W.I.S.D. Board Votes 3-2 To Remove Masonic Plaque

The Warren Independent School District Board of Trustees met Tuesday, October 25, 1988, and adopted a 1988 tax rate of \$1.38.53. The rate was adopted unanimously.

The Board authorized the October payment of \$77,112.00 to Timberline Constructors, Inc., for the new Warren Elementary School. The school is now ready to be inspected and accepted by the District.

Controversy spilled over from the preceding meeting concerning the Masonic stone which was placed in the new building. The Board voted first to reverse their decision made at the previous meeting to remove the stone. The vote was 3-1-1 with Board President Walter McAlpin and Board Members Ben Read and Kenneth Gregory voting to leave the stone in. Board Member Ronnie Stephens voted to remove the stone and Board Member Walter McPherson abstained. Before the open meeting was adjourned, Board President McAlpin, who is a Mason, changed his vote this ending the meeting with a tie vote. Following Executive Session, another vote was taken and

McPherson voted with Stephens and McAlpin making the vote 3-2 to remove the stone.

Curriculum Director Dixie Weeks reported that the Scottish Rite Model Program for dyslexic chil-

dren was working very well in the District. She also announced that the District now has Honors Courses in Grades 6-12. This is the first year for the Honors Program at Warren Junior High School.

Absentee Vote

Absentee balloting for the Nov. 8 General Election is at an all-time high according to County Clerk Donece Gregory who reported late Tuesday a personal appearance total of over 1,130 votes cast so far.

Gregory said 350 ballots-by-mail were mailed out and some 200 have already been mailed in to her office. She said her of-

fice would be able to accept mail ballots as late as Nov. 8 Election Day.

Last day to vote by personal appearance, the County Clerk said, is Friday Nov. 4.

Gregory told THE BOOSTER that in November 1984 the total absentee vote was 1,109. She said she expects approximately 1,500 this election.

Editorial The Night The Crowd Came To The Meeting

The crowd overflowed and the meeting had to be moved from the Board Room to the Warren High School cafeteria. In the eleven years I have been going to Warren School Board Meetings, this was the first time for this to happen. The cafeteria was filled with people... you would assume that something very important was happening. As it turned out, the reason for the crowd was the Masonic stone (I would call it a plaque) in the new Warren Elementary School. It seemed that the stone was offensive to some people and they wanted it removed. A few of those people were at the meeting and spoke their piece which is certainly their right. And the Masons were there in force, not just from Warren, but from the

surrounding community and that is also their right. The sad thing is that an inanimate object which has nothing to do with students or education would draw such a crowd. Where was the crowd when reports were being given on the academic status of our children? Where was the crowd when teaching positions were being cut that affected the education of our children? Where was the crowd when seven men made decisions that affected the future of our children, our community, and ultimately our nation? And where will the crowd be next month when the stone has been removed and the Board once again turns their thoughts to the important subject of education?

In the meantime two freight trains were on the main line as they were too long to sidetrack and a flagman was sent ahead to flag down Casey's train to stop.
