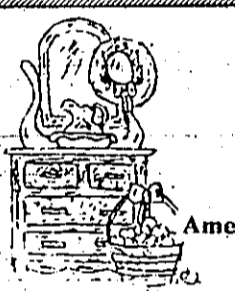

TAX TIPS

The IRA is still available for many taxpayers. If you qualify, the contribution must be made before April 16. If you are single with A.G.I. of \$35,000 or married with A.G.I. of \$50,000 and if you or your spouse are active participants in a qualified plan, you may not contribute to a deductible IRA. If A.G.I. is less than the stated amounts you are eligible for a partial deductible contribution. You determine the amount through a rather involved computation:
If you are single or married and neither yourself or your spouse is an active participant in a qualified plan, each will qualify for a deductible contribution of the lesser of earned income or \$2000. For non-working spouse, \$250.
IRAs are great shelter opportunities and may not be around long. You should take your deductible now. See us if you need help to determine the deductible amount.

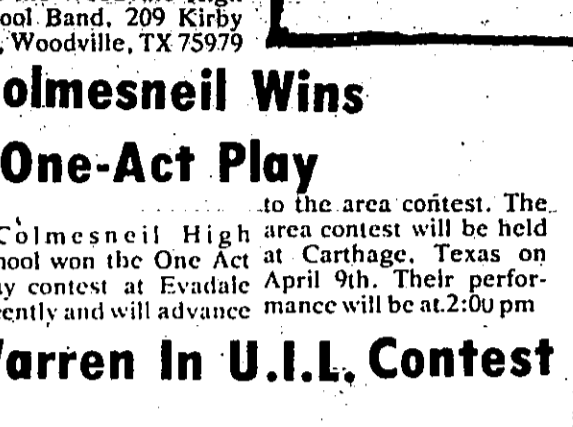

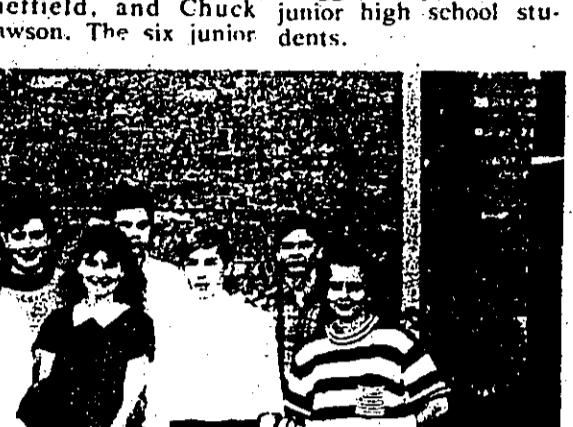
