

Bryant Campaigns Here For AG

Texas Attorney general candidate John Bryant, D., from Dallas, stopped by The Booster last week while launching his campaign in Tyler County.

Bryant considers himself a "populist" Democrat who is "unapologetic" in his advocacy for lower insurance and utility company rates.

Calling himself a Progressive who's interested in giving the local law enforcement community and specifically its dis-

trict attorney's more power to fight drugs. Bryant wants to shift the burden to counties to police up their own communities.

Bryant, a fourth term member of Congress from Dallas County's Fifth District, is a member of the powerful House Committees on Energy and Commerce, Judiciary and Budget. Bryant has enacted major legislation in each of his terms.

Bryant authored the "Texas Wilderness Act,"

realizing in his first term the decades-old dream to preserve forever 36,000 acres in four National Forests of East Texas. He authored the 1987 repeal of the "Fuel Use Act," the first successful national effort to ease the crisis in the oil and gas industry.

He also enacted the "Truth in Mileage Act" to end odometer fraud, and authored a package of Pentagon contracting reforms that could help stop waste, fraud, and abuse, potentially saving taxpayers \$10 billion a year.

Bryant initiated the "Foreign Ownership Disclosure Act," which requires the disclosure of major foreign ownership

Peach, Pine Are Targets Of Insects

Overton—Insects are actively attacking both peach and pine trees in East Texas, according to an entomologist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

"The peach tree borer can be very damaging to the peach trees as it feeds on the cambium layer," said Dr. James Robinson, extension entomologist at the Texas Agricultural Research and Extension Center.

"Nantucket pine tip months are very common on pines grown for ornamentals or Christmas trees," Robinson said. "In the larval stage, the insect bores into the terminals causing the terminal to wilt and turn brown for about one to two inches. The damage can severely affect the growth and the shape of the tree."

Under severe infestations, controls for pine tip moth should be applied at weekly intervals for three applications, Robinson said.

Insecticides approved for controlling the peach tree borer include Orthene, Cygon and Durban.

New Law Eases Refueling For Disabled Drivers

Beginning September 1, service stations that offer full-service refueling must pump gasoline and diesel for disabled drivers upon request at the self-service price. Stations that have only self-service pumps are not affected by the law.

To receive refueling service at the self-service price, a driver must display a disabled persons insignia, validation sticker, identification card, or license plates issued by the highway department.

The new law allows Class C. misdemeanor charges to be filed against a station manager who does not establish a policy for refueling requests for the disabled driver. Similar charges can be filed against an individual employee who is acting against station policy and refuses to provide this service when requested.

The law will be enforced by the attorney general or a local prosecuting attorney.
