Board Nullifies Charges

 The Warren Independent School District voted 5-2 Tuesday, September 26, 1989, not to turn charges of misuse of federal funds and changing a student's records over to the District Attorney for a full investigation. This was the second attempt made by Board President Ronnie Stephens to look into the charge that Superintendent Bettie Rae Yates used federal funds illegally regarding a student in the Work Study Program at the High School and then instructed High School Counselor Mike Paddy to cover up the illegal use of funds by falsifying the student's school records. The first attempt to consider this matter was Tuesday, September 19, 1989, at a Special Meeting called by Stephens. Board members Harold Davis, Kenneth Gregory, Roy Moore and Ben Read did not attend that meeting making it impossible for the three attending Board members to meet since a quorum for the Warren Board. At the Board Meeting Tuesday, September 26, Stephens made the motion for a full investigation with Board Member Julia Greenwood seconding the motion. Voting against the motion were Board members Harold Davis, Kenneth Gregory, Paul Hicks, Roy Moore and Ben Read.

Texas Army Here Oct. 14-15

The Texas Army is gearing up for a 2-day encampment at Heritage Village in Woodville October 14-15 as part of the Village's Annual Harvest Festival.

With all proceeds going toward restoration of the unique collection of pioneer structures that make up the Village, the Festival will feature over 30 artisans, demonstrating old-time crafts as diversified as weaving, candle-making, wood working, horse hair braiding, primitive painting and corn husk-doll making.

Craftspeople from throughout East Texas and as far way as El Campo will converge on the Village early Saturday morning to set up their show-and-tell demonstrations of how early settlers worked and lived during the period from 1860 to 1900. Some

of East Texas' favorite folklorists will also be on hand to spin their tales of the olden days.

There will be chuck wagon cooking to sample, potatoes baked in an open fire, cookies baked over an open fire, and many other tempting taste treats, plus a variety of homemade cakes, pies, breads, jellies, and jams to take home. And, of course, the famed Pickett House will be serving up their sumptuous boarding house fare from 11 a.m. both days.

Old-time music will also be the order of the day with festival-goers entertained by Sacred Harp Singers from Huntsville, the famed Woodville High School Choir, the fiddling of Eldridge Creech, Johnny Swafford's talented family of musicians and roving troubadour Bart Brandenburg.

In addition to all this activity, the Blacksmith

Shop will be in full swing as the East Texas Blacksmiths Alliance meets for its Fall Workshop during the two day Festival.

Overseeing all the festivities of the two days will be a hot air balloon, bringing the Festival and the historic period; it covers full circle, as balloons such as this were first used during the Civil War for battle field reconnaissance.

Admission to Heritage Village Museum, which is located on Hwy. 190, one mile west of Woodville, will be \$3.00 for Adults, \$1.50 for children under 12. The two days of the Festival, free parking facilities are being set up at the Tyler County Airport, a mile West of the Village. Free bus service will be provided to shuttle Festival goers to and from the Village.

HOUSTON—About 700 county officials from across Texas are expected for the annual conference of the County Judges and Commissioners' Association of Texas at Houston's Astro Village Hotel, Oct. 15 through 17.

Among conference highlights are expected to be presentations on redistricting, criminal justice reform, disaster management for counties, county and special district laws and addresses by several high-ranking state officials.

Coryell County Judge Douglas H. Smith of Gatesville, the association president, will open the meeting.

Among key speakers will be State Treasurer Ann Richards, who will speak at 11:30 a.m. Oct. 16, and Attorney General Jim Mattox, scheduled to address the group at 9:50 a.m. Oct. 17.

John Gilmarin, county officials program specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, said county judge conference enrollees also can earn four hours of continuing judicial education credit.

The educational course work is being coordinated by the V. G. Young Institute of County Government, a part of the Extension Service.
