Fisherman Finds Body In Drowning Accident

A Newton County man who was fishing in Steinhagen Lake early Tuesday spotted the body of a drowning victim reported missing since Sunday which had floated about one-half mile from where his flat bottom aluminum boat was discovered about 9:30 a.m. Sunday still in gear and idling.

According to Jasper County Sheriff's Office Chief Deputy Jack Myers, Howard L. Winkle, 46, of Spurger was pronounced dead by Justice of the Peace Clifford Woods after his body was recovered Tuesday morning. Woods cause of death ruling in the case is pending, however, is pending an autopsy ordered by the family.

According to officers the boat was discovered in the lake "tied up in some moss" in the vicinity of the inlet of Spring Creek. The location was reported to the Martin Dies State Park Ranger who subsequently reported it to the Jasper County Sheriff's office. Winkle was apparently the lone occupant of the boat which was a 14 foot flat bottom aluminum rig with a 20 H.P. Mariner Motor.

Texas State Parks and Wildlife Game Warden Jay Smith of Jasper said that E.O. Havard, of Newton who was fishing and not a part of the search group spotted the body near the backwater Slump.

added, "there's a lot of ground to cover along the banks." Sergeant said also that the search team was comprised of four game wardens, three park rangers, 10 Jasper County Rescue Squad Personnel and 10 friends and family members. Sergeant said the "survivor search" tactic changed to a "drowning search" at 3 p.m.

According to the Park ranger, "The family was camped for several days in Martin Dies Park and they would set trot lines then gather them in and head home. Winkle was with his family in the park before going fishing Sunday morning."

Funeral arrangements are pending at the Riley Funeral Home in

Woodville following the autopsy which was being performed late Tuesday in Lufkin by Dr. James Bruce.

Assisting in the missing person's search was the Jasper County Sheriff's Office, the Jasper Emergency Corps, the Texas State Parks and Wildlife Service offices in Jasper and Tyler Counties.

I applaud the courage of the Chinese people...I fear for their safety. The deaths will not be in vain because for a brief time they had a taste of freedom and they will not rest now until it is theirs. I wish them a speedy victory in this quest. I thank God I was born an American.

Bullock Praises Lawmakers For School Board Program

AUSTIN—State Comptroller Bob Bullock Friday praised Texas lawmakers for passing an innovative school bond program that will lower borrowing costs for poor school districts.

"I originated this plan and supported it all the way, and it's definitely a step in the right direction. Now it's up to the voters to approve the next step towards financial equity in our schools," Bullock said.

That step will come in

November, when Texas voters decide on a constitutional amendment to allow the state to lend financial backing to a new school bond program that was approved by the Legislature in May.

SB 951, sponsored by Sen. Bill Haley, will help bring construction funding to school districts at a significantly lower cost to taxpayers by combining local bond issues into one larger, more cost-effective state bond issue, Bullock said.

"Some of our districts don't have the property tax base that others have, and these education bonds will provide extra money to school districts that need it. At the same time, by issuing bonds on a state level rather than on a local level, administrative costs will drop," Bullock said.

Under the new law, money from the bond sales can only be spent by the school districts on certain items, such as building or renovating classrooms.

The constitutional amendment would allow the state to use the Permanent School Fund to back the state-issued education bonds, which are limited to \$750 million, Bullock said. That fund is already used to guarantee education bonds issued by local school districts.

If the amendment is approved, the state-issued bonds will have the highest ratings possible at the lowest cost, since they will be backed by the state.

Allan Shivers Library's two summer reading clubs will start registration of children, eight grade and under, on Friday, June 9. This will continue through the rest of June and all of July.

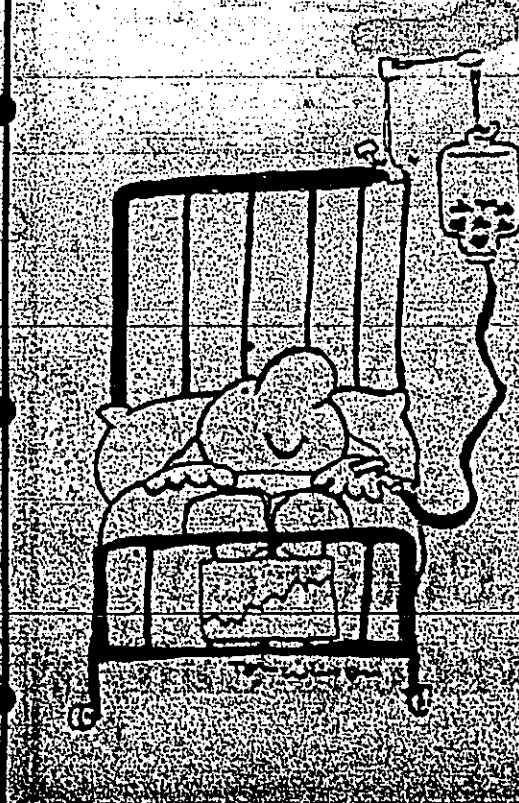
Special story hour programs will be each Tuesday from 10:30-11:15

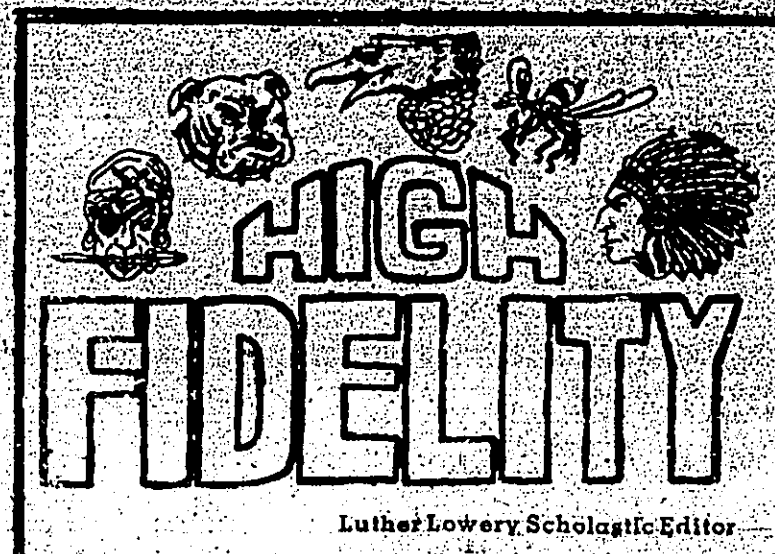
Woodville Hi Instrumentalist Earn State Recognition

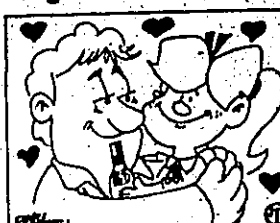

Clean Air Bill Passes Legislature

AUSTIN—An alternative fuel bill that requires use of clean-burning fuels such as compressed natural gas (CNG) in thousands of state vehicles, school buses, and mass transit coaches has been approved by the Legislature.

Sponsors of the bill, SB 740, were Rep. David Cain, D-Dallas, and Sen. Don Henderson, R-Houston, who used all of their legislative know-how and ingenuity to steer the bill through opposition in the last hours of the last night of session.

"These two legislators know what lawmakers are all about," said Land Commissioner Gary Mauro. "They pulled out all the stops to get what they wanted. The bill could have easily been changed, but they didn't let that happen. They deserve all the credit in the world for seeing that Texas is in the forefront of the move to alternative fuels."

The bill is the second piece of a two-part legislative package proposed by Mauro that will both improve air quality and give

the Texas economy a boost by encouraging the increased use of natural gas. Burning CNG cuts carbon monoxide emissions by half, emissions of nitrogen oxide by 30 percent, and hydrocarbon emissions by 40 percent. Emissions of particulates and exhaust hydrocarbons are virtually eliminated.

In addition, increased sales of natural gas will be a boon to the economy. Texas boasts 26 percent of the known natural gas reserves in the lower 48 states. Studies by Southern Methodist University and the state comptroller's office show that increased use of natural gas over a five-year period would create 50,000 to 100,000 jobs in Texas.

"It's time that we all realized that clean air is not only compatible with, but essential to a strong business climate. Using Texas natural gas sets a national example and puts us in a win-win situation," Mauro said.

The alternative fuels bill requires use of CNG or other alternative fuels in state-owned or operated fleets with more than 15 vehicles, school districts with more than 50 buses, and local transit authorities. A phased-in conversion begins in 1991 and would run through 1998.

The bill anticipates private financing for the conversions and provides for a waiver if reasonable alternatives are unavailable.

Burning CNG cuts carbon monoxide emissions by half, emissions of nitrogen oxide by 30 percent, and hydrocarbon emissions by 40 percent. Emissions of particulates and exhaust hydrocarbons are virtually eliminated.

In addition, increased sales of natural gas will be a boon to the economy. Texas boasts 26 percent of the known natural gas reserves in the lower 48 states. Studies by Southern Methodist University and the state comptroller's office show that increased use of natural gas over a five-year period would create 50,000 to 100,000 jobs in Texas.

The alternative fuels bill requires use of CNG or other alternative fuels in state-owned or operated fleets with more than 15 vehicles, school districts with more than 50 buses, and local transit authorities. A phased-in conversion begins in 1991 and would run through 1998.

The bill anticipates private financing for the conversions and provides for a waiver if reasonable alternatives are unavailable.

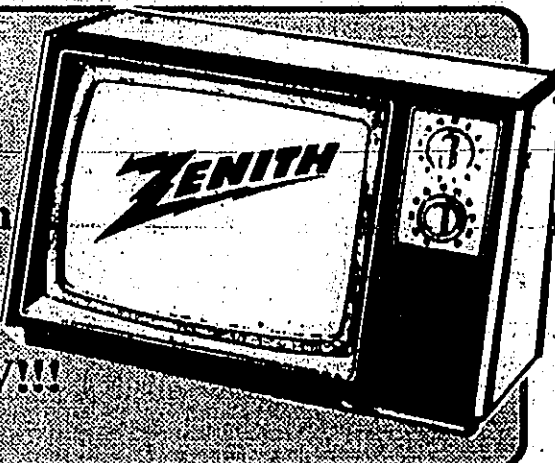

Helene Delcambre started to cry when the art teacher looked over her shoulder and said, "Helene, that's primitive."

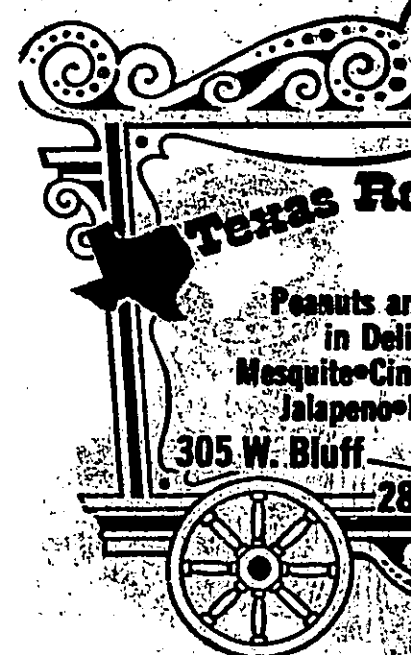

Living History Camp Out To Add Authenticity To Village Scene

Adding authenticity to the Village scene during the weekend will be Al and Rose Ann Meyer of Houston, who with their 13 year old son Lance, will replicate a pioneer family of the 1830's, camping out as they move West. They'll cook over an open fire, sleep on the ground in tents, and perform simple everyday chores of the period.

The Meyers family were first spotted last April at the San Jacinto Monument by the Tyler County Junior Historians, when they were on their way to the conference in Galveston, and they were delighted with the idea of coming to

Heritage Village.

Meyers is a Colonel in the Texas Army, a reenactment group formed about 20 years ago to replicate the actions of the original Texas Army formed in 1835. Neither a military nor a law enforcement agency, the Texas Army was formed to promote the spirit of Texas and its people, both Anglo and Mexican, who made it the free state it is today, according to Meyers. Texas is the only state in the Union which retained the right to maintain its own army, after becoming a state in 1845. The United States Government agreed to this arrangement at the time only because of the troubles being caused by the raiding Comanches in Central Texas. It was from this early army that the famed Texas Rangers were formed.

Commissioned by the Governor of Texas, Col. Meyers and his family will camp down between the Collier Store and the Mattress Factory on Friday evening before the outdoor drama begins and remain there until Sunday.

Dressed in period costume and living the life of pioneers, they will be available to talk with visitors and explain how their ancestors lived 150 years ago. They will also bring with them a cannon replica of the Twin Sisters, which will be used to start to play.

Tickets for the play and all the action is available at Heritage Village Museum. \$4.50 for adults; \$2.50 for children under 12. Because seating is limited, reservations should be made in advance by calling (409) 283-2272.

Junior Historian program is off to a running start

Once a Junior Historian, always a Junior Historian.

Proof of that statement is in the making this week as last year's award winning Tyler County Junior Historians return to Heritage Village Museum to perfect their pioneer skills, while a second class of 20 middle school youngsters get their first taste of what pioneer life was all about.

Putting the first week of summer and the historic atmosphere of Heritage Village to good use, both groups of youngsters are being taught the history of music as it came to Tyler County from other parts of the continent and beyond. Their teacher is retired High School music teacher and choir director, Woody Woodmore, who will also conduct a Singing School for adults at Hopewell Methodist Church June 12-23.

And, as music calls for dancing as well as singing, Betty and Dale Hinsley of

Woodville are instructing the young historians on the history of dance with emphasis on the various cultures that found their way to Tyler County.

Jack Whitmeyer is on hand again this year to let the newcomers in on Tyler County's fascinating pre-history, geology and archeologically speaking, and to work with both groups on their rope making. A. E. Cloud of Sour Lake is back with his muses so the newcomers can take a turn at plowing a field as their ancestors did back in the 'good old days.'

Rosa Thompson from the Alabama-Coushatta Indian Reservation is working with both groups in pottery painting, using early Indian designs, and Village Jeweler John Killam is showing them how to use silver wire to make handsome jewelry, again using designs known to the Alabama Indians before they came to Tyler County around 1800.

Both classes are learning how to make tobacco-bowls, out of horse hair, under the tutelage of Big Thicket Folklorist Bill Brew, and how to tan leather with famed Heritage County pioneer Neal Wright as their teacher. And, adding to the fun of history are Buddy Roberts of Woodville, who with his muses and wagon is teaching about transportation in pioneer days. Rosemary Tolar Asta, telling first hand tales about life in the 1866 Tolar Cabin, Village staffer Earl Rollins, who is giving the youngsters a chance to get the feel of the anvil in the Village Blacksmith Shop, and Keelin Parker, who with her husband, Tim, have a forestry consulting service in Cotterrell, Mrs. Parker is telling both classes about early days in forestry as she tours them through the Village's own Big Woods, a mini-clone of East Texas' famed Big Thicket.

Getting both groups ready for Friday and Saturday night's outdoor historical drama, Aloha Freeland is teaching them the dances they will perform with Class A doing the Virginia Reel, Class B the Cotton Eyed Joe. Both groups will be seen throughout the play as supporting players.

And, if that's not enough excitement for one week, Glen Ealy of Austin will be on hand throughout the week, taping segments to be used, first in a Pioneer Video he is producing, which will be sold at the Village Museum Store, a special video on the Junior Historians and their activities, and, lastly, a promotional video on Heritage Village Museum.

Selected as members of the second class of Tyler County Junior Historians are: from Chester, Jo Ann Sturrock; from Warren, Tina Shine; from Colmesneil, Nikki Davis and Timothy Russell; and from Woodville, Ashley Allison, Jenna Kennison, Lee Phillips, Benji Shepherd, Jennifer Smith, Eryn Borel, Erin Brochtrup, Jason Odo, Stephen Ramos, Felicia Williams, Regina Battiste, Marcus Dickerson, Micha Houston, Melissa McDaniel, Eddie Sturdivant, Jigda Patel and Jennifer Williams.

After their initial historical cram course, the new class of Junior

Historians will continue to meet throughout the summer for additional learning experiences, including field trips to places of historical interest in the area. The other groups will concentrate on honing their craft skills to enable them to demonstrate them to visitors during special programs at the Village.

Learn About Herbs At Woodville's Heritage Village

Returning to Heritage Village at 2 p.m. on June 10 will be Diane Morey Sitton, author of "Texas Gardeners Guide To Growing And Using Herbs," to present an updated talk and slide show.

Adding to the general interest of this subject will be Jeff Gullory, Director of the MHMR Horticulture Therapy Program in Jasper, who will show some of the new herbs he is developing for this area. Currently, he is propagating 27 different varieties that have never been grown in this area before, many of which he will have on hand to show and discuss during the Village program.

A native of Ville Platte, La., Gullory has been at MHMR for just eight months, but the job fits right in to what he has been trying to do with his life for the last few years. After spending 29 years working as a self-employed contractor in Port Arthur, Gullory moved to Rayburn, County, built a home that looks like it's 100 years old with cedar inside walls and started developing an old time farm which includes working with and propagating native plants that are exclusive to Texas.

It was this love of nature that made Gullory a natural fit. MHMR's three year old Psycho-social program, called "The Growing Concern," which has found gardening to be therapeutic for people with all types of problems. At present, the program has three greenhouses, an acre of pick-your-own berries and a specialty garden, in which Gullory wants to develop specialty items for sale to restaurants. He is trying to build a business, he says, in which MHMR's clients, who range from 18 to 60, can participate in a non-stressful environment.

Meanwhile, in the interest of making his plants available away from the MHMR Center, located at Beech Grove School on FM 177 in Jasper, County, Gullory has selected Heritage Village as his sales outlet in Tyler County. At present, the Village has for sale sage, oregano, chives, sweet basil, thyme and mint, and Gullory will have plenty of other plants to show and sell during the Village Program on Saturday, June 10, at 2 p.m. The public is invited. No charge, of course.

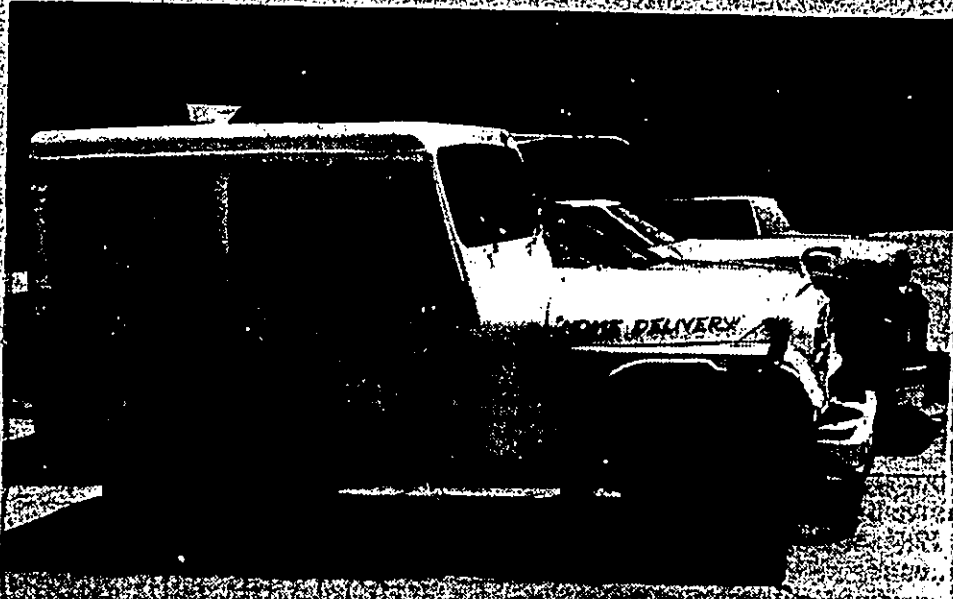

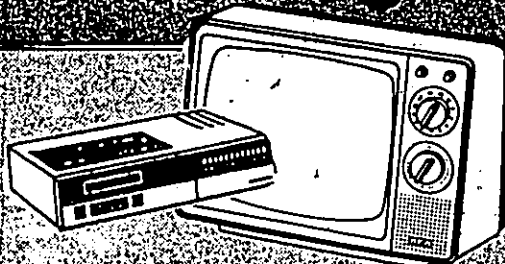
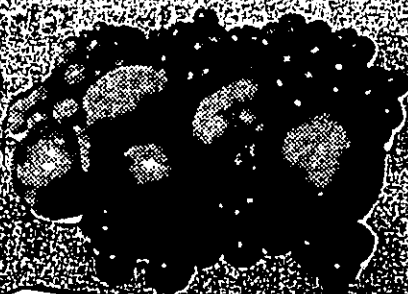
