'Smokey' Stover Disbands Jury; Hardy Says 'No Legal Precedent'

District Attorney Pat Hardy

88th District Judge Earl "Smokey" Stover dis charged the December 1987 to 1988 term of the Grand Jury, which was about three months complete into its 6 monto\_term\_giving son for the action while local courthouse observers say 'it took more than guts' for the District Judge to release the jurors, some of whom were apparently upset over the move, saying it called their integrity into question. District Judge Stover refused to comment on the case Tuesday because of pending motions" except to state the oral restraints he was under since Tyler County Criminal District Attorney Pat Hardy had first filed "Motion to Reassemble the jury" and had, second. filed Tuesday on District Judge Stover "To disqualify or recuse himself" for dis-charging the 1987 Grand Jury. No reason given".

Hardy said in his motion, "That Stover has left Tyler County without a Grand Ju-

ry at a critical time." 'I didn't feel like he acted legally in disbanding this Grand Jury," Hardy said. and I can't find any statutes. If there is a reason I'd just like to know what if

Courthouse veterans indicated Tuesday, however, that if a Judge feels that his Grand Jury is "tainted", that it is his prerogative to dismiss them to insure and guarantee impartial due

"You have to be thick skinned at times like this." and if a member of the jury has prejudiced or impuned the jury itself by talking outside of the jury room then there may be cause to disqualify the whole body." A judge would have to take the action in terms of the com-plete body of jurors. "If the impartiality of the jury comes into question as was suggested through a report in another local newspaper in Woodville by the Jury Foreman himself, Jack Es-

ier, then, that action could

be justified. Apparently Esler delivered a challenge to "Woodsman" Publisher John Yearwood, for D.A. Hardy and Yearwood to settle their differences. Hardy, however, said Tuesday that even though he considers Esler a friend, "that he didn't give him the authority to deliver any challenge to Yearwood. The alleged

act by Esler, as reported in "The Woodsman", of communicating the idea of a confrontation in terms of the Tyler County Criminal District Attorney may justify the District Judge's dismissal action; the courthouse veteran concluded.

The 88th District Court has until the end of the term in May to impanel another jury. There were 14 cases set to appear including a Capital murder case.

Hardy said of the Grand Jury, "It was picked like any other Grand Jury but it's not the best Grand Jury I've ever had, but it's as good as any I've had.'
