

"Tell me a fish story", is how Luther Lowery, Sports Editor for THE TYLER COUNTY BOOSTER would start off each day.

 Then THE BOOSTER staff would cock their heads and prick their ears to try and listen if they could hear a bit of a preview of what Lowery would write about in his famous column "Hunting, Fishing and Lying", for the coming week.

Luther Lowery retires this week as Sports Editor of THE TYLER COUNTY BOOSTER after eight years of service to the Tyler County Community.

OUESTION: "How are you going to replace him?

ANSWER: "There isn't a way to replace Luther Lowery"

Luther didn't know if he could do what we asked him to do when he started on Nov. 19,

What do you do with ex-school principals We got the affirmation soon when we would find him up at school surrounded by kids, big ones and little ones. He loved them all and they loved him.

You might say Lowery is graduating with some of the students he "left behind" when he retired at Woodville Elementary School as principal after 30 years of teaching, coaching and school administrative work.

Lowery's gift for this job is his affection for the youth of Tyler County. His first thought was always "What's best for the kid?" The staff of THE BOOSTER can testify to his ability with children because of the caring, concern and advice he'd offer when we had questions about our own kids. Yes..he helped raise some of our children.-His-happiest-times-around-the-officewas when his own youngsters would visit along with his grandchildren. He liked to show them off and let them sit on his knee and fidgit around his office.

As a Scholastic News and Sports Reporter and Editor, Lowery would earn his way around the school campuses by handing out left over or unused photos of teachers and students that he knew they would enjoy having. He always has his camera in hand...always on the lookout for something that would make the kids look good.

Most of Lowery's readers would agree that he is a Conversational Journalist. That is, it feels like when you are reading his work, that you are right in the same room with him and he is telling you his story. The thing that made it so appealing was the smile that came through in favor of the kids he was reporting about.

Luther never took himself too seriously and that's what made his writing so enjoyable.

The all around sportsman had interests in football, baseball, basketball, fishing and hunting not to mention many other sporting interests. You just don't find writers who have an inherent interest in that many sport venues.

Some of ther best times for the staff were late on deadline day, Tuesdays, when Luther would spark some of his humor as he was nearing the completion of his Sports page. He would start to pick on the typesetter to "Hurry up...I haven't got all day you know". Then he'd go whistling out the door doning his hat, having completed another edition and asking as he hit the door," What's

taking ya'll so long?"


