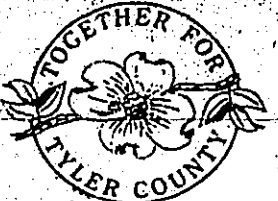

## Commissioners Hear Surprising News

Tyler County Commissioners got a surprise Monday when the regional sales manager of a company that leases stationary compactors for solid waste disposal told them that all but seven of 175 landfills in the East Texas region will soon be closed by the state.

David Eppes, with Action Container Service, a solid waste compacting and hauling company in Fairfield, told the Court during its regular meeting that Victor Cain, an environmental quality specialist with the Texas Department of Health, told him recently about the closings, that will result from new state regulations governing the operation of these sites.

Cain oversees the operation of all landfills operated by cities and counties

in public health region 7/10, which covers most of Southeast Texas. Additional remarks made by Cain concerning the possibility of Tyler County's landfills being affected are included in a related article on this page.

The Court had asked Eppes to attend the meeting following a recent trip by several commissioners

to San Jacinto County, where they watched these stationary compactors in operation.

According to Eppes, San Jacinto County has a contract with his company for lease of the compactors, and to haul the garbage to a regional landfill. The compactors are placed at each precinct in the county, where residents bring their

garbage for disposal.

At each site an electric-powered compactor crushes the waste to one-fourth its original volume, according to Eppes. The waste is also picked up by his company and hauled to the nearest regional solid waste landfill. A second container is placed at each site for the disposal of "white goods," which is

household appliances and items that cannot be compacted. The company also hauls these items to the landfill.

The compactor sites require only about a quarter of an acre, said Eppes, and

## Landfills Chances Of Continuing Operation Slim

The chances that the four landfills in this county will be in operation 18 months from now are exceptionally slim, according to an environmental quality specialist with the state.

According to Victor

Cain, only seven to 12 of the 175 small landfill sites in East Texas will remain open 18 months from now, when the state begins enforcement of new state and federal regulations governing the operation of these sites.

"I'm glad that the Tyler County commissioners are

looking at other options to their landfills," said Cain. "When these regulations take effect almost all of the smaller sites will be closed."

During a Tuesday telephone interview with Cain he said that economies will force Tyler County and other city and county officials to find other options.

Cain added that on September 1 of this year burning at these sites will no longer be permitted. Therefore, he said, these sites will fill up quickly.

## Prison Another Unit Possible

The competition is already gathering at the starting line in the race to secure a new prison unit, since the Texas House on Monday tentatively approved spending \$138.5 million for two new prisons.

But, according to Tyler County Chamber of Commerce President Don Forse, this county is already in the lead.

The House Correction Committee's developing prison plan requires a final vote, expected next week, before being sent to the Senate. The measure will require the issuance of \$138.5 million in bonds left over from the bond issue passed two years ago, to be spent on at least two more maximum security units and three minimum security units.

Jefferson County officials have already begun considering enticements such as offering the state free land to locate a prison unit on, and have picked out a tentative site adjacent to a 69-acre tract the county now owns, according to an article in Monday's "Beaumont Enterprise." According to the article, Jefferson County Commissioners have also named two commissioners as their liaison in the effort to persuade the Texas Department of Corrections to locate a prison unit in that county.

According to Raymond Fore, the area manager of the Lufkin Texas Employment Commission office, Angelina County is "Aggressively going after one of those units." He said that a lobbyist has been hired to work on securing a maximum security unit there. Fore did not say who has hired the lobbyist, but he did mention that he is a member of the Chamber of Commerce there.

But back in Tyler County, work towards securing another prison unit in addition to the Gib Lewis Unit has been in progress since Gib Lewis was secured, according to Forse. And this county is ready to compete for another unit without having to spend any more money. Forse said that this

county is ahead of most of the counties vying for the new units because when land was acquired for Gib Lewis, enough was secured to hold another 1,000 man unit.

"The water tower is big enough to supply another unit, and the sewer lines

The street value of the drugs, said Reynolds, is from \$300 to \$400.

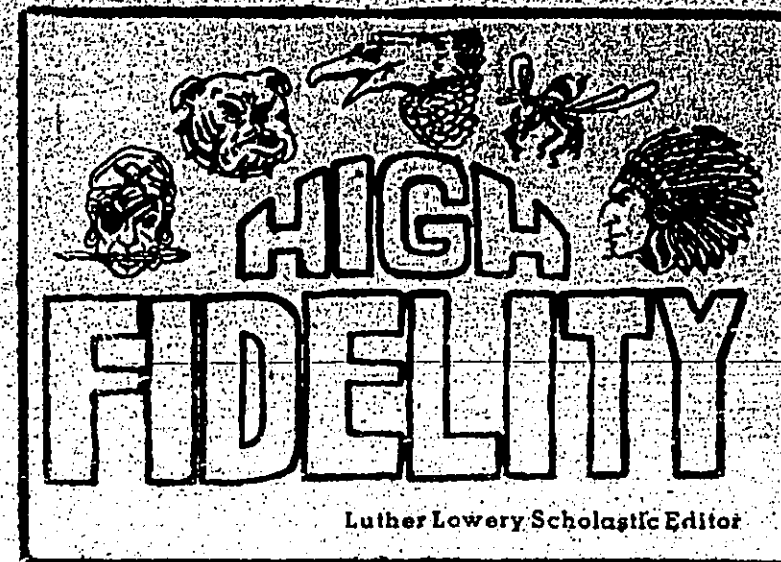

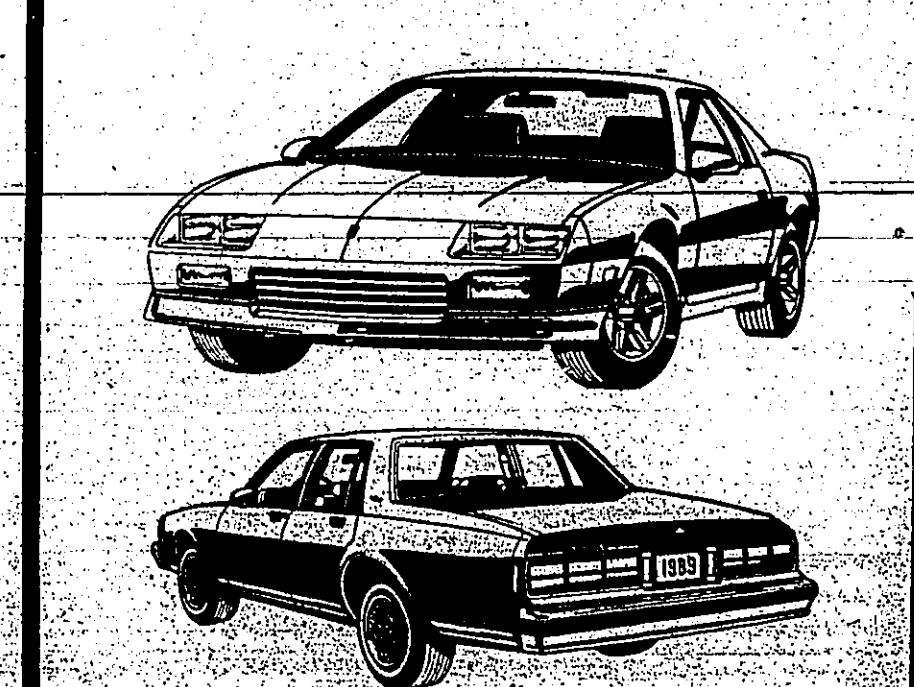
