The Hot Pepper Business 'The Rest Of The Story' ...In Stonewall

Jeff Campbell has the Stonewall Chili Pepper Company in Stonewall, Texas. "I've always liked hot food," he says from Alabama originally and was raised on cayenne and habanero. "Anytime you eat Southern dishes like turnip greens you've gotta have some hot pepper sauce to go along with it."

He grows the habanero, which is the hottest chili pepper in the world. "The Scotchfield scale, which measures capsaicin oil in chilies, that's what makes them hot, shows habanero to be 600 to 800 times hotter than jalapenos," says Jeff. "It's a small orange pepper. Down in the Caribbean they call them Scotch Bonnet or Tam O' Shanter. You turn them upside down and they look like the caps worn by men in Scotland. They're very hot."

He raises 40 different kinds of hot chilies. Jeff has had his business five years. He ships wholesale all over the US and beyond. He sells other vegetables, too, as well as Stonewall peaches. "I tried growing chilies in Colorado once, but the altitude was too high and they didn't do well. The hill country is a great place to grow chilies."

His peppers grow on a ten-acre tract of land. He has a small steel building on the East side of Stonewall. Nearby is his vegetable farm. Everything he sells is fresh produce grown right there in the hill country. "I had a man from Toronto, Canada call me the other day. He wants to supply food companies up there with the habanero. We're the only commercial grower of habanero in the United States."

He says "habanero" has to do with Havana, Cuba. But there's no sign of the hot pepper ever being found there. It's about an inch and a half long and about three-quarters of an inch across. When Spanish explorers came to the islands, they wrote in their diaries about an orange pepper "that would make a bull sweat." It was probably the habanero. "I say with you a long time," says Jeff. "That's the chili that separates the men from the boys."

A habanero makes horse radish seem mild in comparison, he says. "I warn everybody about them before they take a bite. At first they say it's not hot. But five minutes later they say it's hot, and getting hotter."

In the islands they chop them very fine and serve them with salt and lime juice as a seasoning. In the Yucatan peninsula they use just about anything to do with chilies.

He handles every size of pepper, from the chili pequenito, which is about half the size of a dime, to the Mexibel, which is a hot bell pepper. He has the New Mexico type chilies which he says grow well in Stonewall.

Paul Harvey has a main news show he identifies as "The Rest of the Story." Kind of a five minute narration on little remembered vignettes that always have a surprise ending.

Wish what we were about to relate had an ending, but Harvey would have liked it.

It all started with a call from one of the company's plant managers about some strange goings-on at the entrance to the corporate office in Dilbit.

We should say at this point that the T-Wheeler's phone is always the first one to ring when there are strange goings-on in the company.

He tells us there is a yellow Cadillac parked at the entrance right by the flag pole, the big stone monument he's standing on the other side of the driveway.

He finally tells us the monument he couldn't reach when he was trying to place the mouthwash bottle.

Plant manager says that's when he had to get back to his office.

What are we going to do about it?

We call the police dispatcher. She thinks we're lost our marbles, or it's some kind of telephone prank.

She does promise to send a police cruiser around to see what's really going on, and promises to call us if it proves necessary to call the bomb squad or something.

See, the frustrating thing is, that's where the story ends. He had four bars of soap.

Had his girlfriend told him he had had breakfast? He had a slightly bottled mouthwash.

Or did he think the monuments at the entrance were some kind of altar, and he left his gimme cap as a memento to his passing through?

What we really think happened is that he might have spent an evening or longer in the City of Dilbit's hotel with the bars of soap.

On the other hand, it's more fun just speculating. We'll just tell the plant manager we handled it with dispatch, as we always do.

From The Desk Of W.L.S.D. Supt. Dorman Jackson Thanks To Temple Foundation

From the desk of Dorman Jackson

On November 15, 1988, the T.L.S. Temple Foundation informed school districts located in 18 East Texas counties of a Computer Assistance Program. This program is designed to financially assist schools with computer aided classroom instruction and computer literacy in general. Also, the program will assist districts in complying with the computer instruction requirements mandated by the State of Texas. The Foundation, allocated \$1,500,000 for the project. Each school in the Foundation's service area is eligible to make application. Applications will be funded at a rate of 75%.

Woodville School District made application to the T.L.S. Temple Foundation for the sum of \$85,710. The grant application was approved and the district has received a \$64,300 check from the Foundation. This amount represents 75% of the total grant application. The school is obligated to match the \$64,300 with \$21,430.

Purchase orders are in the process of being placed so computer software and hardware will be available for student use during the early part of the new school year. A total of 53 IBM PC/2 computers and more than \$15,000 in computer software and furniture are being ordered.

First grade students at Wheeler Elementary will receive "Writing to Read" computer reading lab. All students will be served one hour of each day by a phonetic reading lab. The lab is a multisensory, multidimensional language center. There are five centers in the lab: 1) Computer Center, 2) The Journal Center, 3) The Listening Center, 4) The Writing/Typing/Keyboarding Center, and 5) Make a Word Center. The existing ESC computer lab now serving the elementary campus will be moved to the second grade (a description of the ESC lab is listed under the Intermediate School computer programs).

Students in the intermediate school will receive 12 IBM PC/2 computers. The old Radio Shack computers will be replaced by 20 IBM PC/2 computers. The old Radio Shack computers will be placed in individual classrooms for enrichment and/or remediation instruction.

Business education classes at the high school will receive 12 IBM PC/2 computers. In addition to the existing computers in the business department, there are two existing computer labs in the high school which included computer math and remediation.

Many words of thanks go to W.L.S.D. and the staff at T.L.S. Temple Foundation for their commitment to education and involvement in this project.



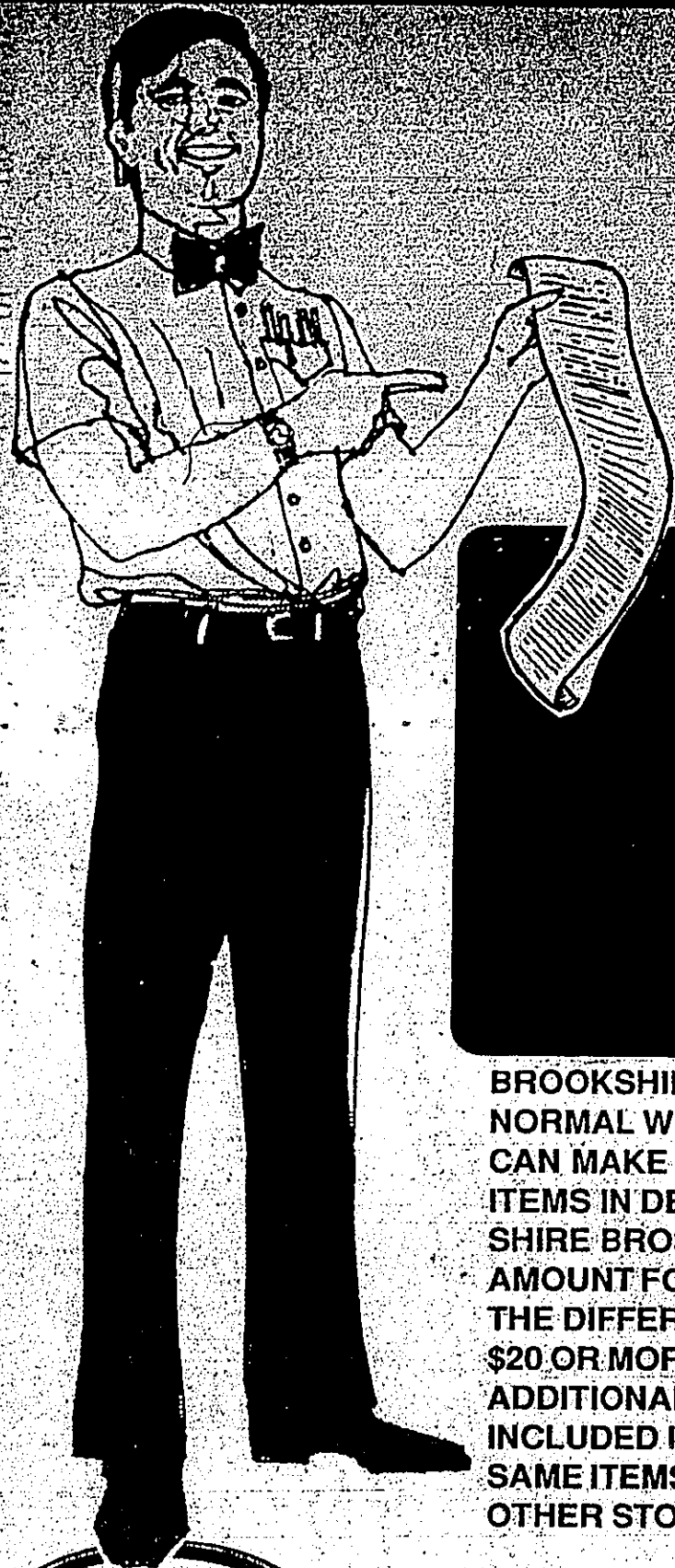
