Over the next two years, he convinced me to use my credit cards and money to help people who needed their rent paid, tires for their cars, etc., and told me that I was doing it for the church. He always told me to use my credit cards as he did not want his children to know that he was

doing anything for these people. Onetime my SSI check did not come in and he loaned me money to pay my rent. I did not ask for the money, but I told him he would get it back. 1. The existence of a written of implied contract obligating your neighbor to reimburse you for payments made to third parties at your neighbor's

2. The doctrine of promissory estoppel may apply if you made the payments relying of your neighbor's promise to repay. Promissory Estoppel requires the existence of a promise designed to influence and encourage the promisee's conduct. All of your possible remedies require the existence of a promise by your. neighbor to repay you. The facts are unclear as to whether such a promise? existed. Your belief that there was such a promise is, in itself, insufficient to support your claim for recovery under either breach of contract or the doctrine of promissory estoppel.

Q. My husband and I had our wills made in California just months prior to moving to Texas. Could you tell me if this will is valid in the state of Texas? Should we have a Texas attorney examine the will?

A. Without examining the wills prepared in California, it would be impossible to tell whether or not they are valid under Texas law. Normally, a will must meet all the requirements of Texas law to be valid in Texas and dispose of your property according to your wishes. Accordingly, it would be highly advisable to have a Texas attorney review the wills.

A. The law you are referring to is the Uniform Services Former Spouses Protection Act. Under the Act, divorce courts are permitted to treat military retirement benefits (but not disability retirement pay) undot state law. O. My daughter has Lupus. She is 21, married, and has a 3 year old child. She was diagnosed with Lupus in July 1981, She married in October 1981. Her husband has always known of her illness; however, he wants a divorce because he cannot handle the disease. He called to say he had taken her off his medical insurance. Can he do this? What can she do? It was the only insurance she had. She is living letc. with us when she's not in the hospital.

A. Under Texas law, there is little a wife can do to compel her husband to maintain medical insurance coverage on her, however, the wife is not without recourse in having her husband provide for her medical needs. Under Texas Family Code Section 4.02, each spouse has a duty to support the other spouse. and a spouse who fails to discharge the duty of support is liable to any person who provides necessaries, such as medical care, to the other spouse.

If the husband has already petitioned for divorce, the wife may move the court for an order requiring the husband to support her under Section 3.58(c)(2) of the Texas Family Code. Support would include medical expenses. In negotiating any type of property settlement with the husband, the wife should keep her medical condition in mind. Should no favorable agreement be reached, the wife should be certain the court is aware that she has Lupus since her physical condition and future medical needs are. relevant considerations when the court divides community property.

A. Although divorce proceedings are pending, your son is free to change his will in any manner he desires. Of course, the will can only control the disposition of his separate property and his half of community property. Note that part of the house may be community if community funds were used to make mortgage payments, improvements,

Your son may wish to negotiate an agreement with his wife so she could remain in the home until her daughter finishes school. If your son is willing to do this, all the terms of the occupancy should be set forth in the agreement. This should include who is responsible for the care of the house and lawn. This agreement may even be incorporated into the divorce decree so that it is enforceable along with the other terms of the divorce.

Q. How, where, and when does the executor of an estate register the will?

A. An application for probate of a will should be filed with the County Clerk of the county in which the deceased resided. Absent exceptional circumstances. wills must be admitted to probate within four years from the death of the testator.
