Training Offered For Aging Volunteers

The Deep East Texas Area Agency on Aging will be conducting a four day training session for persons interested in becoming Housing Information Volunteers (HIVs) as part of the Consumer Housing Information Service for Seniors (CHISS) program in the Deep East Texas Region. CHISS is designed to assist older consumers to maintain or improve their housing situation and is sponsored by the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) in Washington. The idea is that more and more Americans are

remaining in their homes after retirement, some 70% as opposed to other alternatives. The purpose of CHISS is to address the problems that some of these homeowners may be facing.

CHISS was first brought into Deep East Texas in April, 1987, at which time some 25 individuals were trained to be Housing Information Volunteers. Although there are several CHISS projects throughout the country, Deep East Texas was the first rural area to take on the program. Success of

CHISS in a rural setting depends upon the willingness of the public and private entities to cooperate and work with the Lead Agency (Area Agency on Aging) and the Housing Information Volunteers (HIV).

The training will be held on four consecutive days in four locations to better access the twelve counties with in the region. Those locations are: Jasper, Center, Nacogdoches, and Livingston with the training dates being June 27-30 from 8:30 a.m. to 5

p.m. The general purpose of the training is to describe CHISS, its significance, and to familiarize the volunteers of the resources available in their areas. Troopers have responded to a total of 632 rural traffic accidents since January 1, 1989. These accidents have resulted in 14 deaths and 430 injuries. This compares to 725 accidents during the same period last year.

DPS Report: 1 Fatality, 9 Injured

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated a total of ten rural traffic accidents in Tyler County during the month of April 1989 according to Sergeant Roy D. Henry, supervisor for Highway Patrol Area 22A, which includes Bell and Tyler Counties. As a result of these accidents,

Troopers reported nine injuries and one fatality. In comparison, Tyler County experienced a total of 30 accidents, 25 injuries and two fatalities during April 1988.

This year in 1989, Tyler County Troopers have responded to a total of 124 accidents, resulting in 35 injuries and 2 traffic related deaths.

In the ten East Texas counties that comprise Highway Patrol Sub-District 22A, 14 deaths and 430 injuries. This compares to 725 accidents during the same period last year.

Chester Lions Set BBQ June 3

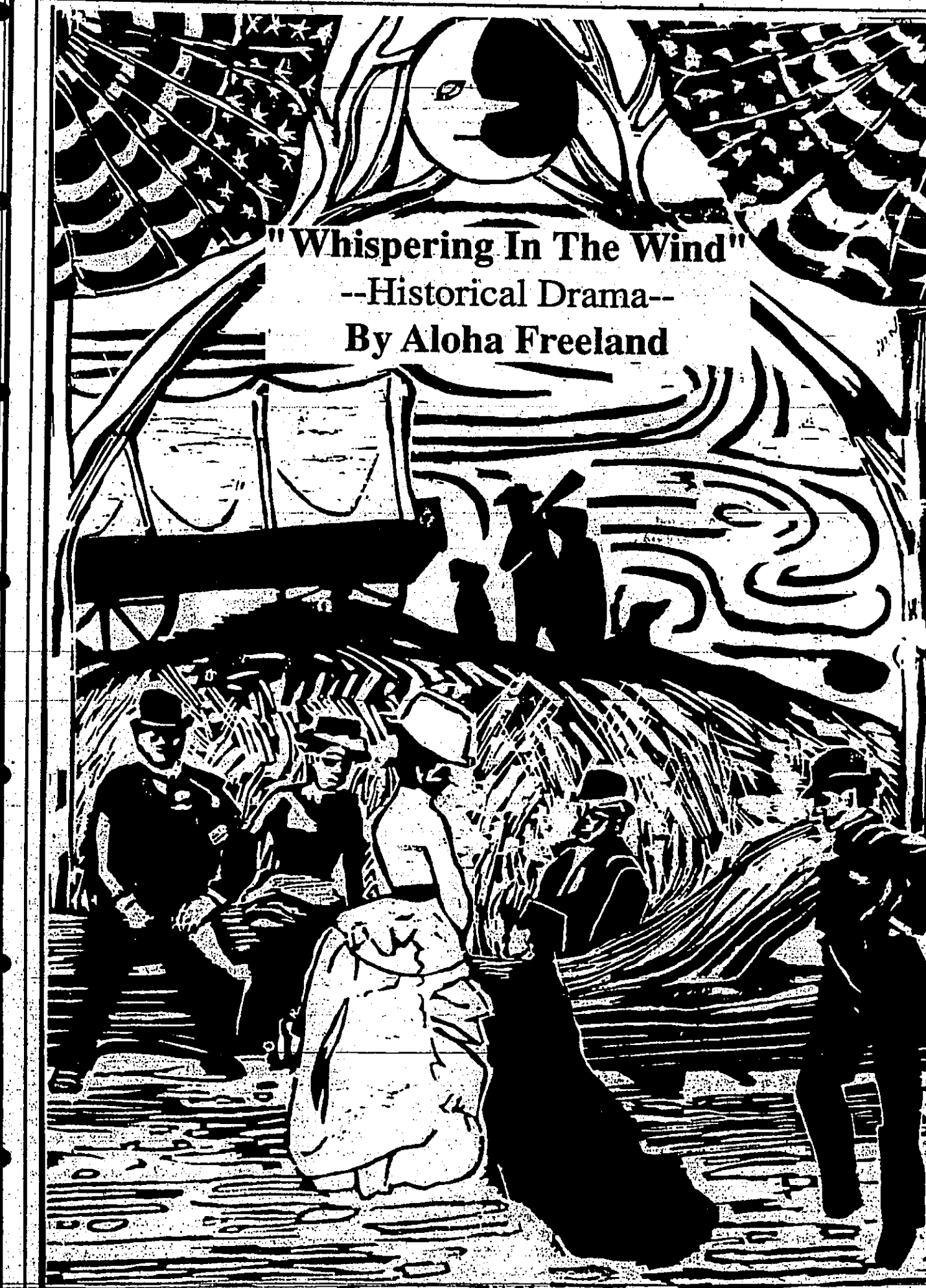

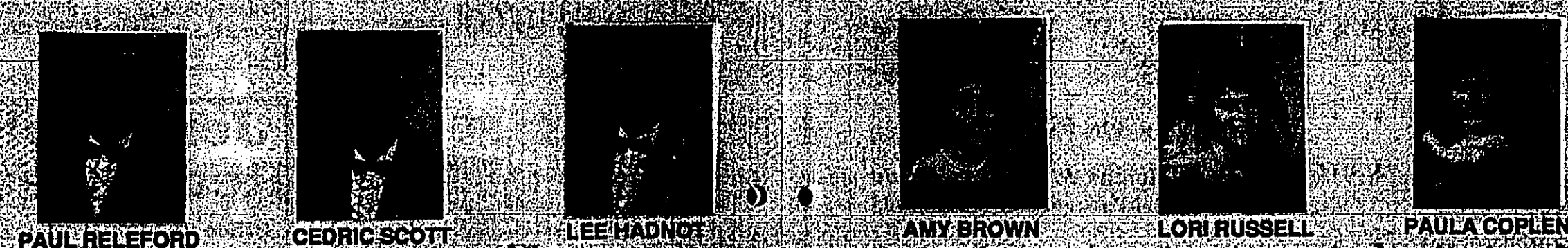
