Teacher Salaries Cut At Warren

The Warren Independent School District Board of Trustees voted unanimously in a special meeting Tuesday, July 11, 1989, to cut the teaching increment by \$660,000. The District had been paying a \$1400 increment, but will now pay only \$740. The move will save the District approximately \$48,000.

The Board spent several hours discussing budget cuts, but came to no definite conclusions. Superintendent Bettie Rae Yates had presented four different budgets for the Board's consideration in an effort to eliminate the estimated \$433,515 deficit the District is facing for 1989-90 school year. Yates favors closing the Middle School campus, moving the sixth grade to the elementary school and seventh and eighth grades to the high school. In a poll of the Board, all Board members except Kenneth Gregory voiced their opposition to closing the Middle School campus. Yates voiced the question, "Why would you go to all this trouble to cut the quality of education that you have worked for so hard to build for the sake of an old building?" The Board seemed favorable to the following cuts:

The next Board Meeting is scheduled for Thursday, July 20, 1989, 7 p.m., in the Administration Building. The Board will do another budget study at this time. Board President Ronnie Stephens said the Board would be taking another look at closing the Middle School campus.

Roxana Broadnax, a retired teacher and taxpayer in the district, addressed the Board and the community asking for cooperation between the Superintendent and the Board and between the community and the Board. According to Broadnax, "It is a difficult time to be a Board Member or a Superintendent in Texas. Our day of reckoning is here and we must all work together and make any adjustment necessary so that we can go forward together as a district." She asked that the Board look objectively at all proposals and then accept the one that is best for the district quickly so that preparations can be made for the new school year.

Flood Help Asked

The Tyler County Red Cross Co-ordinator Vicki Warfield says the flood waters may be over but the flood of people to her Red Cross Service has just started.

Warfield told "The Booster" Tuesday that the "bare necessities" are needed for numerous homeless people whose homes have been inundated by the recent floods along the Neches River.

"We are in desperate need of sheets, cookware, dishes, glasses, detergent, soap, food and most of all money," said the Volunteer long-time Red Cross co-ordinator here.

Persons are asked to call the Warfield's Store in Woodville at 409-283-2544 as a central receiving point for the above listed items. Warfield said much needed items of furniture and old appliances such as refrigerators, washing machines, are being collected at the old Woodville Independent School District "Rock Building." A cadre of 18 men with trucks are being marshalled to deliver the furniture, Warfield said, and help pull some submerged vehicles out of the Neches River mire.

The Red Cross co-ordinator said some 19 other-wise homeless families have been placed through the efforts of the Red Cross in the past two weeks.

The phones been "ringing off the wall," Warfield said and we've had a sea of people here.

Area churches have combined to assist with the materials and donations collections efforts, she said.

French Student's Dream Comes True

"A dream to go to U.S.A." is just a dream for many young people in France. For 19-year-old Veronique Deroche of Chateaubriant, France this dream became real as she stepped onto Texas soil Wednesday, July 12. Awaiting her at the Houston International Airport were Woodville Rotary Club President John Yearwood and Rotarian Dr. Larry Phillips with his wife, Carol and daughter, Karen, and son, Brian.

One year ago the first steps toward turning a dream into reality began. The Woodville Rotary Club applied with Rotary International to be a host club in the Foreign Student Exchange Program. Simultaneously, students around the world with Rotary connections were applying and being interviewed for the opportunity to participate in the program. According to Yearwood, the month-long "cultural exchange program" is "long enough to get a taste of another land and its people."

Veronique, whose father is an active Rotarian, will spend her four weeks in the homes of Don and Gayle Stevenson, Larry and Carol Phillips and Robert and Brenda Allison. Stevenson planned for her to have a fair to share in the home and to have a good time. Stevenson said he was very happy to have Veronique in his home and to have her experience the American way of life.

As a baseball game, sight-seeing in historic Galveston, a Dallas trip to see the popular Southfork film site of TV soap "Dallas." She will have an opportunity to visit with students at S.F. Austin University in Nacogdoches; try out water skiing and lots of shopping.

The petite, brown-eyed Veronique exclaimed "everything is bigger than France!" when asked of her first impression of Texas. As a language student, fluent in four languages, she wanted to be an exchange student because the opportunity would be "very good experience for language." During her first week here, she has found the water and foods taste very different from home. Her favorite foods include Italian and French.

The slim and agile Veronique states young people do not drink colas like here. We drink mostly water, lemonade and juices. She adds that the medical profession teaches people that "between meal eating is not healthy."

French families eat their main meal at noon and business and schools close for two hours. At the Deroche Home, one of her favorite dinners includes French fish prepared with vegetables, herbs, sauces and a sauce and broiled with butter on a plate with potatoes and carrots. Veronique has completed her last year in Secondary School and will take a two-year professional school in Commerce, a large city nearby.

served. "Yogart with a little sugar" completes her meal, she adds.

During the summer it is very hot and many, including the Deroche family, vacation at one of the beaches on the Bay of Biscay which is one hour from her town around 17,000 population. Veronique also works in her parents' large store besides relaxing and having fun with her friends during the summer.

Home life is much simpler with the three older brothers and sister married and in homes of their own. One of the major events in teen-life affected has been dating. She was allowed to begin group dating without a chaperone at the age of 15. On Friday and Saturday evenings, the young people meet and visit at favorite areas such as much like Woodville: teens meet in cars at a convenient parking lot. There are many discos and cinemas to provide entertainment.

Education in France is a very serious business to which their low illiteracy rate attests. By the age of three, to four, formal schooling begins with a strong emphasis on languages. By the age of five to six, English teaching is begun and a third language added to their curriculum by age fifteen. Veronique has completed her last year in Secondary School and will take a two-year professional school in Commerce, a large city nearby.

A typical school day is described by Veronique: 7 a.m....up and dressed; 7:35 a.m....ride to school with her father; 8 a.m....classes begin for her and 20 other classmates - one hour of English followed by two hours of French and then one hour of math. She goes home with her parents for dinner and returns at 2 p.m. Afternoon classes include German, Spanish and geography until around 5 or 6 p.m. Then she walks with friends to town and visits while waiting for her ride home. Secondary students attend for morning classes only on Wednesday while primary students are off the whole day, but school is in session on Saturdays in France.

What do French teenagers wear? "Jeans, T-shirts and sneakers like here but they are some different," Veronique explains. She enjoys playing with her cats, listening to classical and light rock music, swimming and bodybuilding sports.

Veronique likes to be around people and enjoys languages; at the moment to one day to be able to apply her abilities and skills as an entrepreneur or working in an international business area.

Future clinics will be held on the first and third Tuesday of each month.

The Health Department emphasizes that this clinic is available to all preschool and school age children, beginning at two months of age. Immunizations to be offered include: Measles/Mumps/Rubella (MMR), Oral Polio (OPV), tetanus/Tetanus/Peritussis (DTP) and Tetanus/diphtheria (Td). The Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib) vaccine is also available to medically eligible children between the ages of 18 months and 60 months. All children must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. Parents are reminded to bring the child's immunization record and Social Security number if it is available.

The Tetanus/diphtheria (Td) vaccine is available to medically eligible adults. Should the parent or legal guardian have any questions, please feel free to contact the above listed field office.
