Tax Appraisal Board Hears Requests From Tax 'Watchdog' Group

The Tyler County Tax Appraisal Board met in regular session Tuesday and heard an appeal from Ron Davis, Vice President of the Tyler County Taxpayers Association (in organization) not satisfied with the appraisal board; "Repeal the 1989 tax roll and adopt this year's tax roll for 1989."

Davis further challenged the local appraisal district asking, "Are you going to do anything immediately to help us?"

Board member Dr. Malcolm Radford returned value on all entities, and the question, "Will you help us when the state property board comes in?"

Davis said, "Yes, we're trying to educate the people on what their rights are...we feel we've been misrepresented by the Central Appraisal District employees."

Board President Tommy Weaver, speaking

Forse told the board, "Personally I'm not on a witch hunt, but there are several individual members who want something done. With this many people there's something wrong." Forse was referring to the 300 persons currently enrolled as members of the newly formed watchdog group.

Board President Weaver told the board and the group present, "If we hold up this year's roll it would cause a lot of problems and cost a lot of money to the school districts for example."

Davis asked the board if they would "Set up a performance criteria for the tax appraisal district to operate under."

There will be a meeting of the Tyler County Taxpayers Association Thursday at the Kirby Auditorium beginning at 7 p.m. for the purpose of membership increase and consideration of petitions designed to ask formally for the complete repeal of the 1989 tax roll and the adoption of this year's tax roll for 1989. Also the group will consider how to bring a possible county election to eliminate the Central Appraisal District and combine those duties with the County Tax Assessors Office.
