**Commissioners Accept  
Prison Road Cost Burden**

Tyler County Commissioners, following the lead of the City of Woodville and the Tyler County Chamber of Commerce, on Monday agreed to accept one-half of the cost of building a 4,000-foot road to the new Woodville Prison, an off Highway 190 East at a cost of approximately \$170,000. According to the State Highway Department, the Highway Commission will agree to one-half of the cost. Wheat recommended to the court that they firmly commit to the \$170,000 portion, paying for it in two installments, one half in January 1989 and one half in January 1990. Wheat said it is obvious to everyone that we've got to have the road to have the prison built. The Highway Department Engineer told him he feels the commission will be responsive to the staff recommendation. Commissioner Carroll Conner indicated they go ahead, vote with Commissioner Willis Graham, and the vote was unanimous.

## A LITTLE LIGHT PLEASE

"What are those little white things?" the little girl asked. She looked up at me with large blue eyes. Her soft blond hair hung straight around her head except for the tiny barrette that pulled a wisp of hair across the brow of her small face. As she waited for an answer, I could see that she really wanted to know. She was curious about the crispy white wafers that only the older children could eat.

"The little white things are the 'bread' of the body of Jesus Christ," I told her. I explained further that she would be able to understand more about this small piece of "bread" when she was bigger. As the child accepted this bewildering answer, she continued to watch the priest as he gave the "bread" to each person in front of him. I continued to observe the inquisitive child.

Children are willing to accept beyond their understanding. They automatically have the faith that understanding will come with adulthood. But children have another quality that enables them to learn. They have "open ears". Nothing can be said, or done, in the presence of a healthy child that will not be heard, absorbed, and stored away.

However, a curious phenomena appears to occur with maturity. As the intellect increases in knowledge, the mature adult begins to feel not only educated, but, in authority. Questions of life begin to be asked with an air of demand. What was once a maternal wish, in life, becomes expected regardless of personal industry. And, when life tends to become too difficult, the questions become accusations aimed toward God.

Sometimes, through the process of learning, individuals become better speakers, but poorer listeners. It becomes apparent that the mouth and ears do not work very well when they are used at the same time. Jesus expects the mature Christian to know the sound of his voice. If we are constantly talking, asking, petitioning, and demanding our way through life, then our ears will not be able to receive any answers.

We are also blessed by our Lord, "to be still". When we are "still", our ears are listening. It is in these moments that we can receive the answers to our questions. Only then, will we be able to really understand the true "bread of life". The answer comes from a still, small voice that calls only to "open ears".

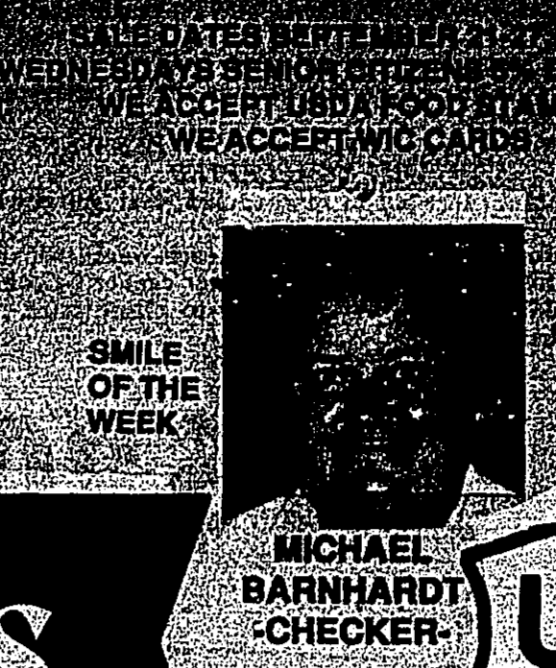



**NEWS OF SCHOOLS**

Here's food for thought. The lunch your child eats at school is more than food for the stomach—it's also food for the mind. Research shows that children perform far better when they are well-fed than when they are hungry.

President Ronald Reagan has declared October 9-15 National School Lunch Week (NSLW) in honor of the 24 million students who eat school lunches and the food service professionals who provide wholesome, balanced meals for them.

With the help of these professionals, children learn the value of eating a variety of foods and selecting those low in fat, sodium and sugar. School meals provide 1/3 of a child's energy requirements for an average day.

During NSLW, schools across the country will serve the same menu for 3 meals. Parents can take an active role by providing similar meals at home after NSLW and by discussing with their children why these foods are good for them.

A deli turkey sandwich on a whole wheat bun and leafy green lettuce is the main entree on one menu; served with potato wedges, calico fruit salad, an autumn spice square and milk.

Another menu features a baked potato with homegrown chili, broccoli and carrot sticks, a whole wheat cinnamon roll with raisins, chilled apple sauce and milk.

Pizza and a garden salad, chilled peaches, a corn-meal cookie and milk round out the third menu.

These three official menus for NSLW were developed and approved by the American School Food Service Association's Nutrition Standards/Nutrition Content Guidelines, and were planned to please students as well as meet the dietary guidelines.

According to Connie Stefkovich, Chairman of the Committee, "The celebration allows students to feel something special is being done for them and gives school a chance to have a summer experience across the country."

NSLW is in its 28th year. The 1988 theme is "School Lunch: Take Heed of Health."
