Four Charged With Area Thefts, Burglaries

Two Tyler County men were arrested recently on burglary and theft charges, stemming from a rash of incidents that have occurred since last year.

A juvenile and another man were also charged, according to Tyler County Sheriff's Department Chief Deputy Sam Bible.

Tom Redmon and Tommy Jones, both 20, were arrested January 6, and charged with theft of a boat motor, valued at \$1,700, from a residence on Holley Fork Road, and theft of a truck tire and rim from E and L Lumber

Company (items were taken in Spurger).

Other charges include burglary of a coin operated machine (coin machine) in Hillcrest; burglary of another coin operated machine in Warren; burglary of a motor vehicle (taking gas and old radiators) at a Warren school; and burglarization of a building that belonged to Henry English, located three miles south of Woodville, where approximately \$4,000 in car parts were taken.

Tracey King, who was already in jail, charged with burglarizing a habita-

tion, was charged with allegedly participating in the theft of the boat motor and the truck tire, said Bible.

The youth, was charged with burglary of the two above mentioned coin operated machines, the gas and radiators at the school in Warren, and the building belonging to English. After being arrested he was turned over to a juvenile probation officer, Bible said.

Redmon, Jones and King have all been arraigned and had their bond set at \$2,500 each. No further information was available about the juvenile at "Booster" press time.

Keller Paint Plant Expansion Is Local Economic Boost

A new paint system at Keller Extrusion Company of Woodville could eventually bring more work for the company. Which means more jobs to this area.

It also provides a more environmentally safe method of coating alumi-

nium products, according to David Franks, paint-line supervisor at the plant.

General Manager John Crane says the new \$700,000 paint system recently installed in the plant, "Benefits Keller because it saves a lot of money in paint line pro-

duction for the company," and, at the same time, "Strengthens the employment base for the company here, while providing better working conditions."

The savings that the company gains through the new system could bring more contracts, since the

system allows for a better quality product," said Franks.

Crane said the company could expect a \$300,000 a year paint cost savings. "In other words a two-year payback," with the new system, said Crane.

He added that the more

efficient sprayer will paint "twice as much extruded aluminum as before, allowing the company, in turn, to produce more of the product which is used for building aluminum windows."

The company has only been able to paint nine

foot-lengths, but with the new system it can paint 18 foot lengths.

Crane said the old paint system incurred a 23 cent a pound paint cost. The new system will reduce that figure by 10 cents.

"Crane said, "We use

paint a year so we'll save some \$300,000."

According to Franks, the system is the only one like it being used in the U.S. He said that the system is more environmentally safe, which is also a benefit to the employees of the plant.

The plant presently employs about 500 people.

Tax Assessor/Collector, Barbara Tolson, reports the mail has been heavy since tax

statements were mailed out December 29, 30 and January 3.

This indicates collections are good, she said.

Although county tax statements were late being sent out, the early return are encouraging, she added.

If you have not yet paid your taxes, you should keep in mind that penalties are assessed after February 1.

If your taxes are several years delinquent, here is a tax table you may use to determine what is owed:

A tax of \$350 that be-

came delinquent February 1, 1987, and was not paid until September 22, 1989, would be figured like this:
