For the past 30 years, Miller has been a member of the Lions Club, member of the Jasper-Newton Counties Landowner Association, Texas Forestry Association, National Forest Association, DAV and RSVP.

Miller is listed in "Who's Who in South and Southwest" in 1967 and 1968. Also Veterinarian Medicine & Science in 1987. He has been to Russia, with the People-to-People Group in 1966 to exchange ideas with the Russian veterinarians.

Miller's hobby is Bee Keeping, which he has been involved with for the past 15 years. He has

been to Costa Rica, Panama Canal and recently returned from Venezuela studying their ways and how to try to control the killer bees.

President Hufford stated, education for the public is the primary key in controlling the killer bees and encourages members to make plans now to attend this very informative program.

W-2's, 1099's, and K-1's are referred to as "information returns." Both you and the IRS receive copies reporting a month or so after the end of your account. You use this information to verify the correctness of your return. Sometimes an error is made when the information return is issued. When this happens, both you and the IRS will receive a "corrected" W-2, 1099, or K-1. The word "corrected" should appear on the re-issued information return. 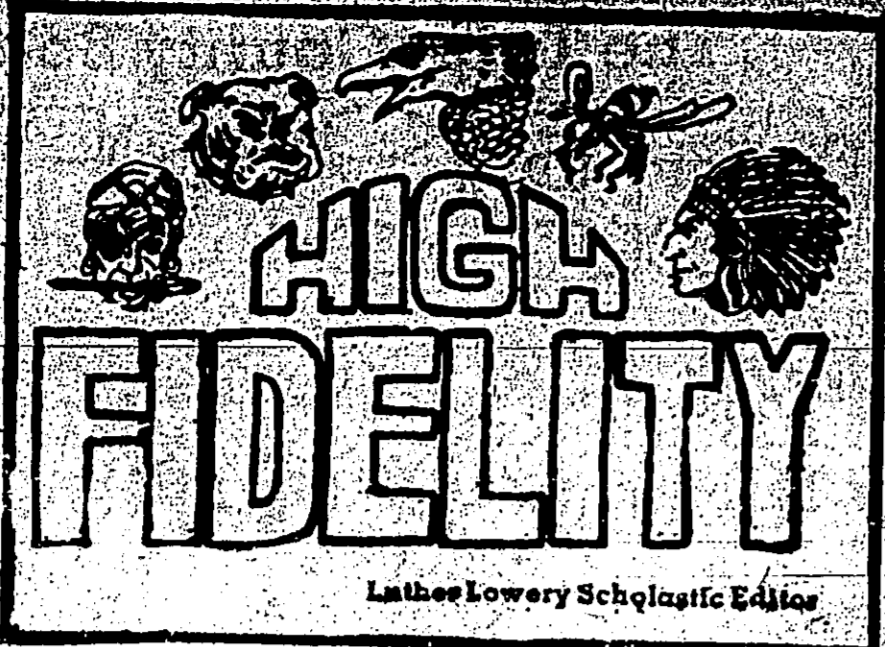
The district track meet will begin Thursday evening and continue Saturday in West Hardin.
