## City Gets \$2,100,000 Loan For Sewer Tie

AUSTIN (May 19, 1988) — The Texas Water Development Board today approved a \$2,100,000 loan to the City of Woodville. The funds will be used to tie the City's existing water and wastewater facilities to a regional system that will serve Texas Department of Correction's new medium security prison which will be located in Woodville. The water supply improvements will consist of a new water well, a 500,000 gallon ground storage tank, and a 250,000 gallon elevated storage tank and appur-

tenances. The wastewater treatment facility improvements will include the construction of sewer lines to the new TDC facility which has an initial 1,000 inmate capacity.

## College Courses Offered

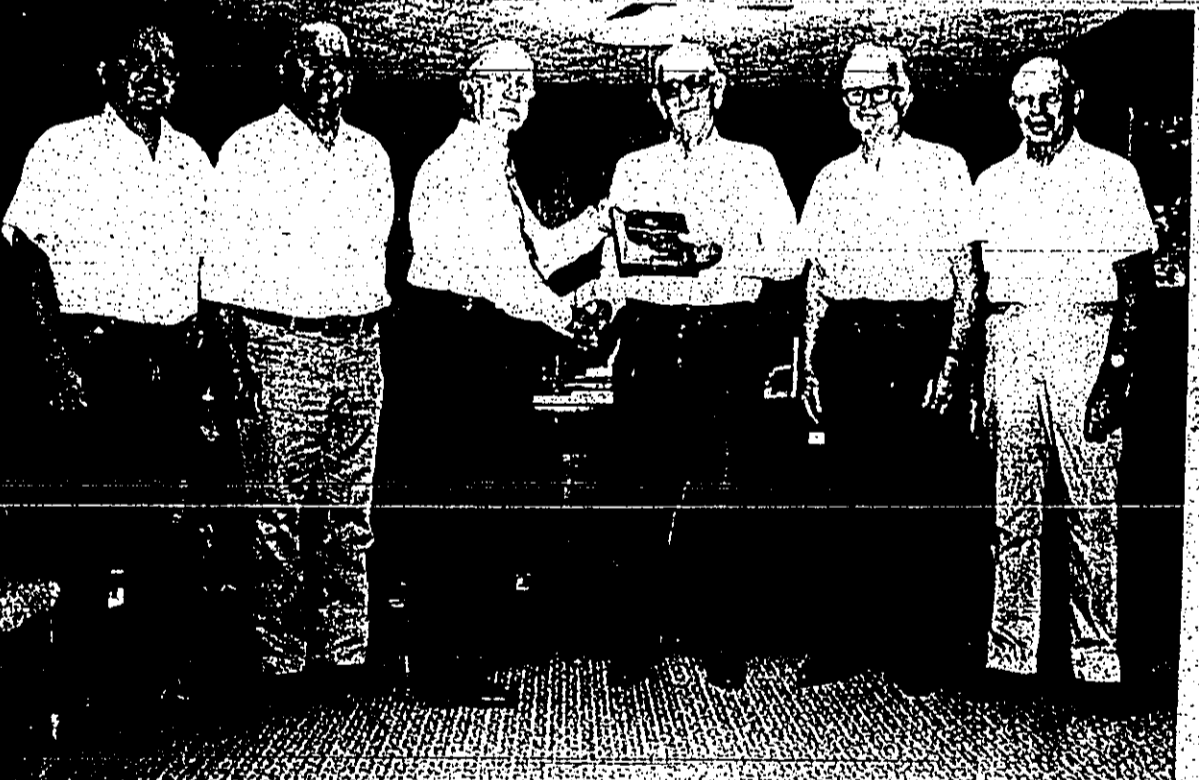

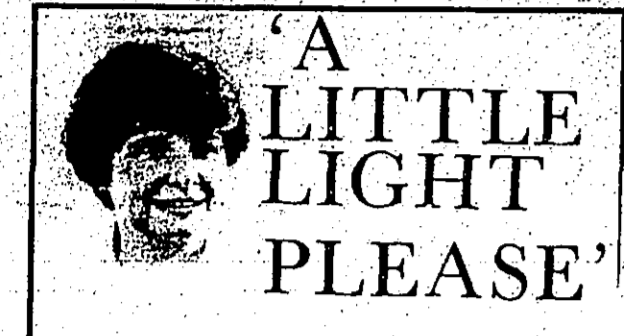

**'A LITTLE LIGHT PLEASE'**

"Sending Up Balloons"

There they were. All ready to go. They were tied with various colors of pastel ribbons in order that they would stay together. At the bottom, they had been secured with a single transparent bag that had been filled with the names of children.

The children had watched them bob up and down as they were carried out to the "launching pad". There was a single silent moment in which the balloons seemed to raise their inflated latex heads in majestic pride. Because, you see, today they were more than a mere balloon. Today, for a short while, they would serve as a symbol for "Ascension."

And then, the anticipated moment came when the bouquet of balloons was to be set free. A quiet hush fell upon the expectant crowd. There were soft sounds of giggling amidst the sighs of "Oh's". But, as the lovely balloons took flight, the sounds of vigorous cheers of delight could be heard echoing from the nearby barriers of distance. The electricity of emotion flowed through the little body of spectators and left no doubt that they had witnessed an "Ascension."

Of course, the entire event had been planned in honor of the ascension of our Lord. It could be as simple as "sending up a balloon."
