INDIAN VILLAGE, Texas--The Alabama Coushatta Indian Reservation would like to announce the opening of their 24th Summer Season at the Tourist Complex on May 29, 1989.

The Complex which features (2) open air tour buses, one that will take you deep into the Big Thicket and show you the different types of trees, plants and wild animals. The tribes refer to this as a Nature tour or the Big Thicket Tour. Another bus tour is called the Indian Country Tour which will take you on the other side of the reservation and show you all the historical sites such as the original log cabins, hunting grounds, and also the present day homes.

Visit the Living Indian Village and watch the craftsmen as they display the arts of arrowmaking, basket weaving, and other fascinating skills of Indian Culture.

Step into the Dance Square and see the Indian dancers as they perform their cultural dances dressed in full regalia. Ride the Indian Chief Train, an exciting trip aboard an authentic train as it winds its way through the reservation, and into the Big Thicket Country. Also available are the

Inn of the Twelve Clans Restaurant, a Diorama Museum, and a Gift Shop. The Tourist Complex will be open for (7) days a week. Monday-Saturdays will be 10:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m. and Sundays 12:30 p.m.-6:00 p.m.

Lake Tombigbee, open year-round, features 137 campsites from tent camp-

ing to the largest recreational vehicle hookups. Fishing, swimming, hiking, and nature trails are all available for the outdoorsman.

A convenient store which is located on the reservation, about a 1/2 mile away from Lake Tombigbee, is open year-round and offers a variety of groceries, public tele-

phones and restrooms and a Washateria.
