Holderman Cited For Marketing Curriculum

At the 51st Annual Professional Improvement Conference for Marketing Educators of Texas, Eleanor Holderman of the Woodville Independent School District was formally recognized for contributions to the development of a new marketing curriculum adopted for state-wide use. As an elected member of the Marketing Education Curriculum Advisory Task Force, Holderman was one of six Texas teachers selected by Texas Education Agency to serve as project advisors to Curriculum Specialists of the University of Texas at Austin, Extension and Instructional Materials Center. The curriculum guides for three marketing courses offered in Texas high schools were developed by UT-EMC under a contract with the Texas Education Agency and have been distributed to all Texas schools offering marketing courses. Holderman served as a session leader during the professional improvement conference to present the new guides and provide hands-on training in their use. Holderman has taught Marketing Education in Woodville High School for seven years. She has also served for two years on the Texas Education Agency Chapter 75 Essential Elements Curriculum Review Committee.
