Woodville Honor Courses

The Woodville Independent School District Board of Trustees approved several additional honors courses at their meeting Tuesday, June 21, 1988. Those courses added to the honors course list are Art II, III and IV, Applied Music,

Advanced Social Studies and English IV. According to High School Principal Larry Dickerson, English IV probably will not be implemented as an honors course until 1989-90. Previous honors courses are English I, II, and II, U.S. History, World History, Phy-

sics, Pre-Calculus, and Computer Science. Dickerson said that Physics will be removed from the honors course list for 1988-89 due to inadequate lab facilities. Physics will still be taught in the district. A contract was awarded to Musick & Associates for an asbestos in-

spection and management plan for the district. The inspection must be done by Oct. 12, 1988. This inspection will locate asbestos throughout the district. Once the asbestos is located, a management plan will be implemented.

Woodville Teams Test Results

The TEAMS Test report indicated an overall upward trend for the District. The TEAMS Test is a mastery of basic skills test and is given to Grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and

11 each year. Superintendent Dorman Jackson said that he felt the scale score was the single most important factor of TEAMS Test. The scale

score indicates how high you scored on a passing scale of 700 to 999. The scale scores for Woodville students had increased in most areas as

well as the percentage of mastery scores. California Achievement Test scores were also presented at the meeting. They were as follows:

Gramm Suggests Drug Dog Control Of Area Rainbows

Washington-- U.S. Sen. Phil Gramm has secured the assistance of drug-sniffing dogs from the U.S. Customs Service to help stop drug use among the estimated 15,000 "Rainbow Family" members gathering at the Angelina National Forest for the upcoming 4th of July weekend.

Gramm said the dogs are another step the federal government can and will take to help enforce the law at the national forest, particularly laws prohibiting drug use. "Efforts are underway to secure additional resources to help the U.S. Forest Service in their enforcement efforts to

control the so-called "Rainbow Family", the senator added. "I hope the presence of these highly trained canines will go a long way toward convincing people that we will not tolerate drug use in East Texas," Gramm said. "I will continue to insist that all drug use, drink-

ing, and public health and sanitation laws be fully enforced and violators be prosecuted." "Our national forests are there for people to visit, but those who come to East Texas to break the law, particularly with regard to drug use, are not welcome," Sen. Gramm said.

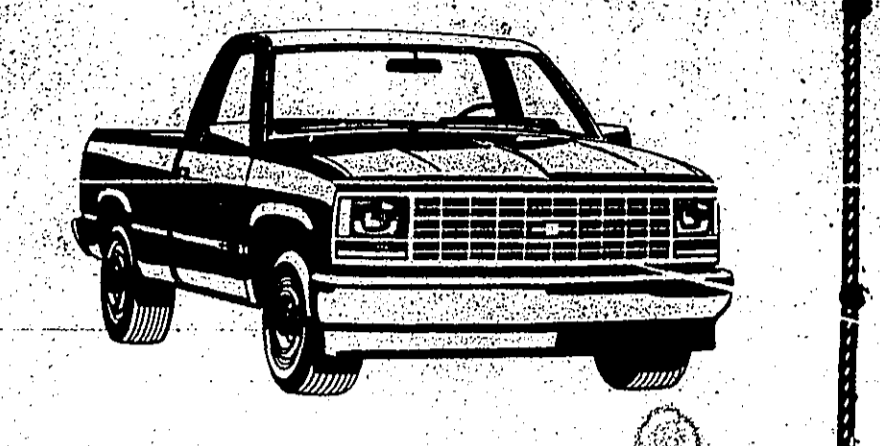
