Mattox Names Hanks And Jordan

Democratic gubernatorial candidate Jim Mattox Tuesday announced that Rev. N.V. Hanks of Woodville and Henry Jordan of Spurger will serve as the Tyler County coordinators for his 1990 primary campaign.

"We support Jim Mattox because he is the only candidate in the race who is unequivocally opposed to new taxes and in favor of a lottery," Hanks and Jordan said. "Mattox has pledged to veto a state income tax."

"Mattox' record as a prosecutor, State Representative, U.S. Congressman and Attorney General proves that he can follow through on his promises," Hanks and Jordan added. "He can fight a real war on drugs and crime, and he can revive our failing education system."

Pat Hardy Issues Candidate Statement

The following is a statement of candidacy:

"I, Pat Hardy, have served Tyler County, Texas as a prosecutor since March of 1982. I am married to Jan Ann Certa Hardy and have three children: Cathy, Kristin and Doug. I am a veteran of The Vietnam War and was honorably discharged from The United States Marine Corp as a Sgt. E-5. I have been a peace officer for sixteen (16) years and a prosecutor for almost eight (8) years. I have been Assistant District Attorney, County Attorney with felony responsibility, and Criminal District Attorney. As Assistant District Attorney I was given full authority in January of 1983 to handle all felony cases by then District Attorney, Bo Horka. In February, 1984, I became County Attorney with felony responsibility, and became Criminal District Attorney on January 1, 1985. I have been elected twice as your Criminal District Attorney. At the time I took over full time in 1983, between the years 1967-1982 on only one occasion had more than ten criminals been sent to the penitentiary in a year. The year was 1981 and thirteen persons were sent from our County. There were two years, 1973 and 1980, when only one criminal was sent to the penitentiary in a full twelve months. From 1976 through 1982 only 96 criminals were sent to the State Penitentiary. I feel these figures show that prosecution was not aggressive during that time. From the time I was given full authority in 1983 until today, the least number of criminals sent to the penitentiary was 21 in 1984 and we have sent 48 this year, 1989, which is the most. In 7 years my office has sent more than twice as many criminals to the penitentiary as my predecessors did in 16 years. A good example of this was in 1982 when only 3 criminals went to the Texas Department of Corrections while in 1983 32 criminals went to the Texas Department of Corrections.

City Council Authorizes Payments; Lauds Manager For Holiday Work

On a motion by Councilman Billie Rose, City Manager Walt Davis got an unexpected late Christmas gift at the regular meeting of that body Monday night when Rose cited Davis for his "personal service during a crisis" involving the recent freezing weather Southeast Texas has been experiencing. Davis received an extra weeks pay as a bonus for his Christmas Day efforts in solving frozen pipe problems around the city, councilmen agreed. "He's been doing it for 27 years" said Councilman Gordon Anderson. "He works additional hours all year long."

In other business the council agreed to write a protest letter regarding a pending Cencom Cable Television rate increase. According to Mayor Tom Knapp, "We need to write them and let them know that service has not yet been provided to the entire city."

The Council agreed to pay a bill of \$1,600 to the Tyler County Chamber of Commerce as an advance payment for a Video prepared about Tyler County and Woodville for the Chamber of Commerce. Council also authorized payment of \$2,500 to the Alan Shivers Library and will authorize payment of some \$600 in office expenses to the Chamber once a budget is received by the City from the Chamber.

Estimate No. 5 totaling \$7,416 was authorized as payment to the Phoenix-Fabricators and Erectors who are constructing the water well at the prison. Payment was approved for Estimate No. 1, \$118,398, for the Blackshear & Son, Inc. Company and the Estimate No. 1 Payment was also authorized for \$49,145 for the Layne Western Company.

Council also agreed to notify the bonding company regarding Underground Utilities Company apparent failure to perform on contract specifications. City Manager Davis informed the council on an upcoming 7 cent gas rate increase to the city which will have to be "passed through" to city customers.

Gerald C. Mann

Gerald C. Mann, a former Texas attorney general and secretary of state and a Southern Methodist University football star of the late 1920s died Saturday after a battle with cancer. He was 82. He is a distant relative of the Woodville Mann families. He worked in Dallas until his death as a Dallas County assistant district attorney. During his first term as state attorney general, at age 32 in Depression era Texas, Mann became the avatar of honest public service, records of time ago. As secretary of state in 1934, he followed the legislature in passing antic-trust laws aimed at curbing fraudulent stock brokerages in the state. "I'm a little bit numb," Gerald Mann Jr. said Saturday. "There are so many stories about him; they are legion." As attorney general in 1937, Mann was known for his attacks on loan sharking - practiced by some established banks during the Depression - and investigations of racketeering. Fifty years later, co-workers in the Dallas County district attorney's office called him "energetic" and "amazing." He was, indeed, a public servant. Said Bill Gevey, a fellow assistant district attorney, "He worked 10-hour days, 12-hour days; when most men would have ended their careers, when most men would be clipping coupons, some where. He had retired once and decided he couldn't handle it." Mann was not used to media. As a running back at SMU in 1926, he earned the sobriquet "The Little Red Arrow." He was made a Harvard Law School graduate, a former president of the Dallas Council of World Affairs and Goodwill Industries, a member of the board of trustees of the Dallas Museum of Art and a former SMU trustee. Family members said he didn't show one face in public and another in private. "There wasn't really two or three people in Dad," Mann said. "What you saw was what you got." Gerald Mann was born in Sulphur Springs on January 13, 1907. He attended Highland Park High School. He was a quarterback and running back for the first team to play at SMU's Cowley Stadium and was named a top player nationally from 1925 to 1927. He was inducted into the national Football Hall of Fame in 1969 and the Texas Sports Hall of Fame in 1967. Family members said. He planted the grass on his stadium playing field as part of his scholarship chores, according to sports articles of the time. Ten years later, he would become sports commentator for WFAA-AM radio, announcing his alma mater's games. He was accepted at Harvard Law School upon his graduation from SMU in 1928 and returned after earning a law degree to enter Texas politics as an appointee to the post of assistant attorney general in 1933. A string of political posts followed. He managed the gubernatorial campaign in Dallas for James V. Allred in 1934, represented the state in Washington, D.C., on the public works-oriented Texas Planning Board, and was chief legal counsel for the Trinity Watershed Soil Conservation and Flood Control Association. While secretary of state, he persuaded state legislators to pass securities control laws, and those credentials helped him win election as attorney general in 1938, according to newspaper clippings. A political columnist wrote after his election, "He was going to be able to say with truth that he voted for a football man and elected a lawyer." Mann is survived by his wife, Anna Mary Mann; sons Gerald Jr. and Robert Mann; and daughter, Lela Mann Easton all of Dallas. Funeral services were held at 11 a.m. Friday, January 5, 1990 at Tom Havert Cemetery near Zavalla under the direction of Riley Funeral Home in Woodville with Rev. Jackson Colwell officiating. Vegetable Seminar

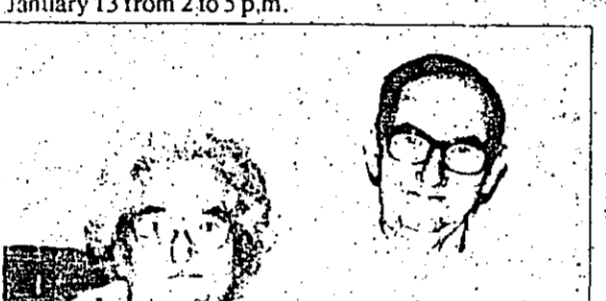

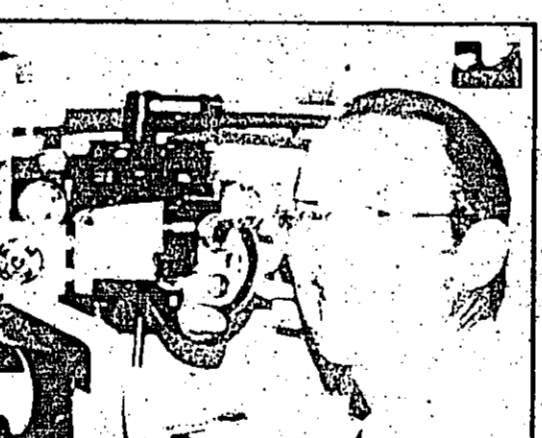

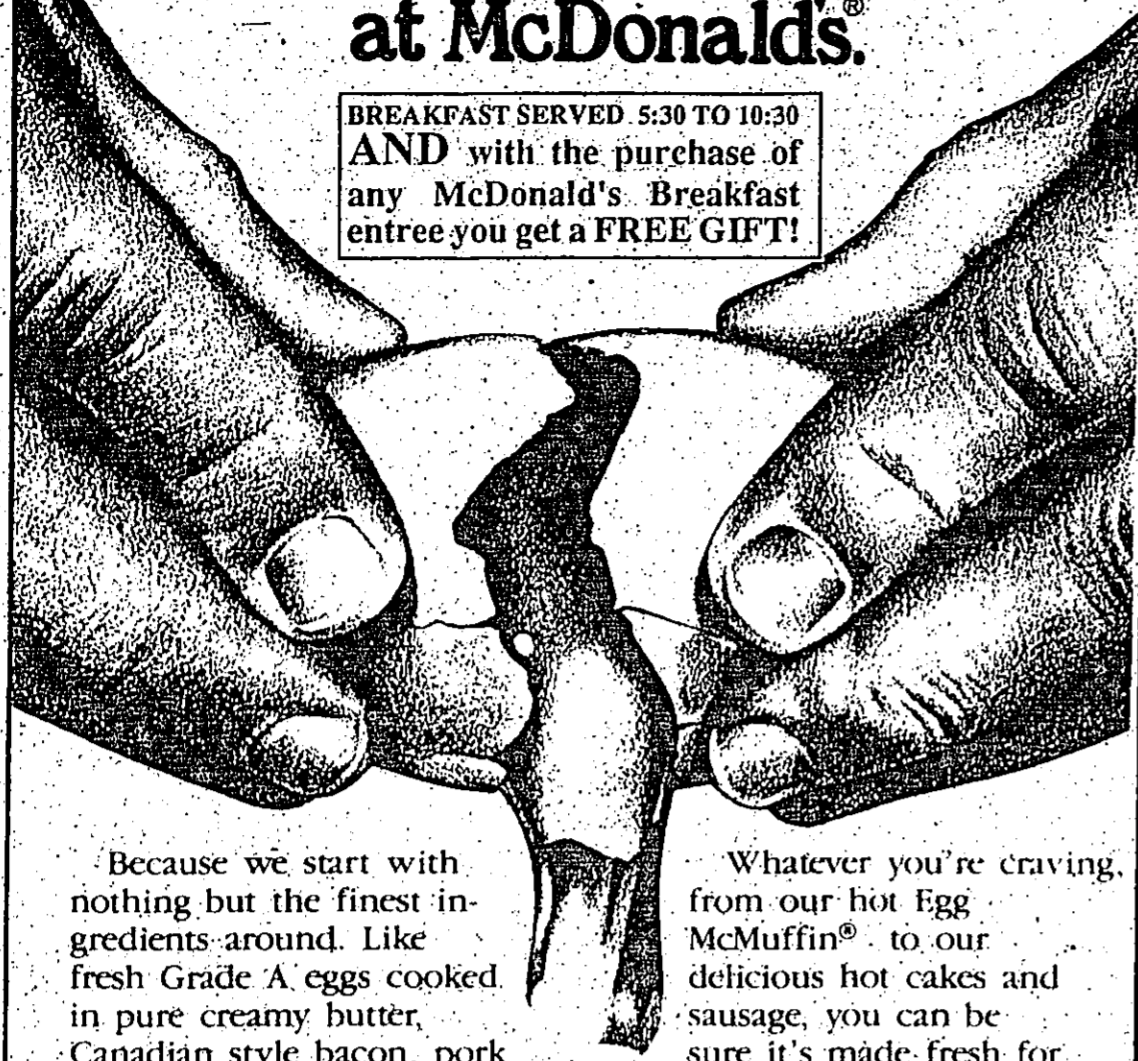
