But he did.

Nixon then picked Agnew for his running mate. Forse said he decided to submit Bush's name for nomination of vice president. He discussed it with Bush, and together they decided "Let's do it."

Forse said he went down one aisle and Bush went down another trying to get someone—to nominate Bush. By the time they got to the back of the convention hall, he said, they gave it up as a bad idea.

'I told him then, 'One day you'll be president," " said Forse.
