

Heritage Village Museum will be among the stops on this year's Fall Familiarization Tour, sponsored by the East Texas Tourism Association of Longview.

On the bus, due to arrive at The Village this Saturday, September 17, approximately 50 people in one way or another to tourism, including Tour Director

The collection includes six dolls in authentically researched dress, carrying out varied pioneer activities. There is Pioneer Pauline, carrying fire-

wood; Pioneer Priscilla, sewing; Pioneer Penelope, sweeping; Pioneer Pansy, picking flowers; Pioneer Polly with her egg basket; and Pioneer Prudence, reading the Bible.

Mrs. Walls and her husband moved to Woodville from Houston six years ago, after seeing a segment on the area on the Eyes of Texas. Once they looked over the area in person, they fell in love with it and


These are the guidelines being used in the judging of the photo booth exhibit released this week.

## Immunization Clinic Continues

The Texas Department of Health Public Health Region 7 Office announced plans today for the continuation of a series of monthly immunization clinics for all children needing immunizations. The clinic will be held at 717 W. Main, Tyler, 75701.

The next clinic will be held September 20, 1988, from 10:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. The future clinics will be held on the first and third Thursday of each month. The day before each clinic, the Immunization Department

and school age children beginning at two (2) months of age, immunizations to be offered include Measles/Mumps/Rubella (MMR), Oral Polio (OPV), Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis (DTP), The Hibemophilus Influenzae type b (Hib) vaccine, and also available to medically eligible children between the ages of 24 months and 60 months. All children must be registered with the county health department to bring them to the clinic.


