Senator Bill Haley At Rotary Nov. 8

State Senator Bill Haley will be the guest of the Woodville Rotary Club Wed., November 8, 1989. Haley is a 47-year old native of Shelby County. He graduated from Center High School, then entered Texas Christian University in Fort Worth, where he earned his degree in History and Government. He taught school twelve and a half years before being elected to the Texas House of Representatives in Feb. 1978, to represent House District 10, including Na-

cogdoches, Panola and Shelby Counties. During his tenure in the House, Senator Haley was instrumental in the enactment of the most sweeping reforms in the Texas education system since the 1940 Gilmer-Akin bill. His legislative initiatives included the curriculum reform of 1981 and the comprehensive education changes mandated by House Bill 72 passed in 1984. Haley chaired the House Committee on Public Education in the 68th, 69th and 70th

Legislatures and also served on the House Committees on State Affairs and Financial Institutions. He has been honored by the Vocational Agricultural Teachers Association and the Champion of Education Award given by the Texas Elementary Principals and Supervisors Association. Bill and his wife Mary, who is Manager of the Shelby County Chamber of Commerce, are active in civic affairs and many community development projects. The couple have two children, Jeff and Robert.

Jerry... The Storm of 1989

Letter to The Editor
Hurricane Jerry-We Will Remember It As The Storm of '89'

At first glance—not too devastating. Or at least that's the impression the media presented. But by Tuesday we knew differently, and our disaster plan was put into effect. The winds that had spawned from Hurricane Jerry cut a path of destruction through the deeply wooded portion of our service area. East of Highway 59 and West of Woodville, twisting and breaking trees, utility poles and power lines.

Mr. Mack McGlothlin of the National Weather Service in Ft. Worth responded to our emergency inquiry about Hurricane Jerry. He crossed the coastline of South Galveston Island Sunday evening and turned North with the eye, proceeding through Liberty, East San Jacinto, West Hardin, East Polk, and West Tyler Counties, before turning slightly East and exiting SHECO's service area in South Angelina County.

At the beginning of 75% of our members were without electricity or approximately 40,000 members. Twelve (12) of our substations were initially affected by the loss of GSU's transmission lines, which had also received

damage from the storm.

Before it was all over and power had been restored, everyone except scattered unreported services by Saturday evening, had to leave. Once the reports are in, our crews and contractors will be performing the repair work for the next few months, until we are sure the system is safe and sound. Some of these repairs may result in short outages in short areas, but we will keep them to a minimum in order to spare our Members' anymore inconvenience.

All told, the expense to repair the damage is expected to exceed one million dollars (\$1,000,000). Not to mention the enormous cost of the outside crews that provided assistance and the additional equipment rental.

We have communicated with the many offices regarding damage relief, but it is unlikely that much relief will be available. The end result is that the cost associated with the storm will be the responsibility of the Cooperative and its Members.

The Board of Directors and Management of Sam Houston Electric Cooperative, Inc. wish to express our sincere appreciation to our Members for their participation in the

effort to restore your Cooperative to restoring your power as soon as physically possible.

After each major outage, such as Hurricane Jerry, we stop and evaluate our procedures, getting input at every level, from the men in the field to the men answering the telephone. This enables us to improve our performance and be better prepared for the next storm or disaster, because SHECO'S FIRST PRIORITY IS TO PROVIDE OUR MEMBERS WITH RELIABLE SERVICE.
