'The Debate Over Our Forests Use'

(EDITOR'S NOTE: The U.S. House of Representatives voted Monday in favor of legislation to add 14,000 acres to The Big Thicket National Preserve. The following is a view from the sponsoring legislator Charles Wilson (D, Lufkin on the merits of the bill.)

Over the last few months a great deal of confusion has arisen in our district because of various challenges to current use of national forests and proposals for added preservation. Since management of national forest land will be an issue for various reasons over the next decade at least, it is important that everyone gain as much of an understanding of the issues involved as possible.

In the 1930's the Forest Service started with a mostly treeless area in East Texas comprising about 635,000 acres. These forests belong to everyone. Since they were authorized over 30 years ago, they have been restored and cultivated to serve two equally important functions: first, a timber base, primarily for the small sawmills which do not own their own timber lands. Second, a source of outdoor recreation for the entire region. This includes hunting, camping, boating, nature walks, swimming, and horse and motorcycle trails.

In 1984, we set aside 35,000 acres of this National Forest for wilderness. Wilderness land must be left with no roads, no timber harvesting and no protection from natural elements, but with hiking, camping, hunting and nature walks encouraged. This year the House has passed a bill to increase that wilderness by about 700 acres, primarily to make the boundaries more logical and contiguous.

The addition of the original wilderness was a very controversial issue, although not completely. The addition of the 700 acres has become controversial because of the addition of

debate over national forest management. Various environmental groups indicate they strongly object to the clear cutting of the national forest. Clear cutting is the process whereby all of the trees are harvested in a certain area. The undergrowth is destroyed and the land is replanted with rows of pine seedlings. The environmentalists believe that this harvesting method causes serious damage.

First of all, they point out that we lose much of the beauty of the natural forest. And the arguments about wildlife, health of the soil, etc. are endless. The Forest Service and the timber companies clear cut because of efficiency—they believe that trees grow faster with clear cutting, producing more "board feet" per acre.

Therefore, we have a serious conflict. At the present, harvests have been halted in some areas of East Texas' national forests because Justice Parker, a federal judge for the Eastern district of Texas, has ruled that clear cutting in these areas is dangerous to the existence of the red cockaded woodpecker, under the provisions set forth by the Endangered Species Act passed by Congress in 1973. This caused the suspension of several timber contracts.

The contracts affected would result in about half of the areas involved being clear cut. The judge said there must be selective harvesting. Therefore, the contracts must be renegotiated or cancelled. The Forest Service is seeking a clarification of the judge's preliminary ruling. Depend-

ing on the final decision, an appeal may be necessary. At this time, we do not know which way this will go.

In my opinion, the environmentalists do not really care so much about the woodpeckers as they do about the practice of clear cutting. I personally question the clear cutting policy also, because although it serves the interest of those who harvest the timber, it also effects all who use the forest. And, according to some experts, there are methods of "selective harvesting" that are equally productive.

There is one other issue involving timber lands in our district that's stirring up active debate. Extension of corridors in the Big Thicket National Preserve, proposed by my bill H.R. 3455, which would add 6,088 acres along Village Creek, 6,120 acres along Big Sandy and 1,792 acres in the Canyonlands area.

I am not impartial on this issue, especially concerning Village Creek. This creek runs between the Lower Neches River and Turkey Creek Unit and is the most beautiful creek in all of Texas. It was left out of the Big Thicket bill originally passed in 1974 because of the political necessity of reaching a consensus. Village Creek is a beautiful, beautiful stream "unbreathed" by cypress, oak, red gum and hundreds of other species found in the river bottoms of East Texas. For those who live in the northern part of the district, it is much like the Neches River once was where it is crossed by Highway 94 between Trinity and Angelina Counties.

Martinez At AC

Consequently, I am sponsoring a bill to save these 14,000 acres, except for those sites where permanent homes are located. That bill has now been amended to provide that privately owned land used for noncommercial residential purposes may be

GSU Customers Need Industrial Users On Main System

AUSTIN, Texas — Gulf States Utilities Co. is awaiting a decision by regulators here on a proposal to allow the utility additional flexibility to keep industrial customers from leaving the GSU system to generate their own power.

"Retaining those customers will benefit all GSU customers. If the change is approved, no one will have to pay higher bills, but we could see those industries spending the money they save in ways that will protect existing jobs or create new ones," asserted Calvin Hebert, GSU's senior vice president of external affairs.

The difference between the rates now paid by qualified industrial customers and any lower rates they might pay would be borne by shareholders, he explained. Hebert said at least one Texas industrial customer has committed to staying on the GSU system

if the Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUCT) approves the proposal.

GSU is awaiting a final decision on a similar proposal before the Louisiana Public Service Commission (LPSC). The company said it will lose at least three major customers in that state if it cannot negotiate lower rates with them.

"Unlike some Eastern Seaboard utilities, GSU has plenty of electricity available to power homes and plants throughout our service area," Hebert commented. "It certainly makes more sense to use the available power, rather than lose customers who will build unneeded generating plants when they could invest the money in process expansions, creating more jobs," he continued.

GSU already has several incentive rates aimed at creating new jobs and helping retain existing

ones. For example, one rate gives a break on the electric bills of industries which create new jobs through expansions or plant openings.

Although current low natural gas prices make cogeneration an attractive option, a natural gas shortage could cause cogeneration to return to GSU and its fully-diversified power supply for electricity. The company fuel mix includes natural gas, nuclear, coal and oil.

"The proposal certainly represents a new philosophy for utilities, but GSU believes that we've got to adapt to changing power needs. With this proposal, not a single customer could invest the money in process expansions, creating more jobs," he continued. Hebert added.

Stamp Eyed To Honor DETDA Historian

San Augustine - In honor of the 300th anniversary of the blazing of the El Camino Real, organizations and historians in Texas and Louisiana are urging the U.S. Postal Service to issue a commemorative stamp in honor of this event.

"Raymond Goggan, chairman of the Historical Committee of DETDA, said."

DETDA with representatives in nine counties in East Texas has joined with the Cherokee County Historical Commission and other historic groups urging the Postal Service to issue the commemorative stamp. The request is being directed to the Citizen's Stamp Advisory Committee in Washington.

"According to Goggan, Senator Phil Gramm and Congressman Jim Chapman have been notified that the Advisory Committee has denied this request."

Both Senator Gramm and Congressman Chapman have urged Citizen's Stamp Advisory Committee to reconsider this proposal, Goggan said.

We are urging interested groups along El Camino Real to draw up petitions for individual signatures in support of this commemorative stamp.

"If all counties joined in with a petition from individual signatures, there is no doubt in my mind, Texas would receive this special recognition of the 300th anniversary of the El Camino Real, gateway to Texas prior to 1800," Goggan said.

A hummingbird is such a tiny thing. If you didn't watch closely, you might never see one. They fly from one flower to another like a large bumblebee that busily gathers sweet nectar. Their flight seems without restriction as they hover in miniature helicopter motions and then take-off like a silent jet to Paris unknown.

Considering the nesting habits of these small birds, it is a wonder that they survive at all. High among the branches of a sturdy tree, they find a spot to build their small nests. The nests are soft, symmetrical circles. They are formed from hair-like roots and then lined with their own feathers. Their flight seems without restriction as they hover in miniature helicopter motions and then take-off like a silent jet to Paris unknown.

It was while I was out mowing that I discovered a hummingbird's nest resting on the ground. It was under a large pine tree and lay scarcely visible among the twigs and leaves that had been strewn about by a rigorous wind. Finding the nest was a source of delight. But, as I looked high up into the tree from where it had come, I could only think about how miraculous it was that the small nest was still intact. The little nest that had served as a "house" was clearly very fragile.

I began to think about the story in the Bible of the man that built his house upon the sand. When the wind and the water came in, it washed his house completely away. Obviously, the hummingbird that had built the nest thought that it was safe in the tall, sturdy tree. This made me wonder about the strength of my own "house of faith." If a strong "wind" of life came along, would my faith stand the storm?

In the Bible story, we are told that we should build our "house" of faith on solid rock. Looking at that small house of a nest, I thought about the song that says, "Let Jesus come into my heart." Perhaps that is what the Bible story was all about too. Instead of building our house of faith in the lofty perches of the mind, it should be firmly secured with the knowledge of Jesus in the soft recesses of the human heart. Only then, will we be able to feel secure in the building of our own "house of faith." Yes, that is what the story is all about. I thought, as I carried away the little nest that once served as a house.

acquired for the Preserve only with the consent of the owner, unless the Secretary of the Interior determines that the property is being developed in a way that is damaging to the natural scenic, historic, or cultural qualities, or any other values for which the Preserve was established.

Of course the companies and individuals will be fairly compensated for their lands. And there will be federal payments to the counties for loss of tax revenues.

So here we have it. Three separate issues all concerning forest lands:

1. The bill to extend and adjust the boundaries of the East Texas forest wilderness area, with an addition of 700 acres.
2. The woodpecker issue, which is in the federal courts - not an environmental issue - and has halted clear cutting on approximately 200,000 acres.
3. The addition of land along Village Creek, Big Sandy and the Caddo lands to the Big Thicket, which involves 14,000 acres to be added to the preserve of 36,000 acres, making the Big Thicket a total of 100,000 acres.

I hope this gives everyone a better understanding of these three issues. If it does not, please write to me and we will do our best to explain it better. Also, I would be delighted to hear from any interested constituent on the merits of your opinion on the clear cutting issue in general.
