

Protect Wildlife as Well As Woodpecker Sen. Phil Gramm Urges

WASHINGTON, Sept. 14 (AP)—Sen. Phil Gramm today urged the federal government to protect woodpeckers as well as the bald eagle.

The senator met with Dale Robertson, chief of the U.S. Forest Service, in Washington to urge that the Forest Service return to court with a proposal to soften the

protection of the woodpecker. The bird is listed as a threatened species under the Endangered Species Act.

Gramm says the woodpecker is being protected as a symbol of the forest, but it is also a pest to many farmers and ranchers. He says the government should recognize the impact it has on the people of East Texas.

Multiple lawsuits and administrative appeals have made protecting

the bird a costly and time-consuming process. He says the government should consider a more flexible approach to protecting the bird.

Gramm says the woodpecker is being protected as a symbol of the forest, but it is also a pest to many farmers and ranchers. He says the government should recognize the impact it has on the people of East Texas.

Expect 'Bigger' Fair

We are expecting a bigger and better fair than ever," said Tyler County Fair Home Economics Chairman, Vicki Thompson, discussing the 1988 fair recently.

This is the second year Thompson has been General Chairman for the traditionally "women's events" of the fair.

The Fair Home Economics committee began meeting in April to plan the fair and work on rules to avoid some of the problems which were encountered last year, according to Thompson.

Several new events have been added this year. In addition to the youth food show, there will be an adult baking show this year. Adults will be able to enter cakes, breads, and pies. These will not be in the auction however they will be for sale on Friday afternoon. Elizabeth Powers is chairman for the Adult Baking event. Gail Stevenson is the chairman for the Youth Food show this year. Mae Hodges is the Canning chairman. Elaine Glow is Handwork chairman. Jeanne Weeks is Art Show chairman and Woody Woodrome is chairman of the Photography contest.

Thompson said the fair activities will begin on Wednesday, September 28 with the check in of elementary poster art and horticulture art. Handwork will also be checked in on Wednesday afternoon. The elementary art will be judged on the 28th, the handwork will be judged the morning of the 29th.

Marilyn McCabe is chairman of the poster art contest and Judith Haney is in charge of the horticulture art.

The Horticulture art was a new contest last year. The posters will again be displayed under the livestock pavillion.

Canning entries will be brought in on Thursday afternoon and judged on Friday morning at 9:00 a.m. Each person will be limited to only five entries this year. One entry in each category of the canning event.

Adult baking entries will be brought in on Friday morning until 10:00 a.m. when the judging begins. The adult baking entries must be left on display until 8 p.m. on Friday, but must be removed before the building closes to make room for the youth food show on Saturday.

Youth food show items will be brought in before 9:00 a.m. on Saturday October 1. Judging of the breads will begin at 9:00 a.m. Cake judging begins at 10:00 and the cookie judging will begin at 11:00. County agents or home economics teachers will be the judges for the food show.

"To be sure everything is fair, no names are to be on any items entered", Thompson said. "Numbers will be given to each contestant. The names will be attached after the products are judged".

"We hope every baker in the county will enter the fair this year".

timber be lost, Gramm said.

The ruling covers roughly 40 percent of the harvestable timber in Texas.

In an earlier letter to Agriculture Secretary Richard Lyng, Gramm said that "Congress has mandated that 25 percent of the timber from the sale of timber on federal land be returned to the counties where the timber was harvested."

In 1987, 12 Texas counties received a total of \$3,333,332 in timber revenue sharing.

Gramm said the Forest Service "has established a program to share timber revenue with counties and school districts will be cut by half or more by the end of the fiscal year."

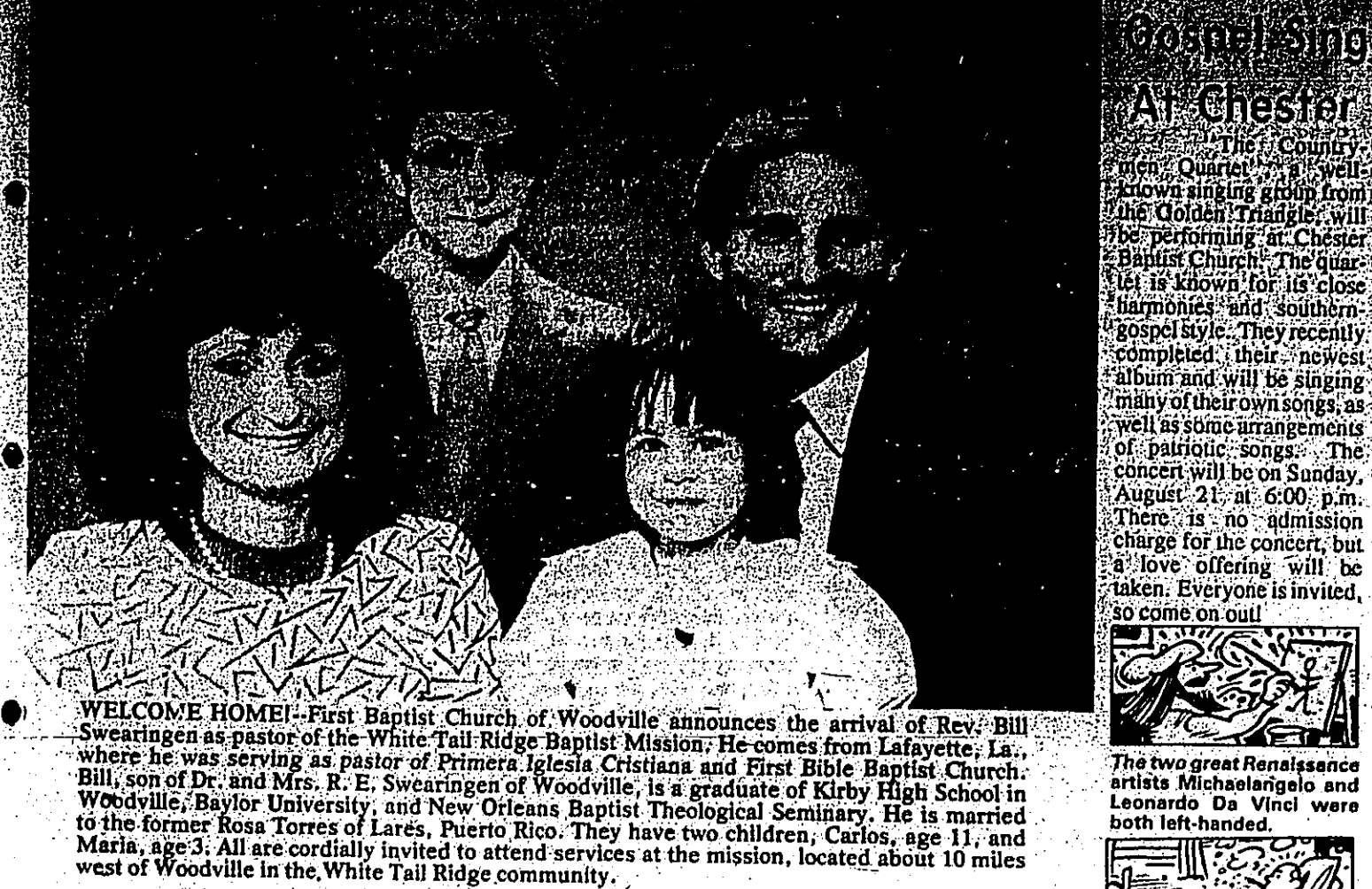

Dear Editor, Last week we had a series of strychnine poisonings in our neighborhood. Strychnine 5mg. is a lethal dose for adult humans. Symptoms are apprehension, stiffness of muscles, twitching of face and arms, sudden tetanic convulsions of entire body, cyanosis of face and lips, pulse slow and strong; death in 1-3 hours, body death in hyperextensions.

Sugar (my dog) was discovered with the above symptoms. We rushed her to the veterinary clinic, where she was given anti-dote and monitored for 36 hours. Our vet bill was \$77.00 which we gladly paid because she lived our daughter, wasn't so fortunate. Her dog was found dead the next morning with no hope of being rushed to the vet.

You invest money in raising a good dog; and spend time training them to care for your land and you pet them and love them and they become part of your family and in a few short hours someone snuffs out their life. You place them in the ground throw dirt over them and never see them again.

Many of our dogs and cats have died so cruelly. I am just thankful it was not a child. As a main pointed out this A.M. it could have been someone's child. Our child and grandchild see this animal, they loved and cared for suffering a cruel and violent death.

Just knowing your pet has died is very disturbing but to see the animal suffering with violent tremors causes the children to suffer emotionally and mentally never forgetting the morbid sight they've seen.

We've talked to the D.A. who said strychnine is highly illegal and the person doing the poisoning can be prosecuted, fined and serve a jail term. We don't want to see this happen to anyone we just want the poisoning to stop.

Concerned owners of dogs in Denton, D.A. kept the crowd entertained all afternoon with a lot of good foot-stomping music. They helped the crowd endure the mid 90 temperatures being experienced with their domed time and talent.

As the host team, we would like to apologize to the public for running out of food and would like to assure them we will be better prepared for next year. This was the first one, of what we hope to be an annual event, and could not anticipate how good people of Tyler County would respond to the invitation; extended through the press.

A special word of appreciation is also extended to the Reverend Bill Swearingen who started the day off with an early morning prayer of thanks for our county volunteer firemen. Rev. Swearingen is the pastor of the WTR Baptist Church.

Dove Season Set

AUSTIN -- The Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission Thursday (July 21) adopted 1988-89 dove hunting season dates and bag limits that are almost identical to the previous year's regulations. A proposal by the department staff to increase the mourning dove bag limit during the special white-winged dove hunting season was rejected by the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service.

The commission adopted the following season dates for mourning doves: North Zone, Sept. 1-Nov. 9; Central Zone, Sept. 1-Oct. 30, and Jan. 7-16; South Zone, Sept. 20-Nov. 18 (Nov. 14 in the Special White-winged Dove Area), and Jan. 7-16.

The mourning dove bag limit is 12 white-winged and white-tipped (white-front) doves in the aggregate, to include not more than two white-wings and two white-tipped. The possession limit is twice the daily bag limit. Shooting hours for mourning doves are one-half before sunrise to sunset.

The white-winged dove season is Sept. 3-4 and 10-11 in the Special White-winged Dove Area along the Rio Grande. The bag limit is 10 white-winged, mourning and white-tipped (white-fronted) doves in the aggregate, to include no more than two mourning doves and two white-tipped doves; possession limit is twice the daily bag limit.

Shooting hours during the white-winged dove season are noon to sunset. White-winged hunters are reminded that the

Fish Can Smell & Taste

One of the least understood concepts in fishing is the use of fish scents and attractants. Some attractants have a strong scientific basis, whereas others claim to be magic potions.

According to Dr. Keith Jones, fisheries scientist at Berkeley, "Most fish have excellent senses of smell and taste. When fish feed, favorable odors provide a strong stimulus. Fish attractants, by appealing to the fish's senses of smell and taste, provide an added incentive for fish to take a bait."

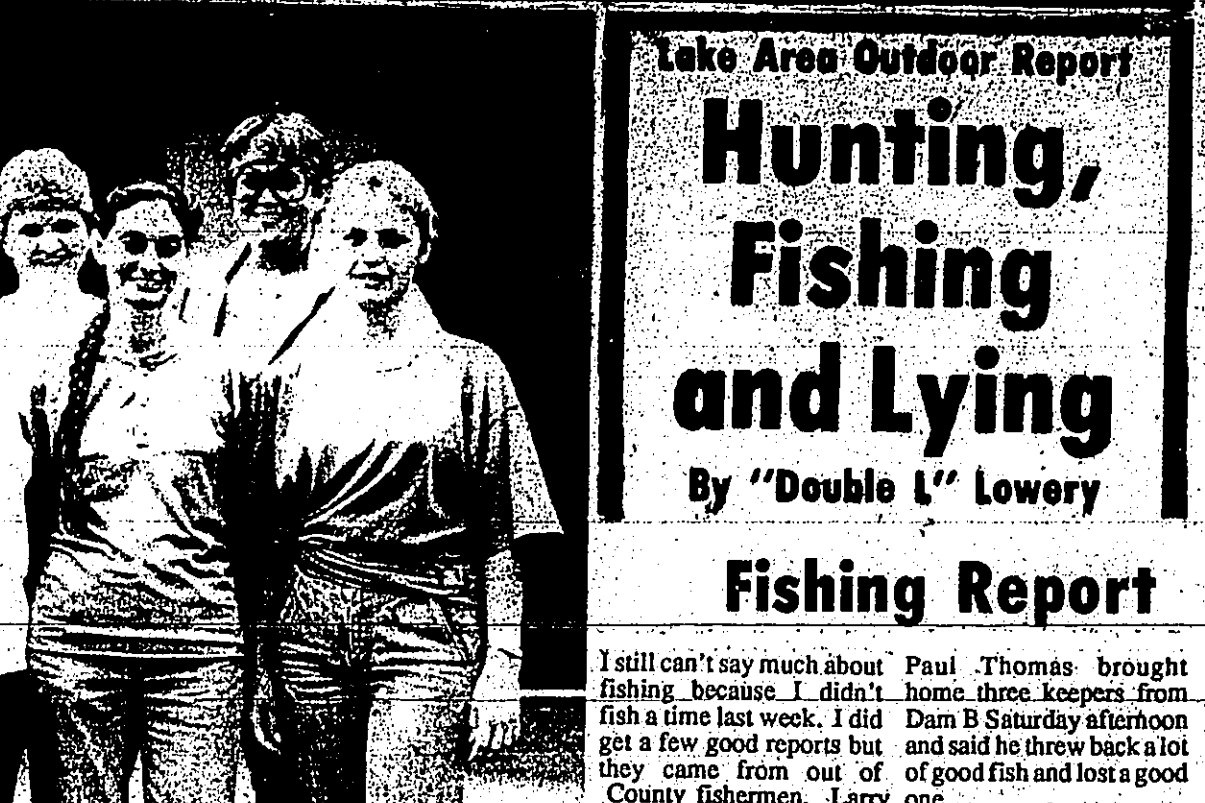
Dr. Jones continued, "Foreign odors can easily contaminate a bait. These may be transferred from tackle boxes or from the angler's hands to the bait. Fish attractants mask most contaminating odors so that fish can't smell them."

Attractants can substantially increase the fisherman's chance to catch fish. This is particularly true in slow presentations, such as jigging or worming techniques.

It is also true in most cold water situations, when fish metabolism is slowed. Fishermen who are conscious of a fish's ability to smell will put more fish on the stringer. Of course, you must first find the fish. And, as yet, science hasn't found a guaranteed way to do this.
