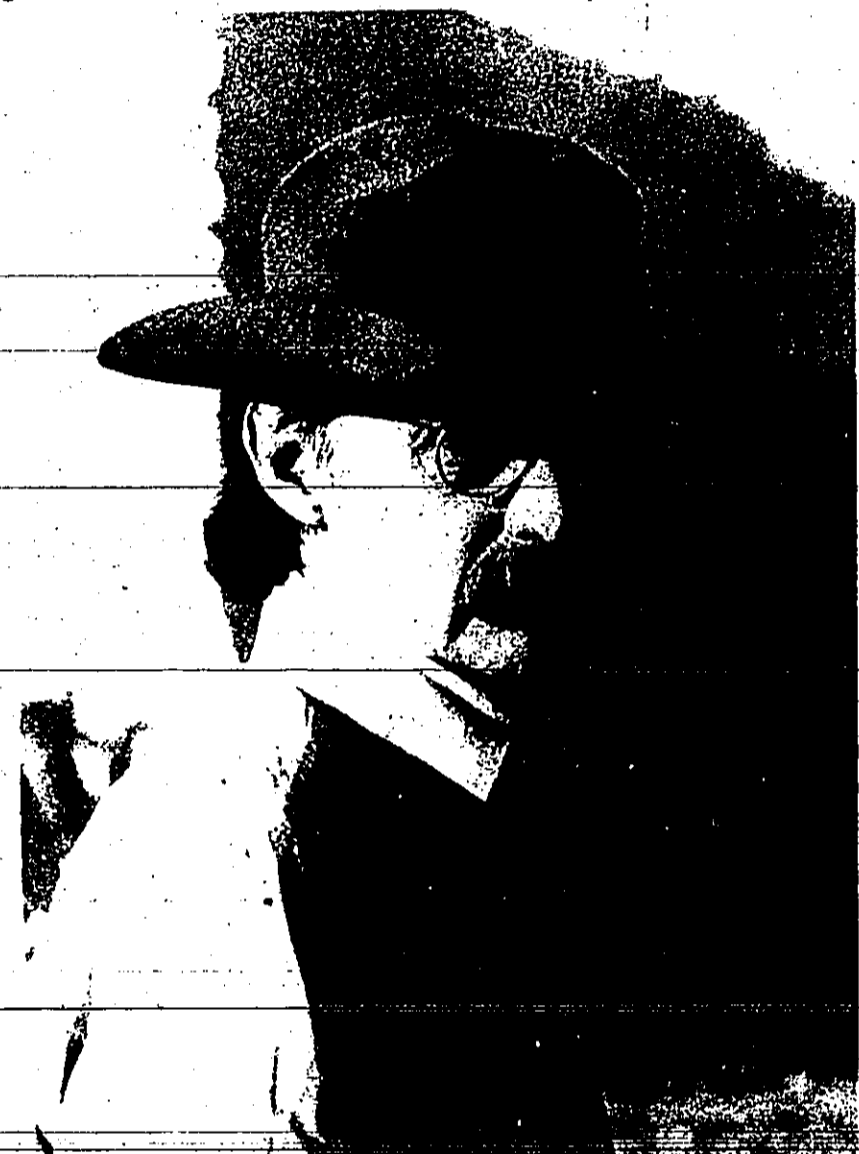

# Dr. 'Red' Duke Chosen As Mr. East Texas

James Henry Duke, Jr. M.D. was born November 16, 1928, in Ennis, Texas to James and Helen Duke. James Sr.'s long career in sales had an early impact on Dr. Red Duke as he converted his sack used in the hot-Hill County cotton fields to the friendly neighborhood paper route for the Dallas Times Herald in his boyhood home of Hillsboro, Texas. He did find time from his early entrepreneurial activities to become an Eagle Scout.

Dr. Duke graduated from Hillsboro High School and initially furthered his education by earning undergraduate degrees at Texas A&M University and Southwestern Theological Seminary. He received his M.D. at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical School in Dallas, later participating in a Special Research Fellowship and studying graduate level sciences at Columbia University in New York. After completing his internship and residency in 1965 at Parkland Memorial Hospital in Dallas where he attended President John F. Kennedy, Governor John Connally and Lee Harvey Oswald, Dr. Duke taught surgery in Dallas and later in New York. From 1970-72, Dr. Duke was Visiting Professor of Surgery and Chairman of the Department of Surgery at Nagarhar University in Jalalabad, Afghanistan.

Dr. Duke joined The University of Texas Medical School at Houston in 1972 and has held various academic positions as well as the Vice Chairmanship for Clinical Affairs. Since 1977 he has served as Special Assistant to the President at UT Health Science Center at Houston and since 1986, as a Visiting Member of the College of Veterinary Medicine at Texas A&M University. Currently, Dr. Duke is Professor of Surgery and John B. Holmes Professor of Clinical Sciences at the University of Texas Medical School at Houston. After developing a special interest in trauma/emergency situations, Dr. Duke was Medical Director of Hermann Hospital's Emergency Center. He was a founder of Hermann's Life Flight Operations in 1982 and has continued as Medical Director of the operations since then. Among his diverse array of professional activities, Dr. Duke was a founding member of the American Trauma Society and is an Advanced Trauma Life Support Instructor for the American College of Surgeons.

Dr. Duke is a serious student of wildlife, a sportsman and an avid horseman. In keeping with his "cowboy" image, The Houston Farm & Ranch Club named Dr. Duke 1985 Westerner of the Year. He has actively participated in several organizations such as Game Conservation International and Safari Club International, and has been president of the Texas Bighorn Society, Foundation for North America Wild Sheep and the Boone & Crockett Club.

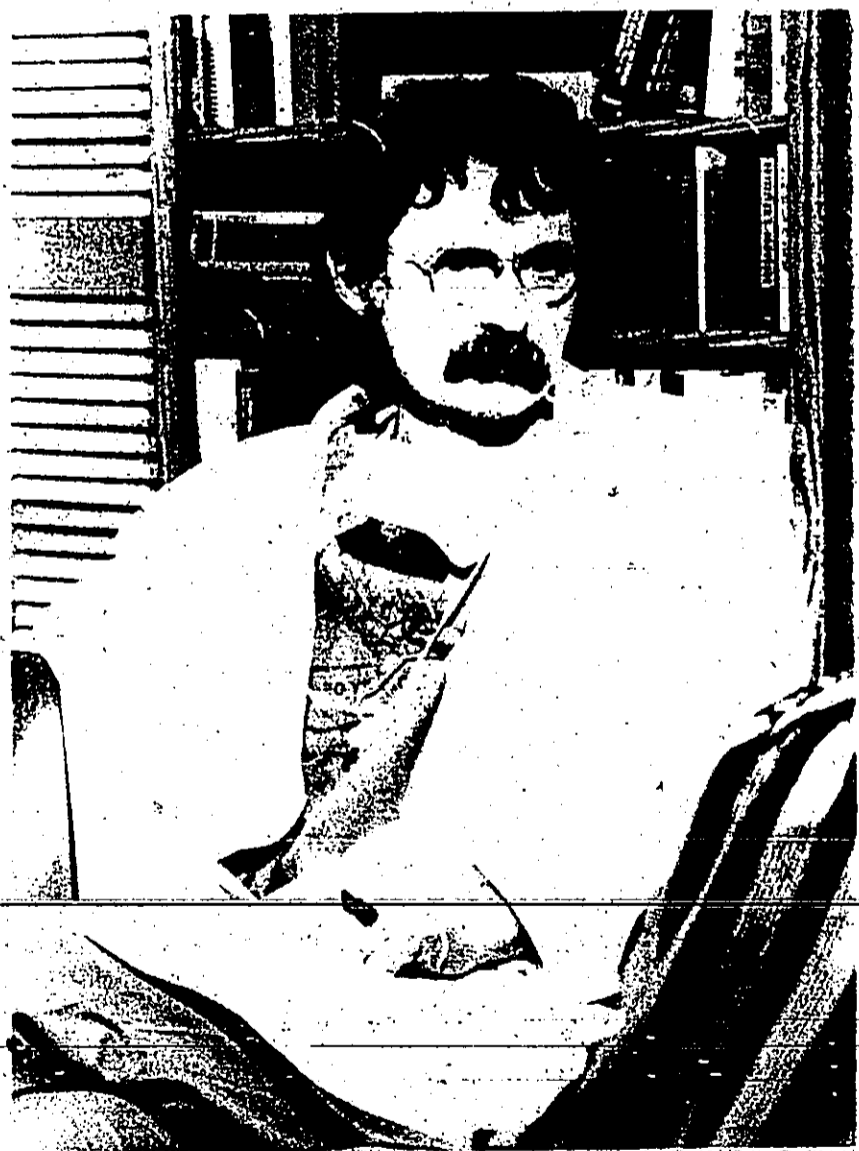
A member of the National Association of Physician Broadcasters, Dr. Duke is probably one of the most recognizable personalities in the field. He is host of the television series "Body Watch" and has made numerous special appearances on such shows as PM Magazine, and NBC Nightly News. He received Emmy Awards in 1979 and 1983 for his appearances on NBC's "Life Line."

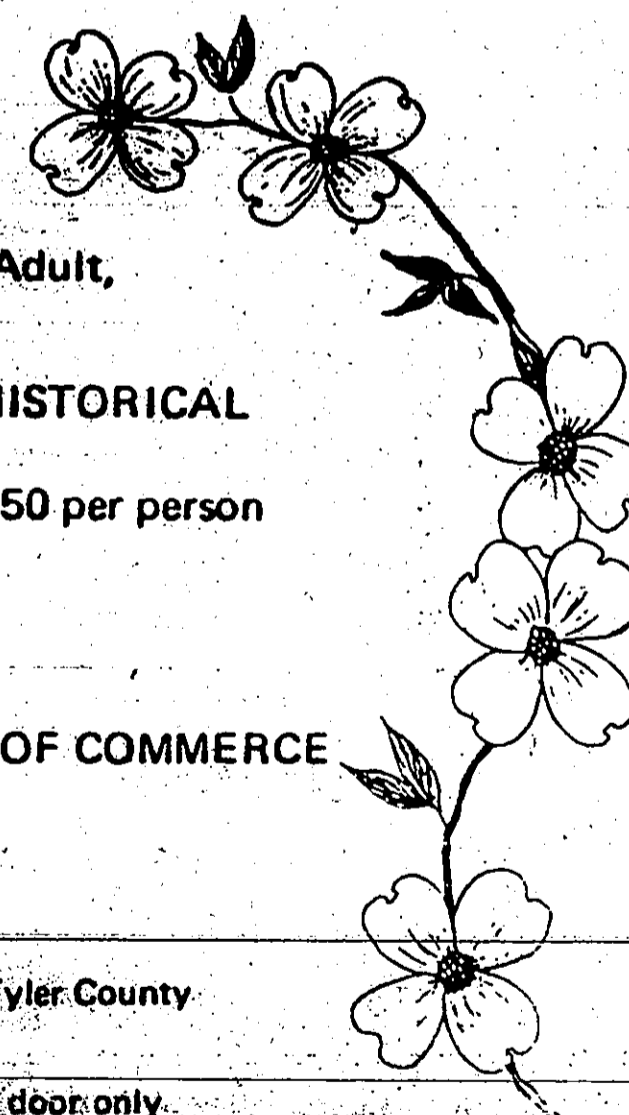

## Meyers Is Dogwood Parade Marshal

Cited for his ability "to bring people together" as exemplified in the recent Economic Summit, held in Beaumont, that city Mayor Maury Meyers was chosen "Mr. East Texas" by the Dogwood Festival Directors.

Maury Meyers, mayor of Beaumont from 1978 to 1982, was called back to that office last April with an 85.2 per cent majority vote to lead Beaumont out of the most devastating crisis in the city's history.

Plagued by unemployment, declining population, businesses closing, a crippling loss of \$20 million in municipal funds and a widespread sense of frustration and malaise, Beaumont turned for leadership to a former mayor whose terms had been characterized by enthusiasm, will, and unprecedented progress.

Maury Meyers became mayor in April, 1978. Upon completion of his

first two-year term, he was re-elected with 83.4 per cent of the votes cast in the 1980 election. At the end of his second term in 1982, he did not seek reelection but returned to private life to devote full-time to the affairs of his business as president of Accurate Business Machines, Inc. But the Meyers years in city government had changed the face of Beaumont and the character of the community, with more improvements in more areas than any like person in the city's history. Those years saw completion of Beaumont's largest capital improvements program, including a new City Hall and Civic Center, a gigantic railroad grade separation underpass for Railroad Avenue, which had been designated as Beaumont's No. 1 safety problem, completion of history's largest city-wide residential street rehabilitation program,

passage of a \$31 million bond issue for improvement of major thoroughfares; improved municipal services including upgraded refuse collection service with better equipment and more efficient routes and schedules; initiation of multi-million dollar capital programs for water and sewer system improvements; development of a master plan for drainage, establishment of the city's first community health clinic and organization of Beaumont's first Emergency Medical Transportation and Care System.

Improvements were evident in virtually every aspect of community life, including:

-City beautification, with anti-litter campaigns, formation of Beaumont's first Clean Community Commission, and initiation of a "Focal Point" beautification program for the land-

scaping of parkways and open spaces to make the city more attractive.

-Housing, with the initiation of programs to encourage construction of new dwellings and rehabilitation of substandard housing.

-Citizen participation, with hundreds of private citizens serving on city-appointed advisory committees and neighborhood town-hall meetings and hearings to encourage citizen input in community affairs.

On a broader scale, Meyers' efforts to rejuvenate Beaumont have focused directly on the problem of economic recovery and the creation of more jobs.

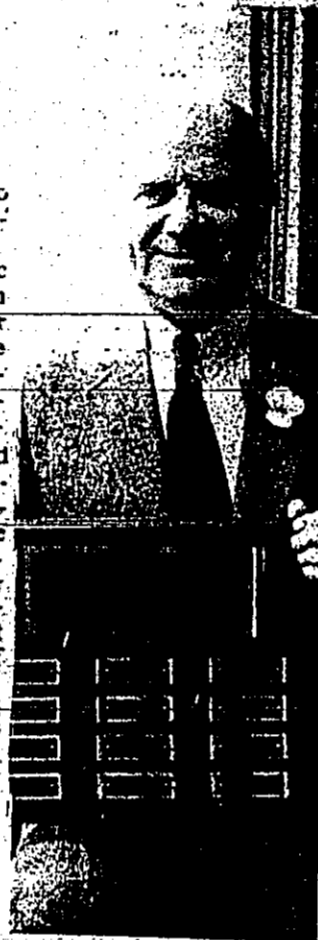
These efforts resulted in formation of the "World's Largest Economic Development Committee," consisting of Beaumont residents of all ages and from all walks of life, based on Meyers' idea that

"everyone has a part to play in economic development."

A recent "Economic Summit Conference" in Beaumont's Civic Center was attended by some 5,000 Beaumonters representing a cross section of the city's population, organizations and institutions for a program to whip up enthusiasm and chart the course of efforts to improve the economy, looking toward a second Economic Summit in eight months to take stock of the results.

Apart from his office as mayor, he is founding chairman of Southeast Texas, Inc., a private non-profit organization spearheading an innovative approach to economic development on a regional basis.

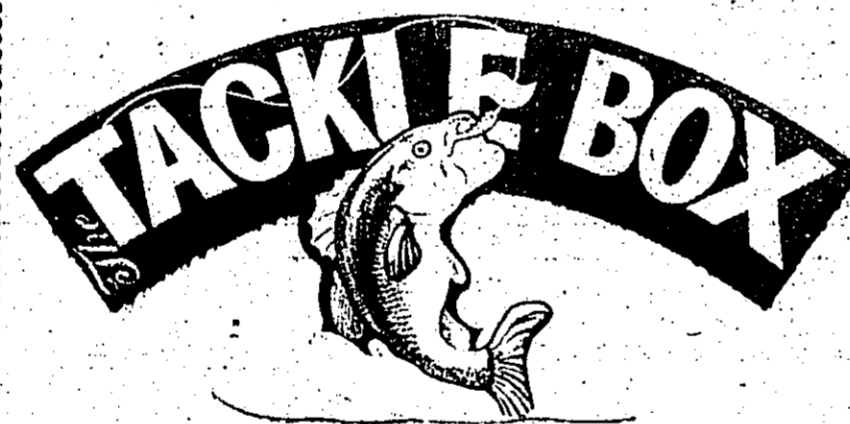

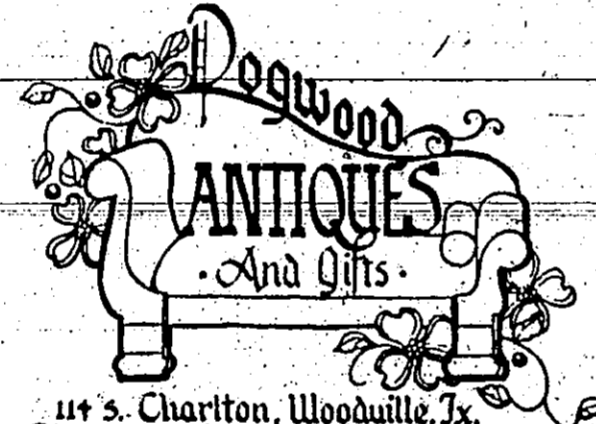

**Income Tax Facts and Tips**  
 If you owe a federal agency loan, debts or a state welfare agency for delinquent child support, your 1987 income tax refund may be "intercepted" and applied to the debt. Spouses who are "not responsible" for the debt may still receive his/her portion of the refund. Here is how it is reported.

If you receive a notice from a state agency advising you of the intercept, attach to your 1987 Form 1040 the following:  
 Form 1040X with "Injured Spouse" on top fill in name and address and sign, but do not enter any numbers.  
 Also attach Form 8379; follow the instructions on the form.

If you receive a notice advising of interception of a refund check the same rules apply, but here you only file the Form 1040X and Form 8379. IRS will make the computation and a partial refund. When you have special tax problems or a difficult return to file, call us for correct answers or for complete tax return preparation.
