Stover: Jury Indelibly Tainted

Criminal District Attorney Pat Hardy's motion to reassemble the 1987 Grand Jury term of the Grand Jury was denied in a "detailed order" issued on Monday April 25 by 88th District Judge Smokey Stover.

Stover cited a series of newspaper articles which obviously improper and indelibly tainted the purpose and impartiality of the grand jury. Since the foreman is the official spokesman of the grand jury, the conduct in this particular instance could be reasonably construed as formal action of the

entire action of the grand jury, thereby subjecting the entire grand jury process to disrepute, ridicule and loss of public confidence.

Judge Stover's order was referring to a reported incident where Esler

The Woodville Independent School District filled key positions Tuesday, April 19, 1988, as they employed Melvin Houston as Athletic Director and Head Football Coach, Mary Hymel as Assistant Band Director, and Don Boler as Shop Teacher. Houston, who was employed by the District as Athletic Director

and Assistant Principal, will now assume the reins of Athletic Director and Head Football Coach. It is Houston's second time to serve as Football Coach in the District. Mary Hymel will fill the position vacated by Bob Renfro. Renfro has served as High School Band Director for two years and Assistant

Band Director for three years with the District. Hymel graduated from high school in Houma, Louisiana, received her Bachelor of Arts in Music from Louisiana Tech University, and is presently completing her Master's Degree in Music from Lamar University. Don Boler will replace Shop teacher Phillip Bru-

nnett who retired in January. Boler's contract is for the 1988-89 school year. He will finish this year with the district as a substitute.

Literacy Outreach Program

Reading should be pleasure, but to a lot of teens, and even adults, it is not only a chore, it's an impossibility! There have been training programs in the metropolitan areas for a long time, but now there is help locally!

Bethel Baptist Church in Warren is the Host Church in the New Bethel Association for the Literacy Mission Pro-

gram co-sponsored by the Baptist General Convention of Texas (BGCT) and Baylor University.

Mrs. Darlene Leger is the Co-ordinator for the program at Bethel.

Earlier this year, Dean and Joyce Richardson, retired Southern Baptist Missionaries, came to Bethel to conduct a Literacy Seminar for volunteers interested in this area of missions. The seminar was comprised of 16 hours of intense study, training those volunteers to conduct one-on-one reading classes for adults as well as teaching them to train others for the program.

Most people do not realize that the inability to read is a wide-spread problem, but in a meeting recently with the Texas Literacy Council, State Commissioner of Education William Kirby said that "twenty percent of adults in Texas are functionally illiterate." And he added that "another thirty percent are only marginally literate and thus are not prepared to compete in an increasingly word-oriented society."

Now that we have trained volunteers, we need students," says Mrs. Leger. "Not many people, especially adults, want to admit that they cannot read, so if you know of anyone who has difficulty reading, please have them call me at 547-3104 in Warren. The training is completely private, at the student's convenience, for one or two hours per week, or even more if the student so desires. There is normally a small charge for books, but if that is a problem, arrangements can be made. All we ask is that the
