



Here's food for thought. The  
lunch your child eats at school

provide 7/8 of a child's energy

During NSW, schools across

their children why these foods  
are good for them.

A deli turkey sandwich on  
a whole wheat bun and leafy,  
green lettuce is the main entree

wedges, calico fruit salad, an  
autumn spice square and milk.

Another menu features a  
baked potato with homegrown  
chili, broccoli and carrot sticks,  
a whole wheat cinnamon roll  
with raisins, chilled apple sauce  
and milk.


Pizza and a garden salad,
