GROUP PETITIONS COUNCIL

FOR HWY 69 TRAFFIC LIGHT

A request for a Hwy. 69 and Cobb Mill Road Traffic light was backed up by over 1,000 petition signatures submitted to the Woodville City Council Monday at their regular meeting. The council heard an appeal from three residents who live nearby the intersection who asked the council to "do something" to reduce the traffic hazard which they say exists at the intersection.

PRISON DEADLINE ADVANCED

With \$185,000 Contingency Grant TEMPLE FOUNDATION WILL HELP BUILD HUMAN SERVICE CENTER

Tyler County has received a \$185,000 contingency grant from the T.L.L. Temple Foundation to assist in funding construction of a new Human Service Center.

The proposed 12,500 foot facility would house the County Mental Health, Mental Retardation, Sheltered Workshop, Tyler County Aging Center and Tri-County Indigent Health Office.

ELECTION MARRED AS RACES HEAT UP FOR MARCH 8

The March 8 "Super Tuesday" Primary election is taking on a sour turn this past week as politics heated up and became angry with displays of criminal mischief and anonymous underground press attempts pointing fingers at candidates and at even other media in their coverage of the political process.

Felony Third Degree Criminal Misconduct charges were filed against Dennis Ray Barr, of 704 Dogwood, in Woodville for reportedly kicking in four plate glass windows at "The Woodsman newspaper office at 3:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Feb. 17. Editor John Yearwood indicated that Barr didn't like an editorial datelined, February 18, aimed at Tyler County Sheriff Leon Fowler.

TUBB GIVES UPDATE ON PRISON PROGRESS

Prison Construction Coordinator for the Tyler County Chamber of Commerce Industrial Committee Gil Tubb told reporters Friday that the prison construction project was "on schedule" and that activity for clearing the prison project core area and the surrounding acreage would begin this week.

THURSDAY, MARCH 31, 1988

SMOKEY STOVER DISBANDS JURY; HARDY SAYS NO LEGAL PRECEDENT

In a surprise move Monday 88th District Judge Earl "Smoky" Stover discharged the 12-man jury which was about three months into its 6 month term, giving no reason for the action while local journalists observed as it took more than two hours for the district judge to release the jurors, some of whom were apparently unscathed by the move, saying it called for a mistrial.

District Judge Stover refused to comment on the case, however, he did say he had been asked to do so by the County Criminal Court which, according to an earlier

District Attorney Pat Hardy had first filed a "Motion to Reassemble the Jury" and had, second, filed Tuesday on District Judge Stover "To disqualify or recuse himself" for discharging the 1987 Grand Jury. No reason given.

BROOKSHIRE BROTHERS DONATES \$10,000 FOR TDC UNIT HERE

Brookshire Brothers, Inc. president K.A. Brookshire, of Lufkin handed over a \$10,000 check to Tyler County Chamber of Commerce Industrial Project Chairman Gil Tubb.

Tubb is coordinating the activities in preparation of the new 1,000 man Texas Department of Corrections Prison Unit to be located here. Brookshire said, "Woodville has been good to us over the years, so we wanted to help when asked."

WARREN ACCIDENT FATAL

A five year old Warren girl was fatally struck about 3:45 p.m. by a pickup truck after getting off a school bus Friday about 5 miles south of Warren on U.S. 69. The driver of the pickup has been arraigned by Tyler County Justice of the Peace John Ed Hanks and charged with involuntary manslaughter on possession of marijuana. She was an employee of Tyler County Hospital.

STOVER: JURY INDELIBLY TAINTED

Criminal District Attorney Pat Hardy's motion to reassemble the 1987 term of the Grand Jury was denied in a "detailed order" issued on Monday April 25 by 88th District Judge Smokey Stover.

Stover cited a series of newspaper articles which the order suggests compromises the Grand Jury Foreman, Jack Ester, and the Grand Jury itself; in what Stover's order cites as follows: "The delivery of the District Attorneys challenge by the foreman of the grand jury was obviously improper and indelibly tainted and purpose and impartiality of the grand jury. Since the foreman is the official spokesman of the grand jury, the conduct in this particular instance would be reasonably construed as formal action of the entire action of the grand jury, thereby subjecting the entire grand jury process to disrepute, ridicule and loss of public confidence."

WOODVILLE TEAMS TEST RESULTS

The TEAMS Test report indicated an overall upward trend for the District. The TEAMS Test is a mastery of basic skills test and is given to Grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11 each year.

Superintendent Dorman Jackson said that he felt the scale score was the single most important factor of TEAMS Test. The scale score indicates how high you score on a passing scale of 700 to 999. The scale scores for Woodville students had increased in most areas as well as the percentage of mastery scores.

## Board Approves New School

Warren Elementary School students will start the new year in a new building. After many delays, the Warren Independent School District Board of Trustees approved the new school Tuesday, December 13, 1988.

The oldest Olympic winner was Dr. Svahn of Sweden who won the gold in the 1912 running team shooting competition at 64 years, 258 days. He won a silver medal for shooting in the 1920 Olympics.

According to Timberline Constructors, the cracked walls in the new building were due to settling of the building and not a cracked slab as was feared. Timberline assured the Board that any problems that occurred with the new school would be resolved by the time it would be under warranty. Timberline also agreed to remove the controversial decorative cornices at no cost to the District. They made it clear that they admitted fault regarding the cornices adding that the new stone was furnished by a Masonic Lodge and that the plans do not show that the stone was to be installed by the contractor. However, Timberline stated that they were willing to remove the stone in order to get the building sold and get the students in the building. The Board accepted the building with unanimous vote.

At the meeting Tuesday, December 20, 1988, the Board voted to pay Timberline final payment on the building after the students have moved into the building January 3, 1989.
