'Need Gram Support'

Dear Editor,

For the second time, the fate of Big Sandy/Village Creek is pending in the U.S. Senate, and the outcome this time depends on Senator Phil Gramm. We have less than one month to convince Gramm that Texas wants this scenic and ecologically important stream added to the Big Thicket National Preserve.

Back in 1973-74, conservationists fought hard to save the stream, but it was left out in an unfortunate political compromise. That was a costly mistake, which we now have the opportunity to correct.

In the last 15 years, the stream has suffered damages from clearcutting and development, but it can recover. Now as then, the stream would link existing isolated units, providing a continuous habitat for animal and plant migration and protecting water sources.

OWNERS: THE OPTION TO SELL, OR NOT TO SELL. Still, unsatisfied, opponents complain about the provision which allows the Secretary of Interior to acquire properties later if used in a manner "detrimental" to the Preserve. This wording appears in most parks legislation -- not just Big Thicket -- and is intended to protect the Preserve from adverse uses, such as garbage dumps, sewage disposal, or timber harvest.

Opponents have been creative in spreading misinformation but good solid facts exist. For example: **TAX LOSSES?** Government programs pay delinquent taxes on property acquired -- and reimburse taxes fully for five years; then payments per acre continue at a lesser rate in mal and plant migration and protecting water sources.

For 38 years I committed to work behind an endless parade of log trucks, and I watched lovely woodlands turn into pine farms. Whatever we manage to save in the Big Thicket National Preserve will be a meager remnant of our once magnificent heritage.

PLEASE join the effort NOW to show Senator Gramm that Texans want him to save Big Sandy/Village Creek and the Canyonlands for future generations.
