County Radios On Blink

Tyler County Commissioners barreled into a heavy schedule at their regular monthly meeting Monday and deferred about 50 percent of their scheduled agenda for action this Friday, June 17, at 10 a.m. in the Commissioners Courtroom. Focus of the meeting fell on the dissatisfaction of the court on the poor service provided through the Tyler County Justice Center Dispatch office equipment. Judge Josiah Wheat said the vendor who installed the equipment might have to come pick it up if they can't get it to perform. The installer and provider of the equipment was GE/Trinity Communications, Inc., of Beaufort, Wheat said of the radio system. "We haven't paid for it yet." Sheriff's officer Wade Skinner referred to the system as "As good as two cans and a string." In other action the court opened bids on trucks for Precinct Three and Four and authorized a payment for an electrical repair in the courthouse amounting to \$250. In other approved action the court authorized the approval of a crossing permit for the Chevron Company to cross roads in Precincts One and Two. The commissioners also approved the routine county extension agents report, the treasurer's report, the county probations monthly report and the J.P. monthly report. The court also approved the allowances and accounts payable from the auditor's office. Stated for Friday action by the court is the following items: -approve paying bills from auditor's office. -Gary Chandler on Drivers License telephone. -consider bids on truck Precinct IV. -approve resolution authorizing county judge to negotiate aging contract for 1989. -consider settlement agreement concerning law suit against Diamond M Construction Co -approve request from probation office for detention/emergency shelter funds. -consider payment of bills from Constable W.B. Bailey. -set cost of housing prisoners from City of Woodville. -take action on radio system installed by G.E./Trinity. -consider bids on surplus equipment. -consider authorizing purchase of paint for stairwell and foyer to district judge's office and office of the county commissioners. -appearance by representative of the City of Woodville concerning dispatch service by county for Woodville Volunteer Fire Dept.

'Needs correction, tomorrow, tonight....right now!'

City Mayor Announces Appointments

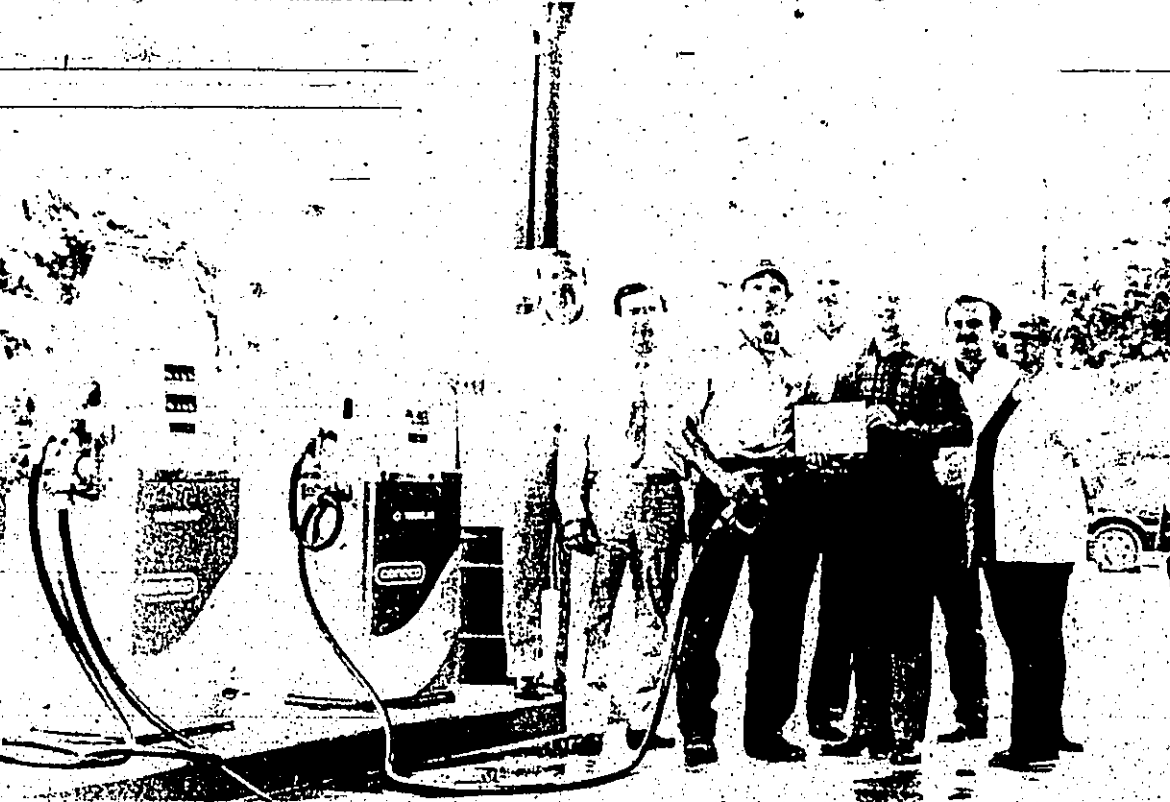
City Mayor Tom Knapp acted Monday at the regular City Council meeting to appoint two persons to key law enforcement posts in the city. Knapp appointed City Policemen Sam Bible as Acting Police Chief after declining to renew the appointment of James Kimble to that post. Knapp said the action was discretionary to his office and that the City would begin taking applications in order to fill the top law enforcement post in the City. Knapp also appointed Alva Cook to the post of Municipal Judge replacing Judge T.E. Phillips who was serving in an interim capacity. In other appointments action by the City Mayor the following were selected to serve on the Tourism committee: Christine Sanders, Harry Reiter and Don Stevenson.

Council Eyes Engineers

The Woodville City Council were given six proposals from engineering firms interested in helping Woodville spend some \$2 million in street improvements here. The firms included: Goodwin Lassiter of Lufkin; Garrod & Darte Inc. of Beaufort; DP Consulting Services of Nederland; Schamburg & Polk Engineers of Beaufort; Everett Griffith and Associates of Lufkin; and Kindle and Stone & Associates, of Lufkin. Klotz Associates submitted a proposal but did not appear before council in person. Councilmen Billy Rose and Doug Tolbert were appointed as a Street Committee to recommend to the council which engineering firm should be chosen to begin the work. Council said they expect the work to be performed and completed during 1989. In other related action, the council authorized the legal consultants firm of Vincent and Elkins and The First Southwest Company Bonding Firm to proceed with the selling of the street bonds.
