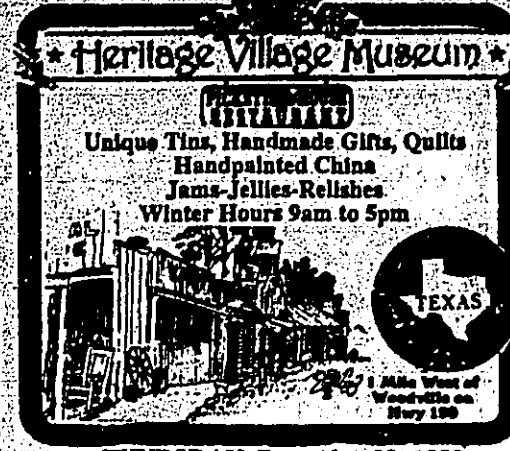

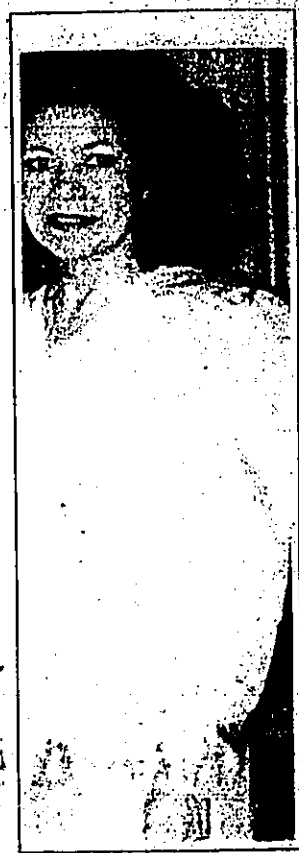

## Georganne Faulkner Is "Best"

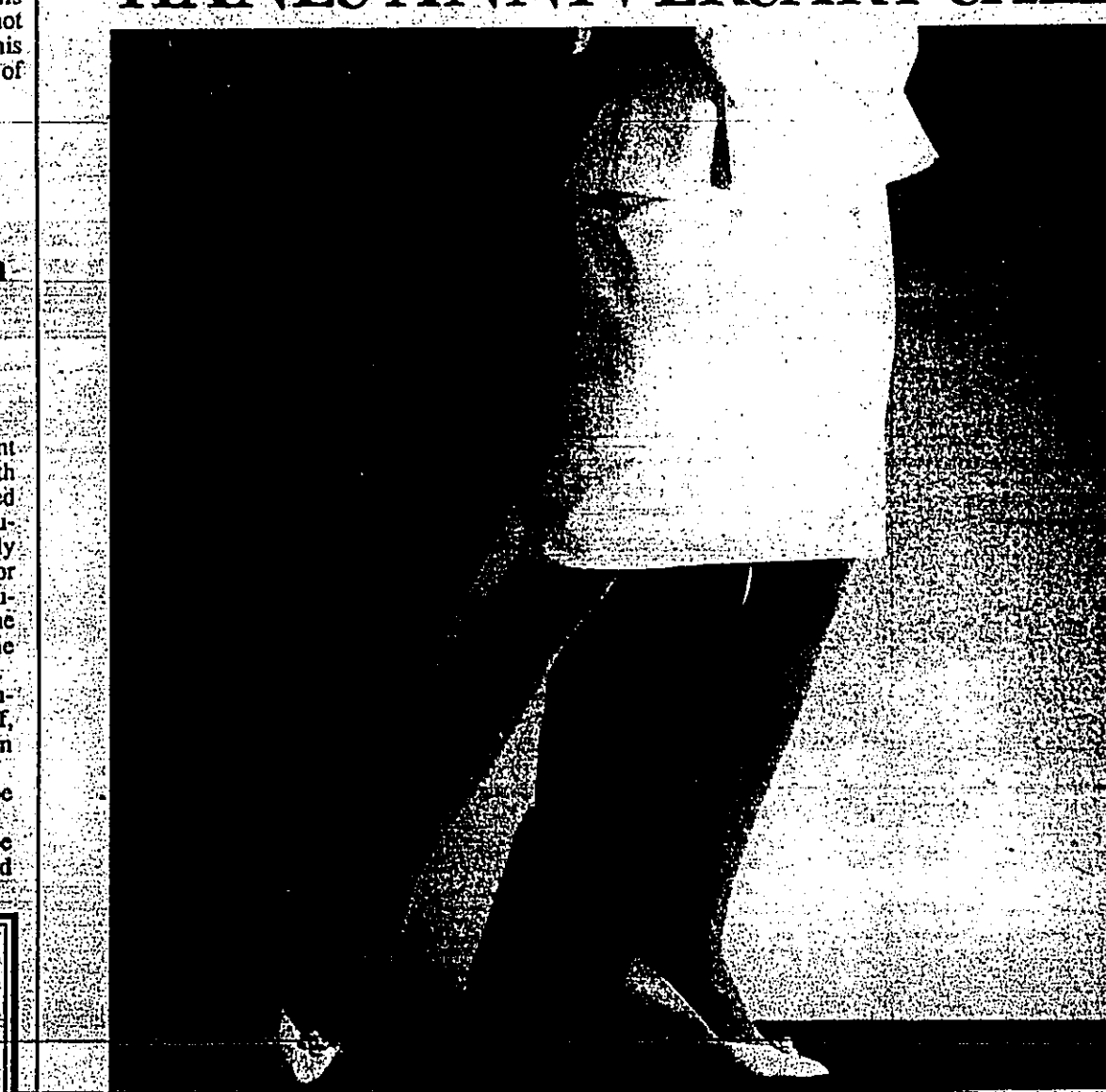
