





## Postal Hike To Cost Texas

\$8.6 Million

AUSTIN, Tex.—State Comptroller Bob Bulloc said Priday this week's hike in postal rates will cost the state an additional \$8.6 million during the current budget.

"When the cost of stamps goes up, house-keeping costs to the state go up just like they do for everyone else.", Bullock said.

He said that more percent, first class prescribed to 176.7 percent and third class costs by about 24 percent.

The overall cost to the state should average about 17 percent during the next 17 months.







