Fire Demolishes Two Homes

Two fires a day apart completely destroyed two dwellings at opposite ends of Tyler County; one on Friday June 3 and one on Saturday June 4.

The G.J. Tubbs Broussard Residence of Spurger was razed when a bolt of lightning apparently ran down an oak tree and jumped from a limb to the front bedroom wiring of that family's 14,000-square foot cedar house. The couple was at home at the time and estimate losses to be around \$90,000.

According to Rachael Broussard "There were fire departments from everywhere... they filled up the front yard." The Woodville Fire Department had trouble due to a fallen tree blocking the entrance, however."
