



"The Rest of the Story of Warren ISD"

In Kenneth Gregory's "Facts to Warren ISD Taxpayers", he states that the tax rate was raised from \$1.27 to \$1.49. The effective tax rate was changed because the Tyler Co. Tax Appraisal Board lowered property evaluations. The change from \$1.27 to \$1.49 effective tax rate kept the tax income revenue for the district the same, not higher. Most taxpayers actually paid LESS TAXES\* NOT MORE Mr. Gregory's own home taxes were lower.

The 1986 Warren budget was \$3,746,824. In 1987 the budget was \$4,730,413. The 1987 budget inclined the amount transferred from savings for the Warren Elementary School, leaving a budget actually less than it was in 1986. This 1987 budget also absorbed approximately \$90,000 in teacher pay raises mandated by the state.

The Texas Education Agency reports that Warren ISD CTBS and TEAMS scores have steadily increased over the past five years. Warren now has a higher percentage of students going to college than ever before (indicating that SAT scores must be going up in order to be admitted.)

1. The bottom line is the actual taxes paid in 1987 compared to 1986. If you will check your taxes for those two years, most people will see that they actually paid less taxes in 1987 than in 1986, while our -school district has continued to improve.
